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1 **SUMMARY OF EVENT**

2

3 On 10-06-2011 V01-De Santiago was driving a marked Sheriff's Office

4 patrol vehicle (06760) and dressed in full uniform. V02-Hilt and

5 V03-Crist were driving an unmarked Sheriff's Office detective vehicle

6 (02034) and dressed in full uniform. At approximately 0735 hours,

7 V01-De Santiago, V02-Hilt, and V03-Crist were driving on Lorne Way

8 when they located S01-Shareef, triple homicide suspect (11-278-0043w)

9 crouched down in front of a vehicle in the driveway of Lorne Way.

10 V01-De Santiago, V02-Hilt and V03-Crist verbally addressed

11 S01-Shareef to come out from behind the vehicle and lay on the

12 ground. S01-Shareef was given numerous commands to comply.

13 S01-Shareef did not comply with verbal commands and brandished a

14 semi-automatic pistol. S01-Shareef pointed the pistol at V01-De

15 Santiago and said something similar to "Kill Me!". V01-De Santiago,

16 V02-Hilt, and V03-Crist fired their duty weapons because they feared

17 for their safety and the safety of the public. The victim's fired

18 numerous times striking S01-Shareef numerous times. S01-Shareef fell

19 to the ground where the victim's handcuffed him. V01-De Santiago,

20 V02-Hilt, and V03-Crist stood by with S01-Shareef in front of the

21 house until more deputies and Sunnyvale Officers arrived. V01-De

22 Santiago, V02-Hilt, and V03-Crist remained on scene until I replaced

23 them with responding deputies.

24

25 **INVESTIGATION**

26

27 On 10/6/2011 at approximately 0736 hours, I was notified by County

28 Communication of shots fired on a pedestrian stop. County

29 Communications originally provided responding units the location of

30 Lawrence Expressway @ Hwy 101 in the city of Sunnyvale. While in

1 route County Communications changed the location to one street East
2 of Lawrence Expwy. County Communications again changed the location
3 to Lorne @ Peacock in the city of Sunnyvale. I arrived on Lorne Ave.
4 and pulled up behind a Sunnyvale DPS (SVDPS) vehicle. I ran to
5 Lorne where I saw Deputies and SVDPS stacked on the front of the
6 garage and their guns drawn towards the front door of the house. I
7 was advised by SVDPS Lt. Sartwell that a call has been made into the
8 house to see if there was anyone in the house and if there were any
9 injuries. I was told there was a family with a small child in the
10 house and they were instructed to come out of the house with their
11 hands up. Standing in front the garage door I could see S01-Allman
12 lying on the ground in a pool of blood that was running down the
13 driveway. S01-Allman had a massive head wound and numerous wounds to
14 his body. He was handcuffed with a pair of handcuffs that were
15 painted red. The garage door also had numerous bullet holes. I also
16 noticed a brass colored shell casing next to S01-Allmans head.
17 S01-Allmans head was pointing towards the east and his feet to the
18 west.

19
20 I walked over to V01-De Santiago #2024 who was standing by his
21 vehicle. I asked him who did the shooting. He said he did. I asked
22 V01-De Santiago if he was injured. He said he was not. I began to
23 walk V01-De Santiago out of the scene and Sgt. Jacobs walked up and
24 advised me he would take care of him. I passed V01-De Santiago off
25 to Sgt. Jacobs.

26
27 Deputies were stacked in front of the garage door with their guns
28 drawn on the front of the house. V03-Crist #2113 and V02-Hilt #2098
29 were the point Deputies. I started asking Sunnyvale DPS officers if
30 they were involved in the shooting. At that time V02-Hilt advised me

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1 that he and V03-Crist were involved. I had Deputies Fleckner #1990
2 and Cazador #2043 replace V03- Crist and V02- Hilt in the stack. I
3 walked V03-Crist and V02-Hilt out of the scene. As we were walking I
4 asked V03-Crist and V02-Hilt if they were injured or needed medical
5 attention. They both told me they were not injured and there was no
6 need for medical attention. I assigned Sgt. T. Lera to stay with
7 V03-Crist and Deputy Tarazi #2029 to stay with V02-Hilt. Later,
8 Deputy Hickinbotham #2087 took over for Deputy Tarazi and remained
9 with V02-Hilt until he was released by SVDPS.

10

11 Once all the residents were out of Lorne I instructed all
12 Sheriff's Office personal to leave the inner perimeter and turned the
13 scene over to SVDPS. The shell casing I saw next to S01-Allmans body
14 did not match the ammunition that is issued to Sheriff's Office
15 personal. Because of that, I believed that S01-Allman might have
16 fired a weapon. I had deputies and officers start making contact
17 with the residents on the North side of the street to look for
18 potential victims and evidence.

19

20 SVDPS Capt. Swathmore instructed paramedics to enter the scene and
21 pronounce S01-Allman dead. As the paramedics walked out of the scene
22 I checked their boots and equipment for evidence that might have been
23 removed from the scene. As I was checking one of the paramedic's
24 boots, he told me they pronounced S01-Allman dead at 0803hours. I
25 remained on scene until approximately 1045 hours. I was called back
26 to the Scene at 1115 hours, and was asked by SVDPS Officer Ted Zitnay
27 #99810 to remove the video tape from V01-De Santiago's vehicle
28 (#06760). I removed the tape and handed it to Officer Zitnay.

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1 **INVESTIGATION:**

2

3 On 10-06-2011, I was working as a Detective Sergeant for the Santa
 4 Clara County Sheriff's Office assigned to Domestic Violence/Hate
 5 Crimes. I was assisting Sergeant Elder and Sergeant Quinonez with a
 6 homicide investigation (S/O 11-278-0043W) where the suspect (S01
 7 Shareef Allman) had been identified but was still at large. At
 8 approximately 0730 hours, Sergeant McAllister advised me of an
 9 officer involved shooting and said the suspect involved in the
 10 shooting matched the description of S01 Shareef Allman. At
 11 approximately 0740 hours, Sergeant McAllister and I responded to
 12 Lorne Way, Sunnyvale, the location where the shooting took place.
 13 While en-route we learned that suspect in the officer involved
 14 shooting was pronounced dead at the scene. At approximately 0748
 15 hours I called the Coroner's Office and briefed them of the
 16 situation. At approximately 0800 hours I called the Santa Clara
 17 County District Attorney's Office. I spoke with Deputy District
 18 Attorney _____ d and provided her with an update.

19

20 Sergeant McAllister and I arrived on Lorne Way at approximately 0805
 21 hours. The area had been cordoned off with yellow crime scene tape.
 22 We checked in with a deputy and entered the crime scene en-route to
 23 Lorne Way. Sergeant McAllister and I met with a Lieutenant from
 24 Sunnyvale DPS who directed us to Detective Choi who was the lead
 25 investigator in this case.

26

27 Sergeant McAllister and I met with Detective Choi who walked us
 28 through the crime scene.

29

30 **CRIME SCENE DESCRIPTION:**

LOCATION OF ORIGINAL EVENT (IF KNOWN) Lorne Way @ Peacock Avenue / Sunnyvale / 94087	VICTIM NAME (LAST, FIRST, MIDDLE (FIRM, IF BUSINESS))

2 Lorne Way is a residential street which runs east and west. The

3 shooting occurred to the front of Lorne Way which is located on

4 the south side of the street, just east of Kintyre Way. There where

5 two vehicles parked in the driveway of Lorne Way, and a body

6 covered by a yellow emergency blanket lying between the vehicles and

7 in front of the closed garage door. There was an exposed arm with a

8 set of handcuffs attached to the wrist not covered by the yellow

9 blanket. I saw blood running down the driveway from underneath the

10 blanket. The head and torso were covered by the blanket so I was

11 unable to visually positively identify the person under the blanket

12 as S01 Shareef Allman.

13

14 I saw an unmarked Sheriff's Office vehicle parked approximately two

15 houses east of Lorne Way and a marked Sheriff's Office patrol car

16 parked in front of Lorne Way. I noticed several spent casings

17 near both Sheriff's Office vehicles and in front of Lorne Way.

18

19 I also noticed a black handgun on the ground near the driveway of

20 Lorne Way.

21 INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:

22

23 At approximately 0920 hours, Sergeant McAllister and I exited the

24 crime scene and responded to Sunnyvale DPS. I was told the officers

25 involved were already at Sunnyvale and were meeting with their

26 attorneys.

27

28 Sergeant McAllister and I arrived at Sunnyvale DPS at approximately

29 0945 hours and learned was

30 meeting with each officer individually. Lieutenant Wise and Sergeant

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1 Oberst from S/O Internal Affairs and S/O Sergeant Valenzuela
 2 currently assigned to County Counsel were also present to observe the
 3 interviews.

4
 5 While we were waiting for the interviews to begin, Sergeant McAllister
 6 and I met with Detective Choi, Detective Ramirez and Lieutenant
 7 Anderson inside Lieutenant Anderson's office. We learned the
 8 following;

9
 10 BRIEFING AT SUNNYVALE DPS:

11
 12 The neighborhood canvass did not produce any witnesses that actually
 13 saw the incident. The witnesses that were located only heard the
 14 event.

15
 16 There were a total of 44 rounds fired by the involved deputies. The
 17 rounds fired were broken down as 15 from Deputy De Santiago, 16 from
 18 Deputy Crist and 13 from Deputy Hilt.

19
 20 The casing found near the suspect was brass and believed to be from
 21 the suspect's gun.

22
 23 Prior to the shooting, deputies were sent to clear the residence at
 24 Lorne Way. The resident at Lorne had stopped by the command
 25 post and advised that he may have left his door unlocked and
 26 requested deputies clear his home to ensure S01 Allman wasn't hiding
 27 inside.

28
 29 Deputies De Santiago, Hilt and Crist were sent to clear Lorne Way.
 30 The deputies cleared Lorne Way and were leaving the area when the

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1 confrontation with S01 Allman occurred.

2

3 INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:

4

5 At approximately 1214 hours, I contacted County Communications and
 6 requested certified copies of the 911 calls and law enforcement
 7 dispatch tapes regarding this event. I later received the copies and
 8 turned them over to Sergeant McAllister.

9

10 I learned the involved officers attorney, _____ had decided the
 11 officers needed to rest before being interviewed by Sunnyvale DPS. I
 12 was advised the interviews were to begin at approximately 1530
 13 hours.

14

15 Sergeant McAllister and I left Sunnyvale DPS and returned at
 16 approximately 1515 hours. The first interview was of V01 De Santiago.
 17 The interview was video recorded by Sunnyvale DPS. I watched the
 18 interview on a video monitor from a separate room. Also present in
 19 the room with me were, Sgt. McAllister, Lieutenant Wise, Sergeant
 20 Oberst, and Sgt. Valenzuela. For details regarding V01 De Santiago's
 21 interview please refer to the supplemental report completed by
 22 Sergeant McAllister.

23

24 The second interview was of V02 Hilt. V02 Hilt's interview began at
 25 approximately 1717 hours. This interview was also video recorded by
 26 Sunnyvale DPS. I watched this interview from a monitor in a separate
 27 room. Lieutenant Wise, Sgt McAllister, Sgt. Oberst, and Sgt.
 28 Valenzuela were also present during the viewing. The following is a
 29 synopsis of V02 Hilt's interview.

30

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1 **STATEMENT OF V02 CHRISTOPHER HILT:**

2

3 V02 Hilt has been employed with the Santa Clara County Sheriff's
 4 Office for approximately two years and is currently assigned to Court
 5 Services. V02 Hilt was also a reserve for the U.S. Coast Guard for
 6 approximately 4 years. His commitment to the Coast Guard is one
 7 weekend a month and two weeks a year.

8

9 V02 Hilt's prior military training included basic training, and ten
 10 weeks weapons training. His military weapons training included the
 11 military issued Berretta and Sig Saur handguns and the M16 rifle.

12

13 V02 Hilt's law enforcement training included completing the Santa
 14 Clara County Sheriff's Office academy, Court Training, three month
 15 Field Training Program, Defensive Tactics, and range
 16 qualifications.

17

18 On 10-05-2011, at approximately 0800 hours, V02 Hilt began his
 19 assigned shift at the Sunnyvale Courthouse. During his shift, V02
 20 Hilt learned of a special overtime detail for the Cupertino shooting.
 21 V02 Hilt completed his regular shift at 1700 hours. V02 Hilt said he
 22 took an hour and a half nap before reporting to his overtime shift at
 23 2200 hours.

24

25 V02 Hilt heard that a suspect entered the quarry in Cupertino and
 26 fired on several people, killing three and injuring several others.
 27 The shooting suspect's description came out and V02 Hilt tried to
 28 listen to the updates while he was working. V02 Hilt learned the
 29 suspect was armed and dangerous and possibly still in the area of
 30 Sunnyvale/Cupertino. While listening to the updates, V02 Hilt heard

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1 about the second shooting in the area of Homestead @ Tantau at HP.

2

3 V02 Hilt said he learned over the radio and from the be on the lookout

4 sheet (B.O.L), that the shooting suspect was possibly armed with a

5 .40 caliber handgun. V02 Hilt heard that the suspect's vehicle was

6 recovered and two long guns were located inside.

7

8 On 10-05-2011, at approximately 2200 hours, V02 Hilt reported to the

9 Monte Vista Fire Station to begin his special overtime shift. V02

10 Hilt was wearing a full Santa Clara County S/O uniform consisting of

11 green trousers, a tan shirt with Sheriff's Office patches on each

12 sleeve, a utility belt holding two handgun magazines, pepper spray,

13 baton, handcuffs, and his department issued Glock 22 .40 caliber

14 handgun. V02 Hilt's handgun was loaded with a full 15 round magazine

15 and an additional round in the chamber.

16

17 V02 Hilt was assigned to work a two man unmarked unit along with V03

18 Crist. Both V02 Hilt and V03 Crist were wearing full S/O uniforms.

19 V02 Hilt said he was assigned to conduct roving patrols in the area

20 of Homestead and Tantau in Cupertino.

21

22 V02 Hilt said he did not encounter anything unusual throughout the

23 night. V02 Hilt said in the morning (10-06-2011) he and V03 Crist

24 were called back to the HP site to meet with Sgt. Dutra. When he

25 arrived he noticed a white male adult in a silver vehicle. V02 Hilt

26 learned the person in the silver vehicle was a resident that was

27 previously evacuated. The resident was unsure if he locked his door

28 when he evacuated and asked for his residence to be cleared. Sgt.

29 Dutra assigned V01 De Santiago, V02 Hilt, and V03 Crist to clear the

30 home.

2 V02 Hilt, V03 Crist and V01 De Santiago proceeded to the address on

3 Lorne Way (Lorne Way). While driving on Lorne Way, V02 Hilt

4 noticed someone on the left side of the street. V02 Hilt said he saw

5 some slight movement and due to the time of day he thought it was

6 possibly a resident leaving for work.

7

8 V02 Hilt said they checked the perimeter of the residence on Lorne Way

9 and all the doors were secure. They then cleared the interior of the

10 home and did not locate anyone inside. After clearing the home, he

11 and V03 Crist entered their unmarked vehicle and parked along side of

12 V01 De Santiago who was sitting in his marked patrol car.

13

14 V02 Hilt said he and V01 De Santiago talked briefly and V02 Hilt saw

15 V01 De Santiago looking in his rearview mirror. V02 Hilt felt there

16 was something suspicious going on behind them based on the way V01 De

17 Santiago was looking. V02 Hilt checked his rearview mirror but did

18 not see anything suspicious. V02 Hilt said he did a three point turn

19 and Deputy De Santiago drove to the end of the cul-de-sac to make a

20 u-turn. V02 Hilt said they started to drive slowly, (later estimated

21 approximately 5mph) down Lorne Way looking in the general area he

22 thought V01 De Santiago was looking but he didn't see anything.

23

24 V02 Hilt said he drove past the residence where the shooting took

25 place (Lorne Way) and looked in his rearview mirror. V02 Hilt saw

26 V01 De Santiago had stopped his car, got out, and was speaking with a

27 Black male adult. V02 Hilt said he knew something was going on by the

28 way V01 De Santiago contacted the subject. V02 Hilt said he

29 immediately exited his vehicle and saw V01 De Santiago draw his duty

30 firearm and point it at the suspect. V02 Hilt said he also drew his

3 V02 Hilt said when he first exited his patrol vehicle he saw V01 De

4 Santiago with one hand on his duty firearm and pointing at the

5 suspect with his other hand saying something similar to, ¿Drop the

6 gun!¿ V02 Hilt said V01 De Santiago then drew his duty weapon and

7 pointed it at the suspect.

8

9 V02 Hilt said the suspect looked over at V02 Hilt while V02 Hilt was

10 approaching. As V02 Hilt got closer he recognized the suspect to be

11 S01 Allman. V02 Hilt said while he approached S01 Allman, V02 Hilt

12 had his duty weapon drawn in the ¿low ready¿ position. V02 Hilt said

13 he did not verbalize any commands directed towards S01 Allman because

14 V01 De Santiago was already verbally engaging S01 Allman.

15

16 V02 Hilt saw the suspect point a gun to his own head and heard him say

17 something like, ¿I just want to kill myself.¿ V02 Hilt said S01

18 Allman was holding the firearm in his left hand. V02 Hilt said S01

19 Allman lowered his left hand, at that point V02 Hilt lost sight of

20 the suspect¿s firearm. V02 Hilt believed the suspect pointed the

21 firearm at V01 De Santiago which led V01 De Santiago to open fire.

22 V02 Hilt said at that point he felt like his, V01 De Santiago¿s, and

23 V03 Crist¿s lives were in danger so he opened fire.

24

25 V02 Hilt was not sure of the exact amount of rounds he fired at S01

26 Allman. V02 Hilt said S01 Allman dropped to the ground but was still

27 moving. V02 Hilt said he then started ordering S01 Allman to not to

28 move and to keep his arms out to his side. V01 De Santiago was also

29 giving voice commands to S01 Allman.

6 V02 Hilt said after S01 Allman was handcuffed, V01 De Santiago, V03
7 Crist, and himself posted up near the garage door. V02 Hilt said that
8 Sunnyvale officers arrived at that time but he is unsure if any
9 medical aid was given to S01 Allman because he was focused on the
10 residence.

11

12 V02 Hilt did not notice anyone else on the street during the
13 shooting.

15 INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:

17 This investigation is still on going. For further information and for
18 V03 Crist's statement please refer to the supplemental report
19 completed by Sergeant McAllister.

12 INVESTIGATION:

13

14 On October 6, 2011, I was a member of the Santa Clara County Sheriff's
 15 Office Robbery/Homicide Unit. I was assisting Sergeant Elder and
 16 Sergeant Quinonez with a homicide investigation where the suspect
 17 (S01 Shareef Allman) had been identified but not arrested. See
 18 Sheriff's Office report 11-278-0043W for details regarding the
 19 homicide.

20

21 At approximately 0730 hours, I was at the Sheriff's Office, meeting
 22 with Sergeant Elder, Sergeant Quinonez, Sergeant Poso and several
 23 officers from the U.S. Marshalls Service regarding the next
 24 investigative steps when I received a telephone call from Deputy
 25 Kubik. He asked if I had heard that deputies had confronted a male
 26 believed to be S01 Allman in Sunnyvale and he had subsequently been
 27 shot.

28

29 I contacted County Communications and they informed me that Deputy De
 30 Santiago (V01), Deputy Hilt (V02), and Deputy Crist (V03) had

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1 confronted and shot a man in the driveway of Lorne Way in
 2 Sunnyvale. Sheriff's Office and Sunnyvale officers were both on
 3 scene. Sergeant Poso and I left the office and drove to the scene.
 4
 5 We arrived on Lorne Way at approximately 0804 hours. The area had
 6 been cordoned off with yellow crime scene tape. I checked in with a
 7 deputy posted at the tape and then proceeded toward Lorne Way.
 8 Before reaching the address, Sergeant Poso and I met with a
 9 Lieutenant from Sunnyvale DPS. He briefed us on the known details
 10 and directed us to Detective Choi, who was going to be Sunnyvale's
 11 lead investigator (Sunnyvale D.P.S. report CR11-8189).
 12
 13 Sergeant Poso and I then met with Detective Choi and he informed us of
 14 his intent to look at the crime scene and then return to their office
 15 to complete interviews with the involved officers. They advised there
 16 would be a room where we could view the interviews.
 17
 18 We all then viewed the crime scene.

19
 20 **CRIME SCENE DESCRIPTION:**

21
 22 Lorne Way is a residential street that runs east/west. The shooting
 23 occurred in the driveway of Lorne. This residence is located on
 24 the south side of the street just east of Kintyre Way. The driveway
 25 of the residence is on the east side of the house. There were two
 26 vehicles parked in the driveway. The first was a white Toyota
 27 minivan with a license plate of . This vehicle was parked
 28 pointed to the south. The second vehicle was a black Honda, license
 29 plate . This vehicle was parked pointing to the north. I
 30 noticed there were bullet holes in the garage door and both vehicles.

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1 In between the vehicles, by the garage door, I saw a yellow
 2 emergency blanket with blood running down the driveway from
 3 underneath it.
 4

5 There was a marked Sheriff's Office patrol vehicle parked in front of
 6 the driveway on the street. The driver side door and trunk were open.
 7 An unmarked Sheriff's Office vehicle was parked about two houses east
 8 of Lorne. There was an area between the two Sheriff's Office
 9 vehicles which contained multiple spent casings. As I walked around
 10 the rear of the marked patrol unit, I noticed a second area with
 11 spent casings. This area spanned from the street to the sidewalk and
 12 onto the front lawn of Lorne Way.
 13

14 As I approached the garage of Lorne Way, I noticed a small
 15 rectangular area of vegetation between the driveway and the front
 16 walkway. At the very southern end of the vegetation, I saw a black
 17 handgun in the dirt.
 18

19 East of the suspect, I found one spent casing. I was unable to
 20 confirm at that time that the body under the blanket was that of S01
 21 Allman because his body was covered by the blanket.
 22

23 INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
 24

25 Prior to my leaving the scene, Sunnyvale D.P.S. officers lifted the
 26 blanket and I was able to identify S01 Allman through photographs I
 27 had seen of him.
 28

29 We were told that one of the neighbors had witnessed the shooting.
 30 Detective Choi interviewed the man, but found that he had only heard

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1 the shooting. The neighbor then exited his house to see the deputies
 2 making their approach to the suspect. See Sunnyvale D.P.S. reports
 3 for details on the statement.

4
 5 At approximately 0920 hours, Sergeant Poso and I left the crime scene
 6 and drove to Sunnyvale DPS. The involved officers were already there
 7 and meeting with their attorney,

8
 9
 10 Also present to observe the interviews were Lieutenant Wise and
 11 Sergeant Oberst from the Sheriff's Office, Sergeant Valenzuela from
 12 the Sheriff's Office and Investigator Reyes and Investigator Gaynor
 13 from the Santa Clara County District Attorney's Office.

14
 15 Once we arrived at Sunnyvale and were waiting for the interviews to
 16 begin, Sergeant Poso and I learned the following from Detective Choi,
 17 Detective Ramirez and Lieutenant Anderson.

18
 19 BRIEFING AT SUNNYVALE D.P.S:

20
 21 It appeared that the involved officers had discharged forty-four total
 22 rounds. The casing found near the suspect was brass and believed to
 23 be from the suspect's gun.

24
 25 The resident (001) at Lorne Way had seen the
 26 suspect in her driveway prior to the confrontation. She immediately
 27 recognized him as S01 Shareef Allman. She was standing in a bay
 28 window and saw S01 Allman hiding in her driveway. She then noticed
 29 the police cars driving down the road and waved her hands trying to
 30 get their attention. She did not know if they saw her, but the

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1 police cars stopped. She saw the officers with their weapons drawn
2 and S01 Allman hiding behind her cars. She then went to the back of
3 her house and did not see the shooting.

4
5 Prior to confronting S01 Allman, the deputies had been sent to
6 Lorne Way to safety check the house. The owner believed he had left
7 a door unlocked and was concerned S01 Allman could have entered his
8 home while he was away. The deputies cleared the house and were
9 leaving the area when they encountered S01 Allman.

10
11 A neighborhood canvas found multiple residents who heard the gunfire
12 but no one saw the shooting.

13
14 INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:

15
16 At approximately 1048 hours, per Detective Choi's request, I contacted
17 Sergeant Owens and requested he remove the video tape from the in car
18 video recording system and give it to a member of the Sunnyvale CSI
19 team. The tape was given to them at approximately 1125 hours.

20
21 At approximately 1214 hours, Sergeant Poso contacted County
22 Communications and ordered the 911 calls and law enforcement dispatch
23 tapes connected to this investigation.

24
25 After finishing her meetings with the involved officers,
26 decided that they needed to rest before being interviewed because
27 they had been awake for an extended period of time. It was decided
28 that interviews would begin at approximately 1530 hours.

29
30 Sergeant Poso and I left and returned at approximately 1515 hours.

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1 The first interview was with V01 De Santiago, who was accompanied by
2 . The interview was video recorded by Sunnyvale D.P.S.
3 I viewed the interview on a computer in an adjacent room. Also
4 present with me were Sergeant Poso, Lieutenant Wise, Sergeant Oberst
5 and Sergeant Valenzuela. I placed my department issued digital
6 recorder next to the computer and recorded the interview. Following
7 is a synopsis of the interview.

8
9 **STATEMENT OF VICTIM FABIAN DE SANTIAGO:**

10
11 V01 De Santiago has been employed with the Santa Clara County
12 Sheriff's Office for approximately five years. He has been assigned
13 to the patrol division for around two years.

14
15 On October 5, 2011, V01 De Santiago was working in an overtime
16 capacity. He was assigned to search and make his presence known in
17 area where S01 Allman was last seen (Homestead Road and Lawrence
18 Expressway). He was in full uniform and driving a Sheriff's Office
19 marked patrol unit. Before starting his shift, V01 De Santiago
20 attended a briefing. At the briefing V01 De Santiago learned S01
21 Allman was considered armed and dangerous, that he was associated to
22 two homicides at the Lehigh Cement Plant and was involved in a
23 shooting at HP. He also received a photograph of S01 Allman.

24
25 He started his shift at 2200 hours at Sheriff's Office Headquarters
26 where he was given his vehicle keys (06760), told what he was going
27 to do and who his partners were going to be. He was then told to
28 meet Sergeant Dutra in the parking lot of HP for the official
29 briefing. During all his briefings, he learned that there were three
30 single-deputy marked units, one two-deputy unmarked unit, and two

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1 deputies assigned to the command post at HP. The two-deputy unmarked
 2 unit consisted of V02 Hilt and V03 Crist. They were both in full
 3 Sheriff's Office uniforms.

4
 5 After the briefing, he got into his vehicle and began his twelve hour
 6 shift. He stated that nothing unusual occurred during the night. In
 7 the morning at an unknown time, V01 De Santiago, V02 Hilt and V03
 8 Crist were called to HP to meet with Sergeant Dutra.

9
 10 When V01 De Santiago arrived, he noticed a grey sedan parked near the
 11 command post. Standing near the vehicle was a man talking to Sergeant
 12 Dutra. The man believed that when he was evacuated from his home
 13 earlier in the day, he left the front door unlocked. He wanted
 14 deputies to accompany him to his house at Lorne Way and check the
 15 interior to make sure that no one had entered while he was away.

16
 17 They followed the home owner to his residence (which is west of
 18 Lorne Way) and parked facing west on the south curb line of Lorne
 19 Way. They checked the house and found the front door was locked.
 20 After checking the interior there was no indication that anyone had
 21 been inside. The resident thanked them and they all went back to
 22 their vehicles. V01 De Santiago did not know what time they left the
 23 house but indicated it was light enough that he did not turn his
 24 headlights on.

25
 26 After V02 Hilt and V03 Crist got into their vehicle, V02 Hilt pulled
 27 up next to V01 De Santiago so they could talk about what they were
 28 going to do next. While they were talking, V01 De Santiago looked
 29 into his rear view mirror and saw a black male wearing a white shirt
 30 rise into his view. The male was approximately fifty feet behind

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1 where the vehicles were parked. The male turned away from V01 De
 2 Santiago and V01 De Santiago noticed that the back of his shirt was
 3 dirty. The male then started to walk eastbound on Lorne Way on the
 4 south of the street.

5

6 V02 Hilt asked V01 De Santiago what he was looking at. V01 De
 7 Santiago continued to watch his mirror and told V02 Hilt that they
 8 needed to turn around and go. V02 De Santiago drove west and made a
 9 u-turn in the cul-de-sac. At the same time V02 Hilt made a three
 10 point turn in front of Lorne. While making his u-turn V01 De
 11 Santiago was able to keep the man in view. While watching him, the
 12 suspect turned south into a driveway.

13

14 By the time V01 De Santiago finished his turn and was headed eastbound
 15 on Lorne Way, V02 Hilt and V03 Crist were about three or four car
 16 lengths ahead of him picking up speed. V02 Hilt drove by the
 17 driveway where V01 De Santiago last saw the man which made V01 De
 18 Santiago believe V02 Hilt had not seen him. V01 De Santiago saw the
 19 male near the driver's door of a white minivan and thought possibly
 20 the person lived at the house. V01 De Santiago was also aware the
 21 male could have been S01 Shareef Allman.

22

23 As V01 De Santiago approached Lorne Way, he slowed his car down
 24 and scanned the area looking for the male because he had lost sight
 25 of him momentarily. However, the male rose up and looked eastbound,
 26 staring at V02 Hilt's vehicle. As the male was looking at V02 Hilt's
 27 car traveling eastbound the man started to move in a westbound
 28 direction around the van. Intending to contact the male because of
 29 his suspicious actions, V01 De Santiago stopped his vehicle, put it
 30 into park, got out, and drew his service weapon into a low ready

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1 position. When V01 De Santiago exited the patrol vehicle he and the
 2 man made eye contact. When they made eye contact the male was
 3 between the minivan and the black Honda.
 4
 5 Once outside of the vehicle, V01 De Santiago moved to the rear of his
 6 patrol car and continued until he reached the sidewalk and grass area
 7 in front of Lorne Way. While V01 De Santiago was moving toward
 8 the sidewalk in a southerly direction the male was walking in a
 9 westbound direction between the black Honda and the garage door. V01
 10 De Santiago felt that the suspect was moving so they were going to
 11 "meet in the middle."
 12
 13 V01 De Santiago identified himself as a police officer and told the
 14 male to show him his hands. The male lifted both his hands to face
 15 level and V01 De Santiago saw the male was holding a firearm in his
 16 right hand. It was at that time that V01 De Santiago identified the
 17 male as S01 Shareef Allman.
 18
 19 S01 Allman looked straight at V01 De Santiago and yelled, "Kill me."
 20 By this time V01 De Santiago had his firearm aimed at S01 Allman's
 21 stomach. S01 Allman then made a "punching" motion with his gun hand
 22 toward V01 De Santiago. Fearing for his safety V01 De Santiago fired
 23 at S01 Allman while continuing to move. V01 De Santiago could not
 24 recall if the suspect fired his weapon. V01 De Santiago fired until
 25 he ran out of bullets and then reloaded his firearm with a new
 26 magazine. When V01 De Santiago was reloading his firearm the suspect
 27 was either falling or had fallen to the ground. V01 De Santiago
 28 could not remember if he shot any bullets from the second magazine.
 29 However, as V01 De Santiago got closer to S01 Allman and saw he was
 30 no longer in immediate possession of the firearm V01 De Santiago

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1 stopped shooting because he felt he was no longer in immediate
 2 danger. V01 De Santiago saw the gun lying on the driveway near S01
 3 Allman's right bicep. V01 De Santiago kept his gun pointed toward S01
 4 Allman as he knew that S01 Allman's gun was still close enough for
 5 S01 Allman to use.

6
 7 V01 De Santiago, V02 Hilt and V03 Crist approached S01 Allman from
 8 varying positions. Once they were all positioned near S01 Allman,
 9 V01 De Santiago replaced his gun into his holster, approached the
 10 suspect, grabbed S01 Allman's firearm and placed it in the nearby tan
 11 bark. V01 De Santiago withdrew from the suspect and redrew his
 12 weapon. S01 Allman was unresponsive and not moving which caused V01
 13 De Santiago to holster his weapon a second time, approach S01 Allman
 14 and handcuff him in the event the suspect was feigning his
 15 injury/death.

16
 17 The three officers then called for medical attention for S01 Allman
 18 and maintained their positions until other units arrived on scene.
 19 V01 De Santiago did not give medical aid to S01 Allman.

20
 21 V01 De Santiago did not notice anyone else in the street immediately
 22 after the shooting.

23
 24 **INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:**
 25
 26 The interview with V01 De Santiago was completed at approximately 1645
 27 hours.

28
 29 Before starting the next interview, Detective Choi informed me that
 30 the handgun located in the tan bark was registered to S01 Allman.

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1 When recovered it was loaded with a ten round magazine which
2 contained four rounds and a fifth round was chambered.

3
4 The second interview was with V02 Christopher Hilt, who was
5 accompanied by his attorney, . The interview was video
6 recorded by Sunnyvale D.P.S. I viewed the interview on a computer in
7 an adjacent room. Also present were Sergeant Poso, Lieutenant Wise,
8 Sergeant Oberst and Sergeant Valenzuela. I placed my department
9 issued digital recorder next to the computer and recorded the
10 interview. See Sergeant Poso's supplemental report for details. The
11 interview ended at approximately 1800 hours.

12
13 The last interview was with V03 Lindsay Crist, accompanied by her
14 attorney, . The interview was video recorded by
15 Sunnyvale D.P.S. I viewed the interview on a computer in an adjacent
16 room. I placed my digital recorder next to the computer and recorded
17 the interview. Following is a synopsis of the interview.

18
19 **STATEMENT OF VICTIM LINDSAY CRIST:**
20
21 V03 Crist is currently assigned to the Sheriff's Office Court Security
22 Division stationed in Palo Alto. She has been employed with the
23 Sheriff's Office for approximately a year and a half.

24
25 On October 6, 2011 she was working an overtime shift. The shift
26 started on October 5, 2011 at 2200 hours and had an unknown end time.
27 She and V02 Hilt worked together in an unmarked police vehicle
28 although they were both in full uniform. They were assigned to
29 patrol the area where the suspect was last seen (Homestead and
30 Lawrence Expressway) .

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1

2 Although V03 Crist was not involved in the Lehigh shooting

3 investigation, she had heard some of the details while at work that

4 day.

5

6 When she, V02 Hilt, and another deputy arrived at the Sheriff's

7 Office, the briefing had already started, so they stood to the side

8 and listened. After that briefing was complete, she met with a

9 sergeant and received another smaller briefing where she was given

10 her assignment and keys to the unmarked vehicle. She was then told

11 to report to HP and meet with Sergeant Dutra.

12

13 When they arrived at HP, Sergeant Dutra informed them that they were

14 to drive around the area of Homestead and Lawrence looking for S01

15 Allman. V03 Crist knew the suspect had a lot of weapons. V03 Crist

16 considered him armed and dangerous, although him being armed was not

17 specifically mentioned in the briefings she received.

18

19 She and V02 Hilt went to patrol the area. Nothing unusual happened

20 overnight. In the morning, V02 Hilt received a telephone call

21 instructing them to report to HP and meet with Sergeant Dutra. They

22 were told to go to a house on Lorne Way with V01 De Santiago and

23 search it because the resident believed he left his house unlocked

24 and wanted it checked for the suspect.

25

26 All the officers followed the homeowner to his house. Once at the

27 house, they determined there had been no entry into the house while

28 the owner was away. V03 Crist returned to the passenger seat of the

29 unmarked vehicle and got in. V02 Hilt got into the driver's seat and

30 V01 De Santiago got into his vehicle.

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1

2 V02 Hilt then turned their car around so they were facing east and V01

3 De Santiago was facing west. V01 De Santiago and V02 Hilt began

4 talking. V03 Crist did not pay attention to what they were

5 discussing. V03 Crist could not see V01 De Santiago from her

6 position and in fact was looking down at the dashboard.

7

8 V01 De Santiago then just stopped talking but it seemed to V03 Crist

9 that he was trying to say something and could not get it out. V01 De

10 Santiago then started moving his car. V02 Hilt moved their car

11 forward a bit but he was not saying anything either. V03 Crist asked

12 if they were going for coffee. V02 Hilt said he thought V01 De

13 Santiago had seen something. V03 Crist then looked up and around but

14 did not see the suspect.

15

16 V02 Hilt drove east a bit and then stopped. V03 Crist opened her car

17 door and turned around. As she was turning around, she saw the

18 profile of a subject in front of her. She was only able to see his

19 head and upper torso; his lower torso and hands were not visible

20 because he was standing between a garage door and two vehicles. The

21 vehicles' positions were blocking V03 Crist's view.

22

23 V03 Crist started walking aggressively toward V01 De Santiago, who she

24 could see out of her peripheral vision. It appeared to her that

25 something was occurring between V01 De Santiago and the male. She

26 focused on the male and immediately recognized him as S01 Shareef

27 Allman. Her first thought was the protection of herself and her

28 partners. With that in mind she removed her firearm from her holster

29 and prepared to encounter a hostile suspect.

30

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1 She noticed that V01 De Santiago had his weapon drawn. At the same
 2 time, V03 Crist heard V01 De Santiago order S01 Allman to put the gun
 3 down. She then saw S01 Allman raise a black handgun towards where V01
 4 De Santiago was standing. S01 Allman raised his gun so it was near
 5 his head and canted to the left but pointed toward V01 De Santiago.
 6 V03 Crist believed that S01 Allman was going to shoot V01 De
 7 Santiago.

8
 9 V03 Crist heard a shot but was unaware of where it came from. Fearing
 10 for her and her partner's safety she opened fire on S01 Allman. She
 11 was unaware if S01 Allman ever shot, because at that point she
 12 focused on her own shooting. V03 Crist continued shooting until her
 13 magazine was empty. She reloaded the weapon and pointed it toward
 14 the last place she had seen S01 Allman.

15
 16 V03 Crist saw that S01 Allman was lying on the ground. She was unable
 17 to see both of S01 Allman's hands from her position. However, she
 18 heard V01 De Santiago telling S01 Allman not to reach for the weapon.
 19 Based on the fact that S01 Allman was no longer in complete control
 20 of the gun and that he was on the ground, V03 Crist did not fire any
 21 more rounds at S01 Allman she wanted to reassess the situation and
 22 confer with her partners.

23
 24 V03 Crist approached the suspect from between the two vehicles. She
 25 noticed that S01 Allman was making some movements but did not believe
 26 them to be toward the weapon which was still within his reach. She
 27 ordered S01 Allman to not move and then all three deputies continued
 28 their approach toward S01 Allman.

29
 30 When they reached him, V01 De Santiago holstered his gun and

 5 V01 Crist believed that S01 Allman had been hit by rounds as she was
 6 able to see a bullet hole in his clothing. S01 Allman was also
 7 bleeding profusely. V03 Crist did not know the extent of S01
 8 Allman's injuries.
 9
 10 When S01 Allman was handcuffed, V02 Hilt and V01 De Santiago focused
 11 their attention on the door while V03 Crist continued to watch S01
 12 Allman. Additional police units started to arrive. Medical
 13 assistance was called for but V03 Crist held them outside the scene
 14 until the house was checked.
 15
 16 INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
 17
 18 After all the interviews were completed, I received a message that S01
 19 Allman's sister had called and wanted someone to contact her. I
 20 contacted Monique Allman by telephone. She wanted to know what was
 21 going on. I explained the circumstances surrounding the quarry
 22 shooting and S01 Allman's death. She was stunned by what I told her,
 23 but said that the last time she talked with S01 Allman about two
 24 months ago, he told her that Lehigh was trying to railroad him and
 25 that he was not going to let that happen. I gave her the contact
 26 number for the Santa Clara County Coroner's Office and explained the
 27 next investigative steps. After completing the telephone call,
 28 Sergeant Poso and I left for the night.
 29
 30 On October 7, 2011 at approximately 1400 hours, I received a telephone

1 call from Detective Choi. He informed me that when the autopsy was
2 conducted, Doctor found S01 Allman had been shot in the head
3 one time and it appeared the wound was self inflicted. There was

5 a very close contact wound. When S01 Allman's gun was placed by the
6 wound, it matched. S01 Allman was shot approximately seven or eight
7 times, with five rounds recovered. Those shots were in the low
8 abdomen and legs.

9

10 Investigation is still ongoing.

19 I did not re-enter the scene and left approximately 0930 hours.
