	deputies were seen at area hospitals regarding various injuries they
	received while trying to restrain V1 V1 was also
	taken to Valley Medical Center (VMC) for treatment and evaluation of

11	and I contacted V1 at the Main Jail and obtained the

14	STATEMENT OF VICTIM :

16	I advised V1 of the reason for our contact with him and asked
17	him to provide his statement as to what happened. V1 stated
18	he had been in custody since July of 2013. Since coming into
19	custody, he had been housed on the second floor of the jail, which
20	was the medical unit. V1 had problems with one of his legs,
21	which caused him to use a cane when he walked. V1 went on to
22	state, "there was no way I could have assaulted any cops" and he was
23	"very clear" on what had happened during this incident.
24	
25	V1 told me he has been recovering well since the incident. He
26	had headaches for approximately two weeks and it took him five or six
27	days before he could look upward without his eyes fluttering and
28	getting dizzy. Upon returning from the hospital after the incident,
29	V1 was continually vomiting due to the injuries he sustained

1	minutes, the cell doors to the housing unit were opened and inmates
2	were let out for "Program", which is described as free time allotted
3	outside of a cell for the inmates.

5	During the allotted Program time, V1 had asked O3 Bragg if he
6	could retrieve a bar of soap and a towel from his property in order
7	to take a shower. O3 Bragg denied the request and V1 had to
8	"scrounge" to get what he needed from the other inmates. Program

1	like I'll Mother Fuck you in here."
2	
3	V1 described being upset at O3 Bragg, who V1 said was
4	"just being a dick" to him. V1 now thought O3 Bragg would
5	take some of his personal belongings from the property once he was
6	able to search through it, and felt his property would be "Fucked
7	up". However, V1 felt he had been patient enough with O3
8	Bragg not giving him his property and wanted O3 Bragg to know he
9	would say something back to him if he was to be treated poorly.
10	
11	O3 Bragg walked away from V1 cell. Approximately 30 minutes
12	later, the door to V1 cell popped open. V1 walked
13	out of his cell and saw 03 Bragg standing, with his arms and hands
14	folded down near his beltline, adjacent to a pile of V1
15	property on the floor. V1 described the property as being
16	taken completely out of the bag and dumped onto the floor, with the
17	plastic bag thrown on top of the pile. V1 looked at the pile
18	of property on the floor and asked O3 Bragg, "So this is how you get
19	down?"

21	O3 Bragg said, "What you gonna do about it?"
22	
23	V1 admitted he called O3 Bragg a "Mother Fucking Asshole!" O3
24	Bragg responded by coming forward toward V1 and yelling,
25	"Down on the ground. Down on the ground." V1 told us he
26	"sprung" away from O3 Bragg, dropped directly down to the ground, and
27	put his hands behind his back. O3 Bragg dropped down onto V1

30	V1 had later heard that O3 Bragg pushed a button on his radio

2 V1 talked about how he turned his head and continued to
3 verbally confront O3 Bragg. O3 Bragg had a hold of V1
4 hands while this was happening, but had not yet secured them in
5 handcuffs. Soon thereafter, the other deputies came running in to
6 help. V1 is not sure at what point he was placed in
7 handcuffs, but recognized he was handcuffed at some point.
8
9 V1 told us he did not physically resist 03 Bragg at any point.
10 Even when asked how much he moved his left arm around in an effort
11 to prevent O3 Bragg from getting control of him, V1 repeated
12 that he did not put up any physical resistance at any time. When I
13 asked V1 about his right arm and the possibility it was
14 pinned underneath his body, he stated his arms were never under his
15 body and he placed his hands behind his back as soon as he went down
16 to the floor. V1 described O3 Bragg grabbing both of his

	I asked V1 to describe what exactly happened after the other
3	deputies came in and started to join into the struggle. V1
4	described one of the deputies coming into the struggle and "landing"
5	on his head. He stated it was "a major, major, major thump" on his
6	head. He looked and saw a deputies face, but then there were more
7	"thumps" and he started "leaking" all over the place. V1
8	heard people saying "Mother Fucker" and "Punk Bitches", but did not
9	know who was yelling out these phrases. Soon thereafter, the
10	incident was over and he was handcuffed.
11	
12	V1 did not lose consciousness and said the whole incident only
13	lasted approximately 30 seconds to a minute. V1 recalled a
14	Sergeant being on scene and having a rag held to his head to stop the
15	bleeding while he was walked down to the second floor medical unit.

18	V1 thought the injury to the top of his head occurred when he
19	was "smashed" by the first officer who came to assist O3 Bragg. I
20	attempted to verify if V1 was saying the injury occurred when
21	he was taken to the floor and hit his head, but he was able to
22	clarify the statement by telling me the injury occurred when the
23	first officer hit his head and his head was forced to the ground. V1
24	was unable to tell me how the injury to his right eyebrow
25	occurred because he just remembered having his head turned to the
26	left and the right side of his face was on the floor.

28	I asked V1 if he knew what he had been hit with by the
29	deputies as they responded. V1 said the deputies "knees" and
30	"thighs" hit him while his head was on or near the floor, causing all
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1	of the injuries. He tried to describe the deputy he saw when he came
2	to the fifth floor, which was the same deputy he noticed landed on
3	his head during the struggle. He described him as a white male,
4	thick, with brown hair slicked back and short on the sides. The

13	Once V1 was down in the second floor medical unit of the jail,
14	his eyes had swollen shut and he was unable to see. He kept trying
15	to tell the Sergeant who was there to take pictures of him and his
16	injuries prior to being taken to the hospital, but the Sergeant
17	refused. V1 remembered having a small conversation with a
18	Sergeant who was on the scene, but also thought the Sergeant was
19	trying to "cross (him) up" and "double talk" him when asking what had

22	I asked V1 at what point during the struggle he reached up to
23	grab one of the deputies legs or attempted to bite one of the
24	deputies. V1 looked confused and said he never tried to grab
25	or bite any of the deputies. He told us he immediately put his hands

27	landed on his head, the fight instantly went out of him and his

30	V1 was able to remember hearing the deputies yelling and

1	cursing at him while he was on the ground, but does not remember
2	hearing anyone tell him to "stop resisting" or "give me your hands".
3	He described having his head "enveloped" by the responding deputy's
4	knees and thighs, and only remembered being struck on the head three
5	times. The deputies had their full body weight on his head and back
6	area during the struggle, even though he had given up, become
7	cooperative, and had his hands behind his back. V1 could not
8	tell me if anyone else had struck him in any other area of his body
9	and he could not identify any of the deputies who were involved in
10	the incident, other than O3 Bragg.

12	We began to talk about what V1 had anticipated happening and
13	what he wanted the outcome to eventually be when he was interacting
14	with O3 Bragg prior to the struggle. V1 stated, "There's
15	some officers that, you know, you can Mother Fuck and they'll say,
16	'ah, yeah, yeah' and lock ya down for the night and then
17	there's some other officers that you can Mother Fuck and they'll say,
18	'what do you want to do about it? I ran into one of those."
19	
20	V1 told me he had been thinking about it while he was sitting
21	in his cell after the Programs wrapped up on the night of the
22	incident, and when his door popped open he did not want to go out.
23	He realized he had put himself into a bad situation, but also knew he
24	just wanted his property to be returned to him. He went out to talk
25	to O3 Bragg and knew he had a couple of options, with one of them
26	being to simply pick up his property and return to his cell.
27	However, V1 also wanted O3 Bragg to know he "can't be treated
28	like that without saying with I think about it." V1 said he
29	wanted his property back, but he didn't want to be in any type of
30	large confrontation or "ugly scene". V1 did not think O3
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1	Bragg had any respect for the inmates and went on to say, "I've never
2	seen nothing like that. There was absolutely no fucking reason for
3	him to be acting like that."
4	
5	V1 felt the entire incident was as a result of his being an
6	"AB dropout". He felt O3 Bragg felt V1
7	was a racist, which is what caused O3 Bragg to treat V1
8	the way he did. V1 told me he dropped out of the
9	Arian Brotherhood back in 1990 and has since moved on to marry a
10	Filipino woman. He does not think or believe in the philosophies of
11	the Arian Brotherhood any longer and O3 Bragg's race and/or V1
12	feelings about it did not play any role in what happened on
13	the night of this incident.
14	
15	V1 went on to say he did not think O3 Bragg was wrong for
16	wanting to look through his property before letting him have it in
17	the cell. V1 knows all of the Correctional Deputies will
18	look through a new inmate's property when they come into the unit and
19	realized O3 Bragg was just doing what he was supposed to do.
20	However, V1 had been in his cell after Programing for
21	approximately 45 minutes and was extremely cold. All he wanted was a
22	blanket from his property and began to think O3 Bragg was stalling on
23	purpose. Although V1 had never met or seen O3 Bragg prior to
24	this incident, V1 felt like he was "set up" to get hurt
25	during this incident. When I asked why, V1 said it was
26	because the other deputies were too quick to arrive at the struggle,
27	which to him meant they must have been waiting at the door to come
28	running in.
29	
30	V1 verified he did not actually see any of the officers
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1	waiting at the door to come running in. He had heard from a previous
2	interview that O3 Bragg had pressed the "emergency button" on his
3	radio for assistance, which was the signal for the other deputies to
4	come to O3 Bragg's aid, but still felt they had arrived on scene too
5	quickly. To V1 this meant the other deputies already knew
6	they were going to come into a fight, further making him believe he
7	had been "set up".
8	
9	Sergeant Quinonez asked V1 again if he could describe the
10	deputy who had struck him in the head area with his knees. V1
11	provided the same description as he had earlier in the
12	interview. He said the deputy's knees and thighs "enveloped" his
13	head, which to him meant "all consuming". The force of the deputy
14	landing on V1 was very hard, but V1 thought it was
15	due to the deputy placing all of his body weight down on his head.
16	V1 was only able to quickly look up at the deputy's face and
17	described the look on his face to be "angry". V1 feels the
18	deputies will all try to "cover" for one another, but also felt the
19	other inmates will provide a more accurate account of what they
20	saw.
21	
22	V1 stated he never resisted or struck any of the deputies
23	involved in the struggle. He said he simply "sprung" back and went
24	to the ground so there would not be any type of physical altercation.
25	When questioned about the possibility V1 resisted by not
26	giving both of his hands to O3 Bragg or the other responding
27	deputies, V1 said he immediately put both of his hands behind
28	his back. O3 Bragg grabbed both of V1 hands and twisted
29	his arms up toward the back of his head. This caused injuries to V1
30	elbows, which he stated were still sore.
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-	
1	
	V1 thought he should be able to verbally confront a deputy or
	police officer and expect to be disciplined. He mentioned the
4	infraction process conducted in the County Jail system and said he
5	would expect a similar type of punishment. However, V1 told
6	us he shouldn't expect to get "smashed like this".
7	
8	V1 further went on to say, "I did nothing to warrant this type
9	of fucking ass whooping." He agreed he could be taken to the ground,
10	and would even expect some type of "split of the eyebrow", but he
11	also felt the deputies involved in this incident were deliberately
12	trying to hurt him. V1 did not want to report what happened
13	to him in this incident out of fear of retaliation by the
14	Correctional Deputies. V1 just wanted to spend time in his
15	cell to heal and move on. V1 has become further fearful and
16	"spooked" by what he feels is continued poor treatment while back in
17	custody at the Main Jail. V1 told us he thought the deputies
18	had turned off the water to his cell for a couple of days, withheld
19	personal items he needed, and kept him on "ass out status" since his
20	return from the hospital. When I asked what V1 meant by
21	that, he told me it meant he could not ask for anything from the
22	deputies because he would be "out of luck". V1 admitted he
23	may have a bad attitude and, at times, say things that may get him
24	into trouble. However, he also feels the Correctional Deputies have
25	poor attitudes, which has contributed to the problems he has had
26	while in custody.
27

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1	O6 Jensen stated he is the supervisor for the "D Team" at the Main
2	Jail and has been so for approximately four months. He normally
	supervises the same individuals every week, with the exceptions of
4	sick calls and vacations by deputies. He stated he remembered the
5	altercation between V1 and O3 Bragg and the events of the
6	incident.
7	
8	O6 Jensen stated he was on the main floor of the jail and heard the
9	emergency call coming over his packset radio, from the fifth floor.
10	In response, he took the elevator from the main floor to the fifth
11	floor. Sergeants Stream and Bracket also responded to the fifth
12	floor for the incident. Just prior to arriving on the fifth floor,
13	deputies on scene advised via radio that the incident was under
14	control and no further emergency response was needed.
15	
16	Upon exiting the elevator, 06 Jensen noticed an inmate (V1
17	being escorted out of "5A", bleeding from the head. After a brief
18	stop in an interview room on the fifth floor, O6 Jensen ordered V1
19	immediately be taken down to the second floor medical unit
20	for treatment. O6 Jensen recalled deputies attempting to administer
21	first aid to V1 injuries, but they wanted to quickly take
22	V1 to the second floor for more appropriate treatment. 06
23	Jensen verified he had turned on a video recorder upon arriving on
24	the fifth floor. He gave the recorder to Sergeant Bracket, who was
25	able to record the incident from that point forward.
26	
27	O6 Jensen thought V1 was handcuffed to the rear as he was
28	brought out of 5A, but he could not remember if V1 had on any
29	type of leg shackles or other restraints. V1 did not say
30	anything prior to being taken down to the second floor. O6 Jensen
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1	remained on the fifth floor to take digital photographs of the scene,
2	but had to wait for all of the camera equipment to be brought to the
3	floor. While waiting, O6 Jensen was able to speak with some of the
4	involved deputies and gather information on what had occurred.
5	
6	In speaking with O3 Bragg, O6 Jensen learned V1 had just been
7	housed up in 5A and O3 Bragg was trying to search through his
8	property. 03 Bragg called V1 to come out of his cell to pick
9	up his property. When V1 came out of his cell, a verbal
10	altercation occurred, which led to a physical struggle in the dorm.
11	O3 Bragg did not provide O6 Jensen with any further information.
12	
13	O6 Jensen spoke to O2 Murillo, who told him he had come running out of
14	unit 5C in response to O3 Bragg's emergency request for assistance.
15	Upon entering into the 5A housing unit, O2 Murillo noticed O3 Bragg
16	and V1 in a physical struggle on the floor of the unit. O3
17	Bragg was on V1 left side trying to control V1
18	left hand. O2 Murillo noticed V1 right hand was still free
19	and he was moving it around. O2 Murillo went in to try and control
20	V1 right hand and they were eventually able to gain control
21	of him. O2 Murillo did not provide O6 Jensen with any further
22	information.
23	
24	Finally, 06 Jensen spoke to 01 Tri about the incident. 01 Tri told
25	him he was the second deputy to come in to assist O3 Bragg. He
26	noticed O3 Bragg was trying to get control of V1 left arm.
27	O1 Tri told O6 Jensen he "punched" V1 in the face "a few
28	times" to help. During this conversation, O1 Tri was extremely out
29	of breath and had a hard time telling O6 Jensen all of the details.
30	O6 Jensen did not get any further information from O1 Tri.
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1	
2	O6 Jensen gathered all of the information on the injuries O1 Tri, O2
3	Murillo, and O3 Bragg sustained during the incident. O6 Jensen asked
4	Sergeant Duran to begin filling out the paperwork for the deputies'
5	injuries and continued supervising the incident. O3 Bragg suffered
6	general soreness and a cut to the top of one of his hands. 02
7	Murillo had a sore knee. O1 Tri complained of pain to one of his
8	hands, the pinky finger on the hand, and soreness to one of his
9	knees.
10	
11	I verified with O6 Jensen that O1 Tri had told him he struck V1
12	in the face with his fist. O6 Jensen told me that, at that
13	time, O1 Tri told him he had only struck V1 with his fist
14	during the struggle.
15	
16	After talking to the deputies involved in the struggle, O6 Jensen
17	began taking digital photographs of the scene. While taking
18	pictures, O6 Jensen noticed a blood trail leading from the inside of
19	the unit, to the front door leading into the unit. There was a
20	puddle of blood in the unit, near the sun-deck door, and a puddle of
21	blood in the interview room V1 had been sitting prior to
22	being taken to the second floor medical unit.
23	
24	O6 Jensen then responded to the second floor medical unit to contact
25	V1 Upon arrival, V1 was being treated by the nurses
26	and his injuries had already been bandaged. O6 Jensen spoke to V1
27	and obtained a short statement, but he could not immediately
28	remember what V1 said. V1 was extremely upset, used
29	foul language, and seemed to be directing his anger toward the
30	deputies involved in the incident. At the conclusion of the contact,
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1	V1 was transported to Valley Medical Center (VMC) for
2	treatment.
3	
4	Once V1 left, O6 Jensen went back to the fifth floor to
5	continue the investigation. O6 Jensen was able to take digital
6	photographs of various angles looking toward the location where the
7	struggle occurred, including angles some of the inmates would have
8	had as they were looking out of their cell doors. O6 Jensen asked
9	Corrections Deputy Lozado to contact each inmate in the unit to
10	obtain their statements as to what they witnessed during the
11	struggle. O6 Jensen then tried to contact O1 Tri, O2 Murillo, and O3
12	Bragg to verify they were able to complete their Employees Reports
13	(ER) prior to ending their shifts. O6 Jensen was able to contact O2
14	Murillo and O3 Bragg, who completed their ERs, but could not locate
15	O1 Tri to ask him about completing his ER.
16	
17	A short time later, Deputy Lozado contacted O6 Jensen and said a few
18	of the inmates in 5A had witnessed the incident and provided
19	statements as to what had occurred. Some of the inmates had stated
20	they were able to see O3 Bragg struggling with V1 when the
21	other deputies came in to assist. After V1 had been subdued,
22	O1 Tri came in and kicked V1 in the head area, and then ran
23	out of the unit. O6 Jensen instructed Deputy Lozado to make sure he
24	had full statements from the inmates and advised him to complete an
25	ER dictating what the inmates saw.
26	
27	Prior to the end of the shift, O6 Jensen was able to locate and speak
28	to O1 Tri. O1 Tri was able to complete his ER before the end of the
29	shift and prior to seeking any medical attention.

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1	Later, 06 Jensen spoke to all of the involved deputies regarding
	making sure their ERs were as detailed as possible and the
	information was accurate. The deputies made some revisions to their
	reports and had them approved prior to leaving at the end of their
	shifts. After leaving the jail, all three deputies sought medical
	attention, on their own, for their injuries.
7	
8	Upon reading the final versions of the ERs, O6 Jensen noticed O1 Tri,
9	O2 Murillo, and O3 Bragg all described O1 Tri kicking V1 in
10	the head area 3 - 4 times. O1 Tri explained in his ER that V1
11	had tried to grab and bite him during the struggle; therefore
12	O1 Tri kicked V1 to prevent this from happening. Neither O2
13	Murillo, nor O3 Bragg ever mentioned seeing V1 trying to grab
14	or bite O1 Tri during the struggle and O6 Jensen was unable to verify
15	this information. O2 Murillo wrote he had used knee strikes to V1
16	in an attempt to gain compliance and control of V1
17	right arm, which were unsuccessful until more deputies arrived to
18	assist.
19	
20	O6 Jensen and I spent a while talking about the ERs provided by the
21	deputies and the information they provided in their Sheriff's Office
22	criminal reports. Although O6 Jensen was able to provide some
23	information on the comparison, he was unable to provide information
24	that was additional to what the deputies had documented.
25	
26	O6 Jensen talked about some of the contact he has had with V1
27	since the date of the original incident. He says he has had some
28	contact with V1 but the contact seems to be normal. 06
29	Jensen has not discussed the incident with V1 since then, but
30	also stated he was aware of an incident V1 had with some of
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1	the correctional deputies in the days just prior to this interview.
2	
3	Sergeant Quinonez asked O6 Jensen a few questions about when he had
4	decided a criminal report would have been required, in addition to
5	the ER's originally completed by the involved deputies. O6 Jensen
6	stated he had read all of the final drafts of the ER's and then
7	learned of the injuries to the deputies upon his return to work the
8	following week. It was at that point 06 Jensen decided that there
9	could have possibly been a criminal act of resisting, which caused
10	injury to the deputies, necessitating a criminal report against V1
11	However, 06 Jensen also stated he had thought about the
12	information provided by the deputies in their ER's and wondered about
13	the use of force O1 Tri had used when kicking V1 in the head
14	during the incident. As a result of these thoughts, O6 Jensen also
15	considered the possibility of an excessive use of force type
16	situation, until he learned of the injuries and the possibility of
17	the force being needed to overcome V1 resistance and

20	To follow up on O6 Jensen's previous thoughts, I asked O6 Jensen to

He did not think they 8 had time to discuss the incident amongst themselves prior to being 9 contacted by Deputy Lozado and did not recall any of them saying V1 10 was in the act of resisting at the time he was kicked in the 11 head by 01 Tri. 2 I advised O2 Murillo of the reason for my contact and asked if he
3 recalled the incident. O2 Murillo said he was very familiar with the
4 incident and described it as the most recent disturbance handled by
5 his team. O2 Murillo stated the incident occurred near the end of
6 the normal "Program" time, which was at 2300 hours. Over his
7 packset, 02 Murillo heard the control room announce there was an
8 emergency button push coming from O3 Bragg in the 5A dorm unit. O2
9 Murillo locked down his unit and immediately began responding to unit
10 5A. O2 Murillo estimated it only took a couple of seconds for him to
11 lock down his unit and begin his response.
12
13 Upon exiting his unit, O2 Murillo could see O1 Tri exiting unit 5C and
14 also running toward 5A. The floor control officer unlocked the door
15 leading into 5A and they both ran in, O1 Tri first followed by O2
16 Murillo. O2 Murillo estimated he was only two or three seconds
17 behind O1 Tri as they ran into the unit. As he was running into the
18 unit, O2 Murillo could see O3 Bragg on the floor in a struggle with
19 V1 V1 was unsecured and extremely combative with O3
20 Bragg at that time. O2 Murillo described O3 Bragg and V1
21 being on the floor, directly under the "threshold" of the door
22 leading into the sun deck area of the unit. V1 was in a
23 prone position, with his face toward the floor, his head pointing
24 toward the main area of the unit, and his feet closer to the door
25 leading into the unit. O3 Bragg was off to the side of V1
26 trying to gain control of V1 left arm and handcuff him.

28 Recognizing there was an unsecured and combative inmate who was in a
29 physical altercation with O3 Bragg, O2 Murillo immediately went to
30 help gain control of V1 O1 Tri ran around V1 body

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1	as he was lying on the floor and up to his head area. O2 Murillo
2	went to the right side of V1 body in an attempt to gain
3	control of his right arm and hand. O2 Murillo went down to his knees
4	and tried to pull V1 arm to a position of control. V1
5	resisted O2 Murillo's attempts to get his right arm. O2
6	Murillo described V1 as "highly resistive, very combative,
7	not going along with my directives." V1 had his right arm
8	tucked underneath his body and O2 Murillo felt V1 was trying
9	to push himself up off of the ground. He continually ordered V1
10	to give him his right arm and to stop resisting, however V1
11	did not comply. Even with the resistance V1 was
12	giving at the time, O2 Murillo realized there were at least three
13	deputies on scene and he was "pretty confident" they could gain
14	control of him.
15	
16	O2 Murillo told us he grabbed V1 right arm near the elbow
17	area and continued to try and "yank" his arm out from under him, but
18	V1 was "not cooperating". In an attempt to gain compliance,
19	O2 Murillo used the top of his knee to strike V1 on the back
20	of the upper arm, hoping to cause enough pain to gain compliance from
21	V1 Unfortunately, V1 continued to resist and would
22	not give O2 Murillo his arm to be secured behind his back. O2
23	Murillo said that, although he was unable to gain compliance from V1
24	and secure his right arm, he at least felt comfortable in the
25	position he was in because V1 was not swinging his arm from
26	side to side or using his arm in a threatening manner against him.
27	When I asked why V1 was not swinging his arm and why O2
28	Murillo felt so comfortable, O2 Murillo stated, "Because it was
29	underneath". O2 Murillo said he was giving V1 an opportunity
30	to surrender his right arm, but V1 was intentionally keeping
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1	his arm underneath him so the deputies could not gain control of him.
2	After approximately 8-10 seconds, other deputies responded to the
3	scene and they were able to overcome V1 resistance just due
4	to the sheer number of people trying to gain compliance.
5	O2 Murillo was unsure if O3 Bragg was ever able to gain control of V1
6	left arm, but he did not think O3 Bragg was successful. O2
7	Murillo just tried to maintain focus on trying to get control of V1
8	right arm during the struggle and trusted O3 Bragg would be
9	able to get control of the left arm. Once further assistance
10	arrived, they were able to control V1
11	
12	I asked O2 Murillo if he noticed what O1 Tri did upon arriving at the
13	scene of the struggle. O2 Murillo stated he saw O1 Tri standing in
14	the head area of V1 and noticed O1 Tri kicked V1 in
15	or about the face/shoulder area two to three times. O1 Tri then
16	crouched down and put his left knee on V1 right shoulder.
17	O2 Murillo noticed O1 Tri was there, but described it as being hard
18	to see what he was doing from that point forward because he could not
19	see very well while he was focusing on V1 right arm. After
20	kneeling onto V1 shoulder, O1 Tri began to strike V1
21	in the head with his fist to gain compliance. O2 Murillo was
22	unsure of how many times O1 Tri struck V1 with his fists, but
23	described it as being "at least three" times. They all continued to
24	struggle until other officers came in and they were all able to gain
25	control of V1
26	
27	I tried to clarify exactly how clear O2 Murillo was on what O1 Tri had
28	done. He stated he could clearly see what O1 Tri was doing,
29	including kicking V1 in the face and head area, right up
30	until the point where O1 Tri crouched down and put his knee on V1

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1	shoulder.
2	
3	O2 Murillo was certain he saw O1 Tri kick V1 with his foot,
4	but he could not tell me what part of his foot actually struck V1
5	He described seeing O1 Tri swing his leg to kick V1
6	but knew O1 Tri had not crouched down yet so he could not
7	have used his knee. O2 Murillo said O1 Tri made a "big swing" with
8	his leg, like he was trying to "get him (V1 off of him (O1
9	Tri) or to get him (V1 to respond", but also "it wasn't like
10	a field goal kick", referring to someone kicking a football.
11	However, O2 Murillo was sure he saw O1 Tri kick V1 in the
12	face and then crouch down on his shoulder.
13	
14	I asked O2 Murillo what V1 was doing while O1 Tri was kicking
15	him and kneeling on his shoulder. O2 Murillo told me V1
16	never stopped resisting at any point. O2 Murillo was still trying to
17	get control of V1 right arm, which was tucked underneath
18	his body the entire time. This included when O1 Tri kicked V1
19	in the face, as well as when he kneeled down on his shoulder
20	and began to strike him on the head with his fist. O2 Murillo said
21	V1 right arm was still tucked underneath his body when the

	After V1 had been handcuffed and the struggle was over, O2
	Murillo was still on the scene and assisted in getting V1 up

30	up from the ground, O2 Murillo noticed there was blood on the floor,

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1	as well as on V1 face and head. V1 was taken from
2	5A and escorted down to the second floor medical unit for treatment.
3	When I asked, O2 Murillo told me he did not notice any blood either
4	on V1 or on the floor prior to him arriving to assist O3

6	noticed the blood on the floor and on V1

8	O2 Murillo stated he continued to give verbal commands to V1
9	throughout the incident. He could remember hearing O3 Bragg also
10	giving verbal commands for V1 to stop resisting, but did not
11	recall O1 Tri ever saying anything to V1 O2 Murillo denied
12	ever saying, or hearing anyone else say, anything derogatory to V1
13	during the struggle and said he was only giving V1
14	commands to "stop resisting". Once V1 was controlled and
15	escorted to the second floor medical unit, O2 Murillo did not have
16	any further contact with him.
17	
18	O2 Murillo said he sustained some redness and swelling in his right
19	knee during the struggle. He was ordered to prepare his ER for the
20	incident prior to the end of his shift, but then sought medical
21	attention at O'Connor Hospital for the injuries to his knee. He was
22	diagnosed with a sprain to his knee and was given three days off for
23	the swelling and pain to subside. He has since returned to work and
24	is no longer having any problems with his knee.
25	
26	Since then, O2 Murillo has spoken to O1 Tri and O3 Bragg about what
27	happened. He and O3 Bragg talked about why the entire incident
28	occurred and what caused V1 to resist the way he did. 02
29	Murillo also talked to O1 Tri about the struggle, including why he
30	kicked and struck him in the head and face area. O1 Tri told O2
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1	Murillo he kicked V1 because V1 had tried to grab his
2	leg. When I asked, O2 Murillo verified he never actually saw V1
3	grab O1 Tri or anyone else with his right arm because it was
4	tucked underneath him the entire time. However, O2 Murillo could not
5	say what happened with V1 and O1 Tri before he actually
6	arrived on scene and joined the struggle, and O2 Murillo could not
7	speak for anything that happened with V1 left arm. O2
8	Murillo could see V1 left elbow and O3 Bragg trying to gain
9	control of V1 left arm, but also said he did not see V1
10	left hand at any time.
11	
12	Sergeant Quinonez asked O2 Murillo to verify his exact location in
13	relation to V1 as he lay prone on the floor of the unit. 02
14	Murillo said he was kneeling on the right side of V1 just
15	below his right shoulder, adjacent to his upper right arm. O2
16	Murillo felt V1 right arm may have been a threat to him
17	because it was still unsecured and tucked underneath his body,
18	therefore he delivered approximately three knee strikes to gain
19	compliance. Sergeant Quinonez asked O2 Murillo, having in mind that
20	he witnessed O1 Tri kick V1 in the face, what threat V1
21	face and head were to the deputies during the struggle that
22	would require that level of force. O2 Murillo replied, "I don't
23	know. You would have to ask him. I couldn't tell you. I couldn't
24	tell you."
25	
26	O2 Murillo also stated he could not speculate what threat O1 Tri may
27	have felt at the time and let us know he could not see V1
28	face during the struggle, to see what he may have been doing. O2
29	Murillo was only sure that he saw O1 Tri kick V1 in the face
30	and head area at right about the same time as he was reaching for V1

12 further investigation, I was able to identify another inmate who

16 W6 was still in custody at the Main Jail.

18 In an effort to get W6 statement as to what occurred during	<u> </u>

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1	was able to look in the window of the cell next to him to see what
2	was going on in other parts of the dorm. Even though he was just
3	using the reflection from a window to see what was going on, W6
4	said he could still clearly see what was happening.
5	
6	W6 happened to ask me if this was about ¿the white guy, they
7	stomped his head in:. I took this opportunity to show W6 a
8	picture I had previously taken and printed of V1 W6
9	reminded me that it had been some time since this incident, but he
10	thought it was V1 W6 recalled that V1 had
11	just come into the unit on that particular day, but he could not
12	remember seeing W6 carrying his personal belongings. We
13	briefly spoke about W6 only providing the information he
14	could actually remember, versus things he did not know or could not
15	remember. W6 stated, ¿well what pissed me off was with, when
16	the dude came and stomped his head there was 10 or 8, 8 fucking cops
17	sitting around watching him do it, and let him do it until the one
18	told him to get the fuck out of there.¿

20	W6 again verified that V1 had just come into the unit
21	that day. V1 was grunning his mouth; toward the officer in
22	the dorm because he did not have his personal stuff. However, W6
23	said he also knew that when the officers ¿extract¿ an inmate
24	from their cell, they are supposed to handcuff the inmate before he
25	comes out so there are no problems. I asked W6 about his use
26	of the word ¿extract¿ during that statement and whether or not he
27	remembered V1 being ¿extracted¿ from the cell, or simply let
28	out to talk to the officer. W6 said he recalled that the
29	officers went in to extract V1 from his cell because he had
30	been either banging on the door or screaming at the deputies.

2	I tried to verify if this was something W6 was watching
3	through the reflection in the window of the adjacent cell, but he
4	said this was actually something he could see just by looking out of
5	his cell door. He described three deputies going into V1
6	cell, handcuffing him, and bringing him out into the common area. V1
7	was screaming at the deputies as they began to lead him over
8	toward the dorm exit. All of a sudden V1 was down on the
9	floor near the officer¿s station. W6 did not know if V1
10	fell down or was thrown down by the deputies, but the next
11	thing he saw was a deputy come in and start to stomp on V1
12	head.
13	
14	Although W6 did not know who this deputy was at the time, he
15	said he now knew the deputy who stomped on V1 head was
16	¿Deputy Tri¿ (O1 Tri). W6 described how he saw O1 Tri¿s boot
17	come down and strike V1 in the head, and then talked about
18	actually seeing V1 head split open and blood start gushing
19	out all over the floor.
20	
21	W6 again told me he thought V1 was handcuffed, with
22	his hands behind his back. He did not know how V1 came to be
23	lying on the floor, but said he was lying on his stomach, with his
24	face toward the ground. W6 estimated V1 may have
25	been lying on the ground for approximately a minute when O1 Tri came
26	running in. During that minute that V1 was lying on the
27	floor, W6 just remembered him lying there and the deputies
28	not doing anything to him. W6 noticed the door to the dorm
29	opening, a deputy coming in the unit, and the boot coming down on V1
30	head. Again, W6 referenced not knowing it was 01
OFFICER'S	

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1	Tri at the time, but said he found out later by talking to others,
2	including other inmates and deputies, that O1 Tri was the deputy who
3	stomped his boot down on V1 head.
4	
5	W6 told me he could only see from approximately O1 Tri¿s knee
6	down to the floor when he came running into the unit. W6
7	said he was upset because it seemed the other deputies were ¿just
8	standing there, letting him do it.¿ From what he remembered, W6
9	estimated O1 Tri struck V1 in the head approximately
10	4-5 times with the heel of his boot. Then, O4 Cortes grabbed O1 Tri
11	in an effort to get him to stop kicking V1 in the head.
12	
13	W6 stated he actually liked O1 Tri, has never had any problems
14	with him, and recalled him being the first deputy he met upon being
15	jailed approximately 5 years ago. When asked about O3 Bragg, W6
16	said he has the nickname of ¿By the Book Bragg; and described
17	him as ¿fair¿. W6 told me O3 Bragg disciplined him in the
18	past for reasons he thought were unnecessary, but again described him
19	as being fair.
20	
21	I asked W6 if it looked as if V1 was resisting in any
22	way when he was lying down on the ground before O1 Tri came in. W6
23	said he did not remember what V1 was doing when he
24	was on the ground, but also said ¿I don¿t know how much you can
25	resist when you; re handcuffed like that. I mean you can roll around,
26	but you ain¿t gonna do much.¿

28	When I then asked if it looked as if V1 was making an attempt
29	to bite one of the deputies, W6 said he did not know, but
30	also said he there was no one close enough to V1 for him to

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	try and bite. Due to information from prior investigation, I asked
2	W6 if it ever looked like V1 hands had ever come
3	out of the handcuffs and he was trying to grab one of the deputies;
4	legs. W6 said he never saw V1 hands come out of
5	the handcuffs or try to grab any of the deputies. Also from prior
6	investigation into this case, I asked W6 if he ever noticed
7	one of the deputies kneeling next to V1 and punching him in
8	the side. W6 said he has seen that in other situations, but
9	he did not see that in this incident.

11	W6 again talked about how he saw the pool of blood near V1
12	head after his head split open. Although W6 could
13	not see the actual injury, he described the blood as possibly coming
14	from an area near the top of, and toward the back of V1
15	head. He could hear V1 screaming during this time and he
16	knew V1 was hurt. W6 said the officer;s may have
17	been yelling at V1 but also said he did not really know or
18	remember for sure.
19	
20	After O1 Tri was pulled away from V1 he quickly walked out of
21	the unit. W6 described how he could see the light coming in
22	from the unit door being opened and O1 Tri¿s boots walking out of the
23	dorm.

25	Using photographs I had previously printed, I showed W6 a
26	photograph of O2 Murillo and asked if he knew who it was. W6
27	described O2 Murillo as being a newer officer, but could not remember
28	his name and did not think he was there on the night of this
29	incident. W6 thought O2 Murillo worked during the day, in
30	the 5A unit, but he did not think he was there that night. I also

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1	showed W6 previously printed photographs of O1 Tri and O3
2	Bragg, whom he was able to properly identify by name.

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1	I ended my contact with W6 For further information on W6
2	statement, refer to the attached audio recording.

4	In continuing with the investigation, I identified another subject who
5	was in custody at the time of this incident and may be able to
6	provide further information. This subject was identified as
7	(W7 but he was no longer in custody for any
8	matters.
9	I made contact with
10	W7 who agreed to come to Sheriff;s Headquarters to provide a
11	statement.
12	
13	On 04/26/16 at approximately 0955 hours, W7 came to Sheriff¿s
14	Headquarters where he provided the following recorded statement.
15	
16	STATEMENT OF WITNESS 7 :
17	
18	I had previously let W7 know what it was I wanted to speak with
19	him about, but also now explained to him the reason for my contact.
20	At first, W7 thought I was speaking of an incident occurring in
21	housing unit 7A. We spoke about W7 various housing units
22	while he was in custody, but this did not seem to clear up the
23	confusion. To further assist with the location of the incident and
24	refresh W7 memory, I showed him a picture I had previously
25	printed out of O3 Bragg. W7 instantly recognized O3 Bragg in
26	the photo as the officer who was involved in the incident he was
27	speaking of, but also said O3 Bragg was the deputy in charge of the

I pulled out a diagram of the 5th floor of the Main Jail,  10 which included a diagram of the 5A housing unit. W7 verified  11 he was housed in either cell 45 or 43, which would have been on the  12 other side of the unit from where this incident occurred. However,  13 he was able to see what happened by using the reflection in the

16 W7 told me it had come time for everyone to lock down in their
17 cells. V1 was being verbally uncooperative with O3 Bragg at
18 that time. To stop the situation, O3 Bragg attempted to physically
19 restrain V1 which W7 described as ¿doing his job¿, but
20 V1 continued to resist. Due to this, O3 Bragg called for
21 assistance from other deputies, who came running in to help. W7
22 said one of the officers who came in to help was wearing
23 glasses. Although he could not exactly recall that officer; name,
24 W7 thought it was either ¿Lee or Tran¿, finally settling on the
25 name ¿Tran¿ (identified later in the interview as O1 Tri). W7
26 said this deputy came running in and used his ¿steel toe¿ boot to
27 kick the inmate in the head.
28
29 I stopped W7 to ask a few questions, including whether or not he
30 saw V1 come into the unit. W7 said he did not see V1

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1	when he originally came into the dorm, but was certain he had
2	not been there very long. W7 thought V1 may have been
	housed in either cell 7 or cell 9 when he came in. W7 never
4	heard V1 yelling at O3 Bragg from him cell prior to the
5	incident actually occurring, but also said O3 Bragg would not
6	normally acknowledge someone who was yelling at him from their
7	cell.
8	
9	I also asked W7 if he knew how V1 came to be out of his
10	cell in the first place. W7 thought it all started over a
11	problem V1 was having during the evening pill call, where he
12	did not get his required medication, therefore he was yelling at O3
13	Bragg about this. When O3 Bragg told V1 to lock down, V1
14	started to refuse to go back to his cell. At one point W7
15	heard V1 yell to O3 Bragg, ¿I need my fucking
16	medication!¿ Eventually, 03 Bragg moved up and restrained V1
17	to a point where W7 felt O3 Bragg was in control and V1
18	was well restrained. W7 stated, ¿Bragg restrained him good
19	enough. The other guy had no reason to do that.¿
20	
21	W7 said 03 Bragg had restrained V1 by taking him to the
22	ground, face down, with O3 Bragg almost kneeling on him to control
23	his movements and attempting to handcuff him. Out of nowhere, O1 Tri
24	came in and ¿cracked¿ V1 head as he was lying on the
25	ground. One or two deputies actually came running in, but O1 Tri was
26	the first deputy to come in. Once O1 Tri kicked V1 O3 Bragg
27	stopped and yelled ¿Hey; toward O1 Tri. W7 described what O1
28	Tri did as being ¿bad¿ and said ¿he didn¿t have to do that¿.
29	
30	To assist with locating where W7 was saying this altercation
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1	took place, I made a drawing of an area within the 5A housing unit.
2	While making this drawing, I happened to make a comment about the
3	location W7 was telling me V1 and O3 Bragg ¿got into
4	it¿. W7 quickly corrected me to say that V1 was not
5	fighting with O3 Bragg in any way, more so just telling O3 Bragg to
6	get off of him because he was already restrained.
7	
8	I continued with the drawing, including trying to clarify the
9	direction V1 had been lying on the floor. W7 was able
10	to tell me V1 was lying with his head closest to the cell
11	doors and his feet pointing in the direction of the hallway leading
12	into the unit. That;s when O1 Tri came running in and kicked V1
13	right in the head. W7 demonstrated that O1 Tri¿s
14	motions were not like a kicking type motion, but more of a straight
15	down stomping motion right onto the top of V1 head. W7
16	thought O1 Tri may have stomped V1 with his foot two
17	times, but said he only used his foot and did not punch him with his
18	hand at any time. O1 Tri also made no attempt to get down and help
19	O3 Bragg restrain or handcuff V1 in any way.
20	
21	W7 stated he did not hear 03 Bragg yelling anything other than
22	to O1 Tri after O1 Tri stomped V1 in the head. However, he
23	noticed O1 Tri stop after O3 Bragg yelled at him and look down at V1
24	as if ¿oh man, I fucked up¿. Ol Tri froze for a minute and
25	O3 Bragg continued to try and restrain V1 Soon thereafter
26	more help arrived and they were able to control V1
27	
28	W7 told me O1 Tri always seemed to take care of him and some of
29	the other inmates. He described him and some of the other inmates
30	being surprised by O1 Tri¿s actions against V1 W7 did
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1	
	not think O1 Tri was a bad guy and said O1 Tri was ¿cool¿ most of the
	time.
3	
	W7 said V1 looked to be ¿messed up¿ after being stomped
	in the head. W7 knew V1 was injured and said he could
	see blood coming from his head and pooling on the floor. W7
7	could see blood on V1 face after the deputies stood him up
8	and as they were leading him out of the dorm. While being led out of
9	the dorm, V1 was yelling obscenities back at the deputies,
10	but W7 never saw him return to the dorm after that.
11	
12	Throughout this incident, W7 never saw any of the other
13	deputies; strike, kick, or punch V1 in any way. He stated,
14	¿Only person I seen use excessive force was that officer. If the
15	other guys came in, they were probably just helping Bragg. Ya know.
16	Cause what are they gonna do when they already come and his head;s
17	leaking? Ya know, like they; re not gonna try to use excessive force
18	I think.¿
19	
20	I pointed out that W7 kept using the term ¿excessive force¿ and
21	asked what it was that he thought made the force excessive. W7
22	said he thought an officer wouldn;t just kick someone in the head if
23	another officer was already restraining that person on the floor.
24	When I asked W7 if he thought O1 Tri was trying to help O3
25	Bragg or hurt V1 he said he never thought O1 Tri was a bad
26	officer, he just thought he ¿messed up¿ in this incident and ¿it
27	happened wrong:. W7 did not know if O1 Tri knew it at the
28	time, but he also thought O1 Tri may have realized he over reacted to
29	the situation because everyone started to yell at him right after the
30	incident happened. W7 felt O1 Tri only stopped stomping on V1
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1	because 03 Bragg had yelled at him and W7 didn¿t know
2	what would have happened if O3 Bragg had not said anything to O1
3	Tri.
4	
5	I specifically asked W7 if he thought V1 was already
6	handcuffed when O1 Tri came in and stomped on his head. W7
7	said he thought V1 was already cuffed when O1 Tri came up to
8	him. He did not see V1 make any attempts to reach out and
9	grab O1 Tri¿s legs and did not think there was any way V1
10	could have positioned himself to try and bite O1 Tri. W7 did
11	not see V1 arms ever waving about and did not see O1 Tri
12	ever fall to his knees as a result of any V1 actions.
13	
14	I showed W7 a previously printed photograph of O2 Murillo to see
15	if he would recognize him. W7 visually recognized O2 Murillo
16	and described him as an officer who would use force on inmates, but
17	he did not know 02 Murillo¿s name. I next showed W7 a
18	previously printed photograph of O1 Tri. W7 immediately
19	stated, ¿That¿s the man. That¿s the man right there that used
20	excessive force that night.; W7 followed this by saying he
21	thought 02 Murillo was also there on the night of this incident.
22	Suddenly, W7 seemed to remember O1 Tri¿s last name as being
23	¿Tri¿.
24	
25	During my interview with W7 he made multiple references to O3
26	Bragg size. Now, as we spoke, he described O3 Bragg as being ¿the
27	most humble C.O. (Corrections Officer); and said he was very
28	respectful. W7 thought V1 was somewhere around 130
29	pounds and agreed when I described O3 Bragg as being ¿significantly
30	bigger; than V1 W7 told me O3 Bragg had V1
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1	restrained on the ground before O1 Tri came into the dorm and he had
2	no problems getting V1 down to the ground.
3	
4	W7 and I spoke for a while about O1 Tri and O3 Bragg¿s
5	personalities. He continually described O3 Bragg as being ¿fair¿ and
6	said most inmates appreciated the way he would run the dorm. O1 Tri
7	would often joke around with inmates, but clarified that it did not
8	seem disrespectful to them.
9	
10	Recalling that W7 had previously told me he moved in and out of
11	numerous dorms while being housed at the Main Jail, I asked if it was
12	customary for an officer to want to search an inmate; s personal
13	property when he was housed into a new dorm. W7 agreed that it
14	was normal for the dorm officer to search through an inmate;s bag of
15	property before that property was allowed to go into the cell with
16	the inmate. W7 also agreed that it would be normal for an
17	inmate to go into his cell and leave his property behind so the
18	deputy could search it at a later time if he was busy and could not
19	do it right away.
20	
21	Sergeant Singleton began to ask W7 a few questions, including
22	having him describe how he could see the incident through the
23	reflection in a cell door. W7 clarified that it actually
24	wasn;t a cell door, but a window in the unit that looks out toward
25	Downtown San Jose. W7 talked about how the window actually has
26	a reflective covering which, when dark as it was at the time of the
27	incident, makes it very easy to see things going on in the unit
28	through the reflection in the window. Sergeant Singleton also asked
29	how far apart V1 and O3 Bragg were at the beginning of their
30	argument and how long it took O3 Bragg to approach V1 and
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1 begin to physically restrain him. W7 said O3 Bragg and V1 2 were approximately 10-12 feet apart at the beginning of the 3 argument, but that it only lasted approximately 10 seconds before O3

4 Bragg approached V1 and began to restrain him.	
5	
6 W7 reiterated that O3 Bragg already had V1 on the	
7 ground, with a knee on his back, attempting to get him into handcuff	s
8 when O1 Tri came in and kicked V1 in the head. W7 the	n
9 said O3 Bragg already had V1 in handcuffs when O1 Tri came i	n
10 and kicked him in the head. Sergeant Singleton immediately tried to	
11 get clarification on this point. W7 told us he ¿assumed¿ V1	
12 was in handcuffs because he had stopped moving and strugglin	g
13 with O3 Bragg and the other officers. Although he could not recall	
14 what foot O1 Tri used. W7 verified he could actually see O1 Tr	i
15 stomp V1 on the head two times with his boot while V1	
16 was on the floor.	
17	
18 We spoke for a while longer concerning this incident. However, W7	
19 began to talk about an unrelated incident in which he felt he	
20 may also be a victim of a potential use of force incident. In order	
21 to keep the two incidents separate and avoid confusion in the	
22 information W7 was providing, we concluded our conversation	
23 concerning this incident and began a separate recording for the	
24 potential new case. W7 did not provide any further information on	
25 this incident from that point on and we did not discuss this case an	У
26 further.

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1	INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
2	
3	Sergeant Quinonez and I next contacted Witness Inmate
4	(W4 who provided the following recorded statement.
5	
6	STATEMENT OF WITNESS 4 :
7	
8	After initially explaining why we were there to talk to him, W4
9	recognized we wanted to talk about the incident that occurred
10	in unit 5A with V1 approximately 3 weeks earlier. When I
11	asked W4 what he had witnessed, he stated "He was restrained,
12	he was handcuffed, and then he was assaulted I guess by the others
13	that came in. Ya know, they beat him up pretty bad."
14	
15	W4 went on to say he had been housed in unit 5A since
16	05/18/13, and was housed in cell 28 at the time of the incident. W4
17	recognized O3 Bragg as the normal deputy in charge of the
18	unit and described him as the deputy initially involved in the
19	incident with V1 At the time of the incident, W4
20	was standing in his cell, watching the unit television by looking out
21	of the window of his cell. W4 was able to see V1 and
22	O3 Bragg arguing about some property that was on the floor of the
23	unit. W4 knew V1 had been newly housed in the unit
24	earlier in the day and wanted to retrieve his property. During the
25	argument, V1 had motioned to his property, and this is why W4
26	assumed they were arguing about the property. Then, the
27	argument turned into struggle between V1 and O3 Bragg. O3
28	Bragg was able to take V1 down to the ground and W4
	thought the whole incident was over.
30	
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1 W4 said this incident took place after the nightly Program
2 time. W4 did not see any type of conversation or altercation
3 between O3 Bragg and V1 during Program time earlier in the
4 evening. Although W4 saw V1 property on the floor
5 of the unit, he did not see O3 Bragg ever go through it or search it
6 for contraband. When V1 came out of his cell to get the
7 property, W4 could clearly see they were arguing, but he
8 could not hear what they were saying because it is normally so loud
9 in the unit. O3 Bragg came up to V1 and was able to take him
10 to the ground.
11
12 W4 said O3 Bragg was able to take V1 to the ground and
13 gain control over him pretty easily. He described O3 Bragg as being
14 a big man and said V1 did not put up much resistance to O3
15 Bragg. I asked W4 if he saw O3 Bragg take V1 to the
16 ground, or if V1 went down to the ground on his own. He said
17 O3 Bragg had actually approached V1 and grabbed him up around
18 the neck area. At that point, V1 did not offer much
19 resistance and just kind of went down to the ground, where O3 Bragg
20 was able to handcuff him "pretty easily".
21
22 I verified with W4 that he saw both of V1 hands in
23 handcuffs. He said he had a pretty good view of the incident as it
24 happened. Once V1 was on the ground, O3 Bragg was able grab
25 one of his hands, put it behind him, and place it in handcuffs. O3
26 Bragg then grabbed V1 other hand, controlled it, and placed
27 it in handcuffs.
28
29 W4 told me he saw V1 lying on the unit floor, in front
30 of the door to the sundeck. He could not see O3 Bragg's head during
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1	the struggle, but could see that he was on top of V1
2	straddling him. V1 was "moving a little bit" and seemed to
3	be trying to resist, but W4 said O3 Bragg was clearly in
4	control.
5	
6	Once O3 Bragg was able to restrain V1 in handcuffs, W4
7	noticed two additional deputies come running into the unit. W4
8	identified one of the deputies as O1 Tri and said, "He came
9	in and he just started going at dude pretty rough, ya know. He just
10	busted dude's head up, just kicking him with a boot, stomping him
11	out. Jumping up on his head and everything."
12	
13	I asked W4 if he knew the difference between a "stomp" and a
14	"kick". W4 said he did and demonstrated each motion. To
15	clarify, I asked if a "stomp" would be described as someone using the
16	bottom of their shoe on something and if a "kick" would be with the
17	top or toe of the shoe. W4 agreed with this description, and
18	again demonstrated each motion. To describe O1 Tri's actions against
19	V1 on the night of this incident, W4 said O1 Tri used

24	W4 told us he did not see any blood on the floor or on V1
25	prior to 01 Tri and the other deputies running into the unit.

27	with him. W4 could not see what this deputy was doing, but
28	described him as just being off to V1 side. W4
29	thought this other deputy had pulled something from his belt and
30	struck V1 in the side a couple of times, but he did not have
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1	further information or a reason as to why the deputy did this because
	it appeared O3 Bragg had control of V1 W4 described
	V1 as still moving around on the ground a little bit, but
	also said it looked as if he was just trying to protect his head and
	face from getting hit again.

	After O1 Tri had kicked and stomped V1 a couple of times, W4
8	noticed blood starting to come from V1 head. V1
9	stopped moving around and did not appear as if he was
10	responding any more. I asked W4 if V1 was "limp" or
11	if he just stopped moving. W4 said it appeared as if V1
12	was still alert, but that he had stopped moving in hopes "the
13	beating would stop". Although W4 could not be sure who it
14	was, he described hearing someone yelling "stop moving" as the
15	deputies were dealing with V1 W4 noticed a deputy
16	come and try to stop O1 Tri from stomping and kicking V1 by
17	stepping between them, and O1 Tri stopped. W4 seemed
18	surprised to see another deputy step and to assist V1 When
19	I asked W4 why he thought the other deputy came up to stop O1
20	Tri, he stated, "Because he seen it for what it was. He was killing
21	the guy, ya know."
22	
23	Once O1 Tri has stopped kicking V1 the other deputies were
24	trying to get V1 up off of the ground. However, V1
25	appeared to be injured and had a hard time getting up. Once he was
26	up off of the floor, the deputies were trying to get V1 to
27	walk out of the unit, but he couldn't, so they just drug him away.
28	
29	I asked W4 if he ever noticed O1 Tri losing his balance or
30	falling to the floor during this incident. W4 said he did
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1	see O1 Tri "slide" into V1 upon initially coming in to the
	unit. He described it as if O1 Tri was "sliding into third base" and
3	hitting V1 on the head with his elbow at the same time. O1
4	Tri was able to slide to a stop and stood up. This is when O1 Tri
5	started kicking and stomping V1 in the head.
6	
7	W4 did not see O1 Tri ever strike V1 with either of
8	his knees. He felt it could have been possible 01 Tri hit V1
9	with his knee when he slid into him, but said it all happened so fast
10	that he could not be sure. Once O1 Tri got back up to his feet after
11	his initial slide, W4 did not see him ever drop back down to
12	his knees or strike V1 with his knee. W4 also told
13	us he never witnessed O1 Tri striking V1 with either of his
14	hands during the incident. Although he could not be sure if V1
15	was bleeding or not because of the angle of his view, W4
16	did not remember seeing any blood coming from V1
17	head until after O1 Tri started kicking and stomping him.
18	
19	I asked W4 about the physical altercation between O3 Bragg and
20	V1 prior to the other deputies running in. W4 said
21	he did not have a problem with any of that part of the altercation
22	and described it as being "normal". He recognized the deputies have
23	been trained to deal with subjects who may not be cooperating and
24	said an inmate will normally just "turn around and cuff up" to avoid
25	any drama. W4 felt V1 had been subdued prior to O1
26	Tri and the other deputies arriving and again told us he thought the
27	entire incident was over. Everything after that point surprised W4
28	and he described being "blown away" by what happened, stating
29	the incident "just got out of hand".
30	
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1	W4 stated he did not see V1 posing any type of threat
2	to O1 Tri because he had already been subdued and handcuffed. W4
3	felt that, as a secondary responder, O1 Tri would "see it for
4	what it is; as he's running in. With O3 Bragg having V1
5	under control, W4 thought O1 Tri "took it on his own, that I
6	see, to try and kill this guy. I saw this guy getting killed, ya
7	know what I mean. That; s what I saw.;
8	
9	I asked W4 if there was any chance O3 Bragg may have lost
10	control of one of V1 hands as O1 Tri was running up. W4
11	said there was no way this would have happened because V1
12	was handcuffed, subdued, and ¿just done¿ with the fight. V1
13	felt the deputies should have just been able to get V1
14	up off of the floor and take him wherever they wanted to take
15	him. W4 did not feel there was any way V1 could have
16	reached out and grabbed either of O1 Tri¿s legs during the struggle,
17	causing him to lose his balance or fall down. Finally, W4
18	did not think it was possible for V1 to be in a position to
19	bite O1 Tri, or even try to bring O1 Tri closer to him in an effort
20	to bite him. W4 said V1 was handcuffed the whole
21	time and his hands were never in a position to grab anyone who came
22	running in.

24	W4 told me he has not discussed this incident with anyone else
25	in the unit. The information he provided was what he had witnessed
26	during this incident only, and not things he had heard from anyone
27	else. W4 felt as if everyone in the unit was afraid to talk
28	about what had occurred, and even more afraid to come forward with
29	what they had seen because of the intimidation and possible
30	repercussions by O1 Tri. Throughout life, W4 estimated he
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1	has done approximately 20 years in custody. However, he described
	this as being ¿the worst thing I¿ve ever seen¿ when referring to what
	had happened to V1 W4 later said, ¿I just don¿t

	happened was wrong. He also said he would hope that someone would
	come forward and tell his family if the same thing were to happen to

16	Sergeant Quinonez and I spoke to W4 for a while to clarify
17	some of the information and the angle he may have had from his cell.
18	Prior to ending our contact with W4 I asked how he would
19	have felt if an inmate who was verbally confronting a deputy would
20	have just been subdued and taken to a cell without further incident.
21	W4 said he would think this was normal and he would not feel
22	he had to provide any statement for it. He would have considered it
23	a regular thing and no one would have even talked to him about it
24	because there was nothing wrong. W4 new this was not a
25	normal incident and felt he had to come forward and tell the
26	investigators what had happened because it was not acceptable. W4
27	has provided statements on assaults he has witnessed in the
28	past, but said it has been approximately 10 years. He always
29	provided a full statement on what he witnessed and felt he needed to

2	W4 did not feel V1 could have protected himself from
3	Ol Tri¿s assault. His hands had already been secured behind his back
4	and he was in a vulnerable stated. It; s natural for a person to want
5	to protect his head from attack. V1 was unable to do
6	anything but move his head around in an effort to avoid injury. V1
7	was ¿exposed¿ during the incident and W4 did not feel
8	V1 had any way to protect himself, other than just lying
9	there and hoping it would stop.
10	
11	INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
12	
13	Sergeant Quinonez and I concluded our contact with W4 without
14	any further information. At that time, we were unable to contact any
15	further inmates who witnessed the incident. All of the statements
16	provided by the witness inmates were audio recorded. I was able to
17	place the audio recordings onto Compact Discs (CD's) and submitted
18	them as attachments to this report.
19	
20	Upon returning to Sheriff's Headquarters, I was able to locate a map
21	depicting the floor plan for the 5th floor of the Main Jail. The map
22	included one page depicting the bottom tier of the floor and one page
23	depicting the top tier of the floor. I printed the two pages and
24	labeled unit 5A, 5B, and 5C. I then labeled the cells, 1 thru 48, in
25	unit 5A as they correspond to the cells on the 5th floor of the Main
26	Jail, with the odd numbered cells on the bottom tier and the even
27	numbered cells on the top tier of the unit.
28	
29	Using these maps, containing the numbered cells, I was able to see the
30	views each of the inmate witnesses would have had while looking out
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1	of their cells during this incident. W2 stated he was
2	housed in cell 24 at the time of this incident. From the map, I
3	could see a person looking out of the window in cell 24 would have
4	had a mostly unobstructed view through the main area of the unit and
5	down the hallway leading to the entry/exit door, therefore giving him
6	a clear view of this incident.
7	
8	W3 stated he was in cell 14 at the time of this incident.
9	From the map, I could see a person looking out of the window in cell
10	14 would have been able to look down the stairs and have a mostly
11	unobstructed view of entrance to the hallway leading to the
12	entry/exit door, therefore having a view of the incident as it took
13	place at the hallway entrance and near the door leading onto the
14	sundeck.
15	
16	W4 stated he was in cell 28 at the time of this incident.
17	From the map, I could see a person looking out of the window in cell
18	28 would have been able to look through the main area to the unit,
19	over the officer's desk, and have a mostly unobstructed view of the
20	hallway entrance and the door leading to the sundeck.
21	
22	I made color copies of the two maps depicting the 5th floor of the
23	Main Jail, which included the bottom and top tiers of the unit, cell
24	numbers, and the location of this incident. I submitted the two
25	copies as attachments to this report.
26	
27	I later contacted Sergeant Leon of the Sheriff's Crime Scene
28	Investigations Unit (CSI) and requested to have a CSI detective take
29	a series of photographs of the 5th floor at the Main Jail, including
30	the views W2 W3 and W4 would have had as
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1 they looked out of the windows in their cells. On 01/14/14, CSI
2 Detective Tarazi went to the 5th floor of the Main Jail and was able
3 to take a series of digital photographs showing the view each witness
4 inmate would have had of this incident. From the photographs, it
5 appears possible each of the witness inmates may have had a mostly
6 unobstructed view of the incident as it happened. I was provided
7 with a CD containing a copy of these photographs. See CSI Detective
8 Tarazi's supplemental report for further information.
9
10 On $10/24/13$ at approximately 1840 hours, Sergeant Quinonez and I met
11 with Corrections Deputy Cortes in the Sheriff's Headquarters third
12 floor interview room. Deputy Cortes had been named as one of the
13 deputies who had come in at the end of the struggle and escorted V1 $$
14 out of unit 5A for medical assistance. Deputy Cortes
15 provided the following recorded statement.
16
17 STATEMENT OF OTHER PARTY 4 DEPUTY MIGUEL CORTES:
18
19 I advised O4 Cortes of the reason for my contact with him and he
20 stated he remembered the incident. O4 Cortes stated he was assigned
21 to housing unit 4C at the Main Jail, but heard the call for
22 assistance out of unit 5A. He responded to unit 5A, which required
23 him taking the elevator from the fourth floor to the fifth floor.
24 Upon entering unit 5A, O4 Cortes saw deputies trying to restrain V1
25 O4 Cortes ran up and placed his right knee on V1
26 left shoulder to pin him down to the floor. V1 was
27 eventually secured with handcuffs. O4 Cortes assisted in getting V1
up to his feet and escorted him to the second floor medical
29 unit for treatment.
30

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1	As they were in route from the fifth floor to the second floor, 04
2	Cortes noticed V1 was bleeding from the top of the head.
3	Using paper napkins, O4 Cortes tried to apply pressure to the top of
4	V1 head to slow the bleeding. Once on the second floor, O4
5	Cortes turned V1 over to the nursing staff so they could
6	treat him.
7	
8	O4 Cortes told me he did not notice the injuries V1 had or
9	exactly where the blood was coming from. Upon contact with V1
10	he did not have any type of bandages or towels covering his
11	wounds, so 04 Cortes took it upon himself to begin medical treatment.
12	
13	
14	At the time of the incident, O4 Cortes did not know which deputy was
15	assigned to work housing unit 5A. He responded to the call for
16	assistance as he would normally do on any emergency call. As O4
17	Cortes responded, Deputy Tempra (O5 Tempra) responded from the fourth
18	floor and arrived on scene with him. Upon entering unit 5A, 04
19	Cortes saw V1 lying on the floor in front of the sundeck
20	door. 04 Cortes thought V1 was on his right side, rolling
21	around from side to side, with deputies around him, trying to
22	restrain him. O4 Cortes could not remember which deputies were
23	involved in the struggle with V1 at that time. As O4 Cortes
24	ran up to assist the deputies, he noticed V1 was already
25	bleeding from the head area. V1 was not yet secured in
26	handcuffs and was actively resisting the deputies. 04 Cortes pushed
27	his knee onto V1 left side to pin him face down onto the
28	floor and they were able to place V1 into handcuffs to secure
29	him. At the time, O4 Cortes did not know who placed the handcuffs on
30	V1 but later learned it was O3 Bragg.
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1	
2	04 Cortes could not recall 03 Bragg's exact position in relation to V1
3	when he ran into the room. O4 Cortes remembered seeing O2
4	Murillo engaged in the struggle with V1 but could not recall
5	where he was in relation to V1 or what he was doing. O4
6	Cortes also remembered seeing O1 Tri at the scene, but could not
7	recall where he was or what he was doing.
8	
9	04 Cortes estimated it only took approximately 10 - 15 seconds from
10	the time he arrived until they were able to secure V1 in
11	handcuffs. V1 resisted the entire time, but they were able
12	to use enough force to secure his hands and end the struggle. Once
13	V1 was in handcuffs, O4 Cortes assisted in picking him up to
14	his feet. V1 did not resist the deputies' efforts to lift
15	him up off of the ground, and O4 Cortes stated V1 did not
16	lose consciousness at any time after he arrived on scene.
17	
18	O4 Cortes told us he never verbally told V1 to get up off of
19	the floor, and never heard anyone else say anything similar to that.
20	O4 Cortes also could not remember hearing V1 or the other
21	deputies yelling anything as he was running in to assist.
22	
23	O4 Cortes described getting V1 up off of the floor and using
24	the napkins to apply pressure to his injured head. He stated he was
25	on V1 left side as they walked out of the unit, but he
26	could not remember who was on V1 right side. Once out of
27	the unit, they escorted V1 into the elevator and down to the
28	second floor. V1 did not complain of any pain or injuries as
29	they went down to the second floor and did not resist after they
30	assisted him up off of the floor.
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1	
2	O4 Cortes had heard the incident originally started because V1
3	had a problem with 03 Bragg going through his property. 04 Cortes
4	described it as being pretty standard for a deputy to search an
5	inmate's property when they are housed in a new unit, but for some
6	reason V1 had a problem with it.
7	
8	O4 Cortes stated he never witnessed any of the deputies using their
9	fist or knees to strike V1 He never witnessed any of the
10	deputies using any of the weapons from their duty belts against V1
11	and never saw anyone stomp or kick V1 Sergeant
12	Quinonez asked O4 Cortes if he was familiar with the term "tapping
13	out" as used in the jail setting. O4 Cortes described it as a deputy
14	intervening in a possible excessive use of force situation, where
15	another deputy may be using too much force against an inmate. 04
16	Cortes could not remember if he tapped any of the other deputies out
17	during this incident, and said he was not tapped out by another
18	deputy because he did not use any force on V1 during the
19	struggle.
20	
21	We attempted to have O4 Cortes describe again what he saw when he came
22	into the unit to see if he could remember anything he had not
23	previously stated, but the information he provided was similar to
24	what he initially stated.
25	
26	INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
27	
28	Sergeant Quinonez and I ended our contact with O4 Cortes without any
29	further information. O4 Cortes returned to the Main Jail for his
30	shift. Soon thereafter, Deputy Tempra arrived at Sheriff's
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	JI
1	Headquarters and provided the following recorded statement.
2	
3	STATEMENT OF OTHER PARTY 5 DEPUTY TEMPRA:
4	
5	O5 Tempra knew we wanted to talk with him regarding the incident in
6	unit 5A with V1 O5 Tempra stated he had heard the emergency
7	call come over the radio after O3 Bragg had pushed his button. He
8	and O4 Cortes responded to the fifth floor and as they came running
9	into the unit, O5 Tempra saw a group of deputies in a struggle with
10	V1 on the floor. O5 Tempra described getting "tunnel vision"
11	as he ran in, but noticed V1 right arm was unsecured so he
12	went to try and grab it.
13	
14	O5 Tempra described V1 being on his stomach, on the floor,
15	with his head pointing in toward the main portion of the unit. 05
16	Tempra knelt down onto the floor next to V1 and tried to grab
17	his arm. Initially, V1 was able to pull his right arm away
18	from O5 Tempra, but in a second attempt to grab it, O5 Tempra was
19	able to secure V1 right arm behind his back to be
20	handcuffed. Before controlling V1 right arm, O5 Tempra
21	described the arm as being free, and V1 was "swinging it
22	around". O5 Tempra knew there was a deputy on the floor right next
23	to him as he was trying to secure V1 right arm, but he did
24	not know who it was. O5 Tempra knew the deputy was struggling with
25	V1 but he could not tell what the deputy was struggling
26	with.
27	
28	O5 Tempra could not recall the identity of any of the other deputies
29	involved in the struggle as he ran in to help. V1 appeared
30	conscious and bleeding from the facial area, but 05 Tempra did not
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1	know the exact location V1 was bleeding from or why.
2	
3	O5 Tempra described someone coming in to take over for him and assist
4	in getting V1 up off the ground. The deputies escorted V1
5	out of the unit and O5 Tempra noticed a pool of blood on the
6	floor. V1 did not say anything as he was escorted out of the
7	unit. He was placed in an interview room just outside of the unit,
8	but was immediately taken to the second floor medical unit once
9	deputies noticed the extent of his injuries.
10	
11	O5 Tempra recalled seeing V1 right hand balled up in a fist
12	as he was trying to gain control of his right hand. O5 Tempra said
13	V1 did not strike anyone with his fist, but his arm was
14	swinging about and difficult to gain control of. O5 Tempra estimated
15	it only took him a few seconds to gain control of V1 right
16	arm and place it behind his back.
17	
18	Other than reading the reports, O5 Tempra did not know why the
19	incident in unit 5A started on that night. He had not spoken to O3
20	Bragg about the incident and did not know how V1 sustained
21	his injuries. Since the incident, V1 has been housed in O5
22	Tempra's unit on the fourth floor and O5 Tempra described him as
23	physically appearing much better than he did on that particular
24	night, after the struggle. V1 has not talked with O5 Tempra
25	about what happened on the night of the incident.
26	
27	Sergeant Quinonez asked O5 Tempra about his positioning upon making
28	contact with V1 O5 Tempra described it as being on the
29	floor next to V1 to try and gain control of his arm. 05
30	Tempra described being "tapped out" by another deputy after gaining
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1	control of V1 right arm, but said this meant he was simply
2	relieved by someone else who could assist in getting V1 up
3	off of the floor. O5 Tempra did not "tap out", or relieve any of the
4	other deputies upon his contact with V1
5	
6	When asked, 05 Tempra did not know how V1 sustained the
7	injuries to his face and head.
8	
9	INVESTIGATION COTINUED:
10	
11	We concluded our contact with O5 Tempra without any further
12	information. He returned to the Main Jail for his scheduled shift.
13	
14	
15	On 01/07/14 at approximately 1430 hours, I was able to make telephone
16	contact with (W5 W5 was in
17	custody and housed in unit 5A at the time of this incident. However,
18	he had since been released from custody. Upon contacting W5
19	F
20	
	STATEMENT OF WITNESS 5 :
22	
	I advised W5 of the reason for my call and asked if he could
	provide any further information. W5 stated he did not feel
	O3 Bragg had done anything wrong during the verbal confrontation with
	V1 but he did not see anything that happened after 03 Bragg
	pushed V1 W5 told me V1 instigated the
	whole incident and O3 Bragg only reacted to what V1 did. W5
29	
	in the past and felt O3 Bragg reacted in the same manner any other
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	<u></u>
1	deputy would have.
2	
3	W5 went on to tell me he did not see what O1 Tri did when he
4	arrived on scene. Once O3 Bragg had approached V1 and the
5	physical portion of the incident started, W5 could not see
6	anything that happened after they all fell to the ground. W5
7	had heard from some of the other inmates in the unit what
8	had happened after O1 Tri and the other deputies arrived on scene,
9	but he could not speak to that because he did not see it for himself.
10	
11	
12	W5 told me he could see the altercation between O3 Bragg and
13	V1 from his cell, but he could not hear what they were
14	saying. He thought it looked as if O3 Bragg and V1 were
15	tense and it appeared as if something was going to happen, but he did
16	not know what started the whole argument. W5 described V1
17	as getting "heated" and "instigated", but W5 also
18	thought O3 Bragg was able to step up and take care of it before it
19	got out of hand. W5 mentioned that O3 Bragg's actions
20	seemed to be appropriate for the situation, but when he went down to
21	the bottom tier to provide his statement after the incident and saw
22	all of the blood on the floor, "that seemed too extreme".
23	
24	W5 was unable to tell me who hit who during the incident,
25	and could not even tell where the blood had come from. He later
26	learned from one of the deputies that the blood had come from V1
27	but did he did not know how V1 was injured or what
28	part of his body was bleeding.
29	
30	W5 was unable to provide any further information and I
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1	concluded my contact with him.
2	
3	INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
4	
5	Upon the conclusion of the interview with the deputies involved in the
6	incident, as well as the inmates who witnessed the incident, I
7	completed this report detailing the results of the investigation. I
8	faxed the completed Release of Medical Records and Information forms,
9	as signed by O1 Tri, O2 Murillo, and O3 Bragg to their respective
10	hospitals requesting a copy of their medical records as they
11	pertained to treatment for the injuries sustained during this
12	incident. As of the completion of this report, I had not received
13	the medical records, including the medical records I previously
14	requested for V1 Once I receive them, they will be
15	submitted as attachments to this report.
16	
17	On 02/06/14 at approximately 1240 hours, I was able to make telephone
18	contact with O1 Tri. We briefly talked about how O1 Tri was
19	recovering from the injuries he sustained during the struggle with
20	V1. O1 Tri told me he still has leg pain when he walks and there is
21	pain and some deformities in his hand. O1 Tri mentioned an upcoming
22	MRI and possible surgery to help with his injuries, but he did not
23	provide any further information.
24	
25	I reminded O1 Tri of our previous conversation and asked if he had the
26	opportunity to speak with an attorney since that meeting. When O1
27	Tri stated he had spoken with an attorney, I asked if they would like
28	to take the opportunity to come into the Sheriff's Office to provide
29	a statement as to what occurred on the night of 10/03/14. O1 Tri
30	told me he needed time to speak with his attorney, but they would

1	contact me with further information.
2	
3	At approximately 1640 hours, I received a telephone call from Erin
4	Dervin who stated she worked for the Mastagni Law Firm and was
5	representing O1 Tri. We spoke about the possibility of O1 Tri coming
6	in to provide a statement on what occurred between V1 and the
7	correctional deputies on 10/03/13. Dervin stated she would speak
8	with O1 Tri about providing a statement, but she would have to let me
9	know what they decided at a later time.
10	
11	On 02/11/14 at approximately 1455 hours, I received a telephone call
12	from Dervin who stated O1 Tri would not be providing me with a
13	statement on this incident.
14	
15	This report and information will be submitted to the District
16	Attorney's Office for review of possible charges of California Penal
17	Code section 149, Assault Under Color of Authority.

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1	INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
2	
3	On 10/23/13, O3 Bragg responded to the Headquarters third floor
4	interview room to provide a statement. O3 Bragg arrived at
5	approximately 2235 hours and provided the following recorded
6	statement.
7	
8	STATEMENT OF OTHER PARTY 3 KALA BRAGG:
9	
10	O3 Bragg stated he is currently assigned as the module officer for
11	housing unit "5A" on "D team". He has been working for the
12	Corrections Enforcement Bureau for approximately 12 years and
13	assigned to D team for approximately 10 years.
14	
15	I advised O3 Bragg of the reason for my contact with him and he stated
16	he remembered the incident. O3 Bragg stated V1 had come into
17	unit 5A from a special housing unit. Upon arriving, V1
18	brought his property in a large plastic bag. O3 Bragg needed to go
19	through V1 property, which is normal protocol for a new
20	inmate into any unit. V1 participated in "Program" time with
21	the rest of the unit's inmates and returned to his cell once it was
22	over. O3 Bragg had not had a chance to go through V1
23	property until the end of "Pill Call", which was just after
24	Programs.
25	
26	Once O3 Bragg was able to look through V1 property, he
27	located a few items of contraband and pulled them out to be
28	discarded. When he was satisfied the property was clear to be
29	returned to V1 he let him out of his cell and had him come
30	forward to collect the property. Immediately, V1 began to
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1	"berate", "challenge" and "cuss out" O3 Bragg about the search of his
2	property.
3	
4	O3 Bragg went back and said V1 originally arrived in unit 5A
5	from Special Housing Unit 2B at approximately 1930 hours. V1
6	did not seem to have a problem leaving his property with O3 Bragg
7	upon entering the unit. O3 Bragg removed V1 shackles and
8	placed him into a cell. Programs started a short time later. 03
9	Bragg could not recall if V1 ever approached him or asked
10	about his property being returned to him during the Program time, but
11	he did remember telling V1 he had to search through the
12	property before it would be given back to him.
13	
14	When Program was over, V1 returned to his cell just like all
15	of the other inmates. Pill Call immediately followed Programs.
16	During this time, V1 started to tell O3 Bragg he wanted his
17	property back and kicked the door to his cell. O3 Bragg said he told
18	V1 to "cut it out" and that he would return his property as
19	soon as he had time to search through it, but that it took time to do
20	everything else and he would get to it as soon as he could. V1
21	had a friend, later identified as Witness 1 , who
22	was also being housed in the unit, who told V1 to "relax" and
23	"chill out" because O3 Bragg ran the unit well and was not
24	deliberately mistreating him.
25	
26	At that point, V1 did not say anything else to O3 Bragg and
27	everything seemed to be fine. However, once O3 Bragg was done
28	searching the property and let V1 out of his cell to retrieve
29	it, "that's when he went off on me".
30	
OFFICER' Brown,	

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1	O3 Bragg verified he placed V1 property on the floor prior
2	to, during, and after searching through it. Once he had completed
3	searching it and removing the contraband items, the property and bag
4	were on the floor near the officer's station, with a few items still
5	remaining in the bag. O3 Bragg made sure to stand up from the
6	officer's station as he let V1 out of his cell to collect the
7	property. V1 immediately started to berate and cuss at 03
8	Bragg about the treatment of his property.
9	
10	When I asked O3 Bragg what it was V1 was telling him, O3 Bragg
11	seemed embarrassed and told me he does not cuss or use foul language,
12	therefore he could not tell me. He acknowledged being able to write
13	the language in a police report for the purposes of properly
14	documenting what occurred, but would not actually say the words V1
15	used because he does not use such language.
16	
17	I read a few excerpts from the PC 148.10 crime report O3 Bragg had
18	previously prepared (13-177-0001J), in order to verify some of the
19	conversation between him and V1 O3 Bragg verified all of
20	the information I was reading to him correctly depicted what occurred
21	during his confrontation with V1 O3 Bragg confirmed V1
22	had confronted him about how he had searched his property and
23	the verbiage V1 used. O3 Bragg told us he searched V1
24	property in exactly the same manner he had searched
25	everyone else's property when they were housed in the unit. He said
26	it was "scary" to hear the foul language V1 used and the
27	confrontational manner he had approached him with. O3 Bragg feared
28	V1 was about "to do something" to him or attack him. O3
29	Bragg noticed V1 looking at him in a way as if he was
30	possibly picking out a spot to attack, which further frightened him.
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1	
2	
3	I asked O3 Bragg how he responded to V1 or if he asked him
4	"What are you going to do about it?", as V1 had previously
5	told me. O3 Bragg denied ever verbally confronting V1 even
6	though it seemed V1 was challenging him and appeared tense,
7	as if he was getting ready to fight. However, in response to V1
8	verbal confrontation and offensive words, and out of fear
9	V1 was going to physically attack him, O3 Bragg ordered V1
10	to lock down in his cell. When V1 did not respond,
11	O3 Bragg pushed the emergency button on his packset so deputies would
12	respond to assist him.
13	
14	O3 Bragg stepped forward and pushed V1 V1 stumbled
15	backwards a little bit, but then came back forward at 03 Bragg. 03
16	Bragg was able to step to the side, grab V1 arms, and push
17	him up against the wall face first. V1 continued to resist
18	O3 Bragg and made it difficult for him to control his arms. V1
19	"stiffened up" his body and made it impossible for O3 Bragg
20	to bend his arms and put them behind his back. O3 Bragg responded by
21	taking V1 down to the ground, with V1 landing on his
22	chest and lying face down. O3 Bragg continued to try and get a hold
23	of V1 arms while putting pressure on his back and holding
24	him down on the ground.
25	
26	When O3 Bragg took V1 to the ground, they were in the area of
27	the opening to the sun deck door. O3 Bragg said some of his body was
28	actually in the opening to the sun deck door at the time of the
29	struggle. O3 Bragg felt that, while he was taking V1 down to
30	the floor, V1 hit his head on the opening of the sun deck
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-	
	doorway, splitting his head open and causing it to bleed. O3 Bragg
2	was on his knees straddling V1 in an effort to keep him on
	the ground and prevent him from moving around. While sitting there,
4	O3 Bragg tried to gain control of V1 left arm and place him
5	in handcuffs, but was unable to do so because V1 was
6	struggling so much. O3 Bragg lost control of V1 left arm a
7	couple of times while struggling with him and trying to gain control
8	of him. V1 tried to get O3 Bragg off of him by rising up and
9	"bucking" him off. I tried to ask O3 Bragg if he noticed what V1
10	was doing with his right arm during this struggle, but 03
11	Bragg said he did not know.
12	
13	O3 Bragg gave verbal commands for V1 to "stop resisting" and
14	"calm down". V1 would not stop struggling with O3 Bragg and
15	was moving his arms and legs in an effort to escape. Eventually,
16	other deputies arrived to assist O3 Bragg in gaining control of V1
17	At first, O3 Bragg did not recognize who it was that came
18	to his aid because he was so focused on the struggle with V1
19	However, after they were able to control and subdue V1 03
20	Bragg learned it was O2 Murillo and O1 Tri who came to his aid.
21	
22	O3 Bragg was able to tell me he knew O2 Murillo had come and placed
23	himself to V1 right side as he was lying on the floor. O3
24	Bragg thought O2 Murillo began yelling commands at V1 but he
25	could not be sure what he was saying. O3 Bragg also thought O2
26	Murillo was trying to gain control of V1 right arm, since
27	it was free. Although not sure, O3 Bragg thought O2 Murillo was
28	eventually able to secure V1 right arm behind his back.
29	
30	O3 Bragg said O1 Tri ran up and placed himself up near V1
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1	head and shoulder area as he was lying on the floor. When O1 Tri
2	arrived, he fell down onto his knees adjacent to V1 03
3	Bragg did not know what O1 Tri did while he was down on his knees,
4	but stated he eventually got back up to his feet. Later, O1 Tri fell
5	back down to his knees in the same area as he had fallen the first
6	time. Still, O3 Bragg was too focused on trying to get control of V1
7	left arm to see what O1 Tri was doing up near V1
8	head and shoulders.
9	
10	I asked O3 Bragg at what point he noticed blood either on the floor or
11	on V1 O3 Bragg told us he noticed there was blood on his
12	uniform, but he did not see it until they had lifted V1 up
13	off of the floor and escorting him out of the unit after gaining
14	control of him. I again pointed out that O3 Bragg stated he thought
15	V1 hit his head on the sun deck doorway as he was taking him
16	down to the ground. I then asked O3 Bragg how long he estimated it
17	was from the time he took O3 Bragg to the ground until he noticed the
18	blood. O3 Bragg estimated it was approximately 60 to 90 seconds from
19	the time he took V1 to the ground until they escorted him out
20	of the unit. I also verified V1 had been struggling and
21	resisting the entire time he was on the ground, until he was lifted
22	from the ground and escorted out.
23	
24	I read an excerpt from O3 Bragg's original crime report (13-277-0001J)
25	to him, explaining how he witnessed O1 Tri strike V1 in the
26	head and upper body area two times with his knee. I asked O3 Bragg
27	at what point this happened during the struggle and he said it was
28	while they were down on the ground fighting with V1 To get
29	clarification, I asked if this was before or after O1 Tri dropped
30	down to his knees near V1 head and shoulder area. O3 Bragg
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1	said that was actually what the knee strikes were, which was O1 Tri
2	falling to the ground, using his knees to strike V1 03
3	Bragg further went on to say O1 Tri actually fell twice, using his
4	knee to strike V1 in the head area each time, but he could
5	not say how far apart each strike was.
6	
7	I next read O3 Bragg an excerpt from his crime report in which he
8	stated O2 Murillo was kneeling on V1 right side and used
9	his knee to strike V1 in the side of the body, while yelling
10	at him to stop resisting. O3 Bragg said this was a statement O2
11	Murillo had told him and not something he actually witnessed
12	himself.
13	
14	As follow-up to the questions, I asked O3 Bragg if the statements we
15	had just covered from his original crime report were things he had
16	actually witnessed, or things other people had told him prior to his
17	completing the original crime report. O3 Bragg told me the
18	information he had documented about O2 Murillo were things O2 Murillo
19	had actually told to him and he did not witness. However, the
20	information concerning the actions O1 Tri made during the struggle
21	were things O3 Bragg actually witnessed during the altercation, as
22	opposed to what he and O1 Tri had talked about since the incident.
23	
24	
25	I then began to ask O3 Bragg how many times he witnessed O1 Tri
26	striking V1 with his hand or fist, during this struggle. O3
27	Bragg stated he had originally documented in his ER that he had
28	witnessed O1 Tri striking V1 with his hand and fist, but
29	after thinking about what had occurred, he did not actually remember
30	seeing this happen. He told us he had to ¿redact; this information
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1	from his ER after it had been completed and turned in to his
2	Supervisor, but he did not have the chance to do it.
3	
4	O3 Bragg acknowledged he had previously documented in his ER that O1
5	Tri had struck V1 with his hand/fist, but also said he had
6	thought about it over the next week, "had more clarity" about the
7	incident, and now thought that had not happened. Now O3 Bragg
8	realized what he had actually seen was O1 Tri striking V1 two
9	times with his knee as he fell to the ground. At that point, I asked
10	O3 Bragg, at what point during the struggle O1 Tri actually kicked V1
11	O3 Bragg stated, "Oh, I don't know. He kicked him? He
12	kicked the guy?"
13	
14	I advised O3 Bragg I was seeking an honest statement as to what had
15	occurred on the night of the incident, and what he observed happening
16	as the struggle was occurring. I further let O3 Bragg know that any
17	information he could provide to further our knowledge of what
18	happened and assist us with the investigation could prove valuable in
19	the outcome of the case. O3 Bragg simply stated he did not remember
20	Ol Tri kicking Vl at any time.
21	
22	I next asked O3 Bragg if he ever documented, either in his original
23	crime report or in the ER he completed on the night of the incident,
24	that O1 Tri had kicked V1 at any point during the struggle.
25	O3 Bragg said he did not remember O1 Tri kicking V1 but
26	described seeing the knee strikes he previously mentioned. O3 Bragg
27	also stated he would have to look at his reports to tell me if he had
28	at any point documented seeing O1 Tri kick V1 in the
29	face/head area with his foot or boot.
30	
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1 We again discussed O3 Bragg talking with O2 Murillo and O1 Tri about
2 what had occurred on the night of the incident. O3 Bragg said he had
3 only learned what O2 Murillo had done during the struggle after
4 talking to him some time later. When I asked O3 Bragg what he and O1
5 Tri had talked about since the incident, O3 Bragg confirmed they had
6 talked since the incident, but said he could only tell me what O1 Tri
7 did if he was to read O1 Tri's ER's and reports about what had
8 occurred. Sergeant Quinonez tried to clarify with O3 Bragg that we
9 were asking him what O1 Tri had told him he had done during the
10 incident. O3 Bragg said, "Oh, I didn't ask him what he did. I don't
11 know."
12
13 O3 Bragg told us he did not know at what point V1 had reached
14 up and grabbed O1 Tri with either of his hands. However, O3 Bragg
15 was certain V1 did not grab O1 Tri with his left hand at any
16 point because he was focused on the left arm the entire time. O3
17 Bragg admitted V1 left arm was loose at various times
18 during the struggle, but acknowledged that V1 did not grab O1
19 Tri with his left hand or arm at any time.
20
21 I confronted O3 Bragg with O2 Murillo's statements that he clearly saw
22 O1 Tri kick V1 in the head/face area three times with his
23 foot. O3 Bragg denied ever seeing O1 Tri kick V1 at any
24 time, and when I asked O3 Bragg if he had ever documented this in his
25 ER, O3 Bragg again denied ever seeing O1 Tri kick V1
26
27 O3 Bragg and I discussed the information contained in his ER, what he
28 documented in the original report, as well as the information he
29 provided to Sergeant Jensen during a briefing after the incident. At
30 the conclusion of this conversation, we talked about the injuries O3
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1	Bragg sustained during the struggle with V1 O3 Bragg told
2	me he had sustained injuries to his hand, which he sought medical
3	attention for at a hospital in Tracy. He was given two days off of
4	work, but had since returned to duty without restrictions. O3 Bragg
5	said he should probably still be off of work because of the injury,
6	but said he wanted to "tough it out" and come back to do his job as
7	soon as possible. Upon returning to work, O3 Bragg was advised he
8	needed to complete an original crime report for the incident.
9	
10	Sergeant Quinonez asked O3 Bragg a few question concerning the
11	incident. O3 Bragg told Sergeant Quinonez he was in fear for his
12	safety as the incident began to escalate with V1 O3 Bragg
13	was unsure of what V1 was going to do to him during the
14	verbal confrontation and began to fear for his safety. O3 Bragg
15	repeatedly told us "it's just the thought of what he could do",
16	referring to V1 possibly going to hit, push, or grab him. O3
17	Bragg recognized he carries various forms of defense on the duty belt
18	he wears throughout a shift as a correctional deputy, but also said
19	he did not feel he had enough time to grab any of these weapons
20	before V1 "attacked" him. O3 Bragg told us he felt he had
21	enough time to press the emergency button on his packset, and then
22	immediately reached up to push V1 away from him to prevent
23	the attack and overcome any resistance. After pushing V1 O3
24	Bragg grabbed him, pushed him against the wall, and they then fell to
25	the ground in a struggle.
26	
27	Sergeant Quinonez then asked O3 Bragg a few questions about what he
28	saw O1 Tri do during the struggle. O3 Bragg described O1 Tri as
29	being in a standing position at the head and upper body area of V1
30	as V1 lay on the ground. From there, O1 Tri
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1	delivered two knee strikes to V1 but 03 Bragg could not see
2	where O1 Tri's knees contacted V1 Sergeant Quinonez tried
3	to clarify how O1 Tri got from his standing position to the point
4	where he delivered the knee strikes to V1 O3 Bragg was
5	unsure of how O1 Tri moved to a position to strike V1 with
6	his knee, including whether or not O1 Tri went to his knees on
7	purpose or simply fell to the ground due to a loss of balance. In an
8	effort to clarify O3 Bragg's confusion, Sergeant Quinonez began to
9	ask O3 Bragg if O1 Tri lost his balance and fell, or if he delivered
10	actual "knee strikes" to V1 upper body and head area, even
11	pointing out that O3 Bragg documented that he saw O1 Tri deliver two
12	knee strikes to V1 upper body and head area. O3 Bragg
13	seemed unsure of what to say and began to stumble over his words. He
14	now stated he "figured" the knee strikes hit V1 in the head
15	area, but he did not actually see O1 Tri's knees make contact with V1
16	Additionally, he was now unsure if O1 Tri kneed V1
17	on purpose or if the actions were unintentional and as a result of a
18	fall to the ground. Later, O3 Bragg again stated he did not know if
19	Ol Tri struck V1 with his knees, or if Ol Tri fell to his
20	knees onto the floor without ever striking anything.
21	
22	Sergeant Quinonez asked O3 Bragg if he ever noticed V1 trying
23	to assault O1 Tri. O3 Bragg stated he did not see V1 assault
24	Ol Tri, but also said he was solely focused on V1 left arm
25	and left side because he was trying to gain control of his arm.
26	
27	We spoke about O3 Bragg's training as a correctional officer and some
28	of the force options he may be able to use during future struggles
29	with inmates. We also discussed some of the information O3 Bragg has
30	learned since the struggle with V1 but eventually I began to
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1	ask him about how the incident ended and what occurred once V1
2	was handcuffed. O3 Bragg told me he was able to use his
3	handcuffs to secure V1 O3 Bragg could not remember whether
4	V1 had simply given up fighting or if enough deputies had
5	arrived to overcome his resistance, but he did remember placing a
6	handcuff on V1 left wrist. When asked, O3 Bragg could not
7	recall how V1 right arm was handcuffed, but he did remember
8	lifting V1 up from the floor and walking him toward the main
9	door of the unit. As they approached the unit door, Deputy Cortes
10	was able to take O3 Bragg's place in escorting V1 out. O3
11	Bragg stepped away to assess his injuries, calm himself down, and
12	contact Sergeant Jensen to provide a briefing.
13	
14	O3 Bragg described V1 as being injured as a result of the
15	struggle, but did not know exactly what his injuries were. O3 Bragg
16	noticed blood on his hands and gloves, but did not notice the blood
17	coming from V1 until he was being escorted from the unit into
18	the interview room, just prior to his being taken to the medical
19	unit.
20	
21	Although he was not sure, O3 Bragg felt V1 could have hit his
22	head on the doorway as they were initially falling to the ground. O3
23	Bragg thought V1 could have sustained a bump on the head,
24	which could have also started bleeding when they hit the ground.
25	
26	I showed O3 Bragg some of the photographs taken of the scene after V1
27	had been removed from the unit. O3 Bragg said it looked as
28	if there was a large struggle in that area and described there being
29	"blood all over". Using these photos, O3 Bragg was able to point out
30	the general area of V1 head and feet as he lay on the floor
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1 during the struggle. When asked, O3 Bragg thought V1 $$
2 only sustained a cut to the head requiring three stitches and a
3 couple of black eyes. I described the rest of V1 injuries
4 to O3 Bragg and asked if he felt they could have been as a result of
5 his striking his head against the wall or the floor as they were
6 falling. O3 Bragg replied, "Not all of them." I then asked O3 Bragg
7 if it was possible some of the injuries could have been as a result
8 of something other than them falling to the ground, to which O3 Bragg
9 said it would be possible.
10
11 INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
12
13 O3 Bragg described some of the additional photos depicting V1
14 property as it lay on the floor of the unit after the
15 struggle, but we concluded our contact with him without any further
16 information. O3 Bragg returned to the Main Jail and O1 Tri responded
17 to the Sheriff's Headquarters third floor interview room for an
18 interview.
19
20 Prior to O1 Tri arriving at Sheriff's Headquarters, I recalled V1
21 previously telling me how O3 Bragg was such a large person.
22 From the contact I just had with O3 Bragg, I could also tell he
23 seemed to be larger than the average male Corrections Deputy.
24
25
26
27
28
29
30
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1	
1	On 10/24/12 at approximately 0010 houng Other Banty Times Thi (01
	On 10/24/13 at approximately 0010 hours, Other Party Timmy Tri (O1
	Tri) arrived at Sheriff's Headquarters. I advised O1 Tri of the
	reason for our contact with him, including a Behealer advisement
5	stating he did not need to provide information if he did not want to
6	and his ability to end our conversation at any time. On his own, O1
7	Tri stated, "If this leads to discipline or criminal charge, I would
8	like to have a representative, my attorney."
9	
10	Sergeant Quinonez and I verified O1 Tri was aware of how to obtain
11	such representation and ended our contact with O1 Tri at that time.
12	Ol Tri left Sheriff's Headquarters without any further information.
13	
14	All of the statements provided by the involved deputies were video and
15	audio recorded. I was able to place the video and audio recordings
16	onto Compact Discs (CD's) and submitted them as attachments to this
17	report.
18	
19	On 10/24/13, Sergeant Quinonez and I responded to the Main Jail to
20	contact the inmates who witnessed the incident between V1 and
21	the involved deputies. At approximately 1415 hours, we contacted
22	Witness Inmate (W1 who provided the following
23	recorded statement.
24	
25	STATEMENT OF WITNESS 1 :
26	
27	W1 stated he was familiar with the incident we were speaking
28	about and admitted he had tried to talk with V1 prior to it
29	escalating to a struggle. W1 had told V1 to "kick
30	back and relax" when in the unit and dealing with O3 Bragg. W1
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1	has known V1 for quite a while and wanted to make sure
2	V1 did not disturb the way the unit normally runs. W1
3	said he had even told V1 he "ain't gonna win" when it comes
4	to creating a disturbance with the deputies.
5	
6	W1 later went to his cell for lockdown and did not see anything
7	that happened after that. He was able to hear something was
8	happening in the unit, but he could not tell what was happening.
9	
10	W1 told us he "got the impression he (V1 was going to
11	get his ass kicked", which is why he kept telling him to "kick back".
12	At one point W1 even approached O3 Bragg and said V1
13	only wanted his property back. O3 Bragg told W1 he would
14	eventually get to search the property and it would be returned. W1
15	thought this sounded acceptable, passed the information on the
16	V1 and realized V1 was no more "special" than any
17	other inmate in the unit.
18	
19	When asked to provide a little more detail on exactly what happened
20	and how he knew to talk with V1 about not creating problems,
21	W1 said he had heard "words" exchanged between V1 and
22	O3 Bragg while they were all out for Programs. It did not last long,
23	but W1 heard words exchanged between them. Everyone locked
24	down after Programs and inmates began to come out for "Pill Call",
25	which is the distribution of medications for inmates who need them.
26	During Pill Call, W1 went up to V1 cell and spoke to
27	him about not creating a problem in the unit and being relaxed. W1
28	also asked V1 what the problem was and why there was
29	the verbal argument. V1 told W1 he wanted his
30	property returned to him, but 03 Bragg seemed to be withholding it.
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1	
2	
	It was at this point W1 went up to O3 Bragg to explain what was
	wrong with V1 and ask for the property. O3 Bragg let W1
5	know he would return the property to V1 as soon as he
6	was done searching it. W1 let V1 know he would get
7	the property when O3 Bragg had completed Pill Call and had gone
8	through it.
9	
10	W1 returned to his cell from Pill Call. A short time later, W1
11	heard the commotion on the unit floor, which included yelling
12	from both parties. Near the end of the commotion, W1 could
13	hear V1 yelling and one of the deputies telling him to "get
14	on your feet." V1 said, "I can't", and then W1 heard
15	more screaming from V1
16	
17	W1 described V1 as "hostile" when complaining about
18	wanting his property back, including the use of foul language. I
19	asked W1 if the actions O3 Bragg took with V1
20	property were unusual or if it was what he would normally do with a
21	new inmate's property. W1 responded, "That's what every C.O.
22	(Correction's Officer) does. That's what every Deputy does. Not to
23	be a ¿to be frank, we ain't special. We're in jail, look at where
24	we're at."
25	
26	W1 described O3 Bragg as usually being "pretty laid back, using
27	'please' and 'thank you', he's pretty cool." W1 felt the
28	deputies working at the jail were normally respectful and would treat
29	an inmate with respect if they were shown respect from the inmate.
30	
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1	
2	W1 again said he has known V1 for a very long time and
3	described him as being very respectful and very calm. W1
4	thought it was unusual for V1 to be so confrontational and
5	out of character for him to act the way he did. W1 was very
6	surprised to see V1 acting the way he was during Program and
7	Pill Call, even thinking V1 must have been on some type of
8	medication that was affecting his behavior.
9	
10	W1 denied ever hearing anyone say, during the struggle, "Let go
11	of my leg". W1 thought he remembered hearing someone say,
12	"Stop jumping on my legs" or something similar to that, but did not
13	hear anyone yelling "let go of my leg". However, W1 was
14	certain he heard V1 say "I can't get up" near the end of the
15	incident.
16	
17	Approximately a week later, W1 saw V1 at the second
18	floor medical unit, but only for a brief second. W1 asked V1
19	how he was doing and he told him he was all right. W1
20	could not describe what V1 looked like or what injuries it
21	appeared he sustained because this contact was so brief.
22	
23	In conversation with other inmates in the unit after the incident
24	between V1 and the deputies, the inmates were telling W1
25	"Hey, they were jumping on your homeboy's head. They were
26	jumping on his head. They had him all twisted up." W1 could
27	only respond that he had tried to tell V1 to relax and not
28	cause a problem.
29	
30	Just prior to ending our conversation with W1 Sergeant
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1	Quinonez asked him what exactly the other inmates had told him
	happened to V1 during the incident. W1 said the other
	inmates had told him V1 cell door opened and O3 Bragg threw
	him down on the ground. The other deputies came running in to assist
	with the struggle. During the struggle, the deputies kicked, hit,
6	and jumped on V1 head. Due to this, O3 Bragg was trying to
7	protect V1 head to prevent him from getting hurt.
8	
9	Sergeant Quinonez asked W1 if any of the inmates had told him
10	V1 was trying to "push the issue" with O3 Bragg, but W1
11	stated, "Nah, he didn't have a chance. He opened the door and
12	he got slammed, period."
13	
14	INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
15	
16	Sergeant Quinonez and I ended our contact with W1 without any
17	further information. I next contacted Witness Inmate
18	(W2 who provided the following recorded
19	statement.
20	
21	STATEMENT OF WITNESS 2 :
22	
23	W2 stated he was reading a book in his cell when he heard a
24	lot of yelling, such as "get off of him" and "quit hitting him"
25	coming from outside of his cell. He described this as being
26	different from the noises he normally hears in the unit, so he got up
27	and went to the window of his cell to see what was going on. W2
28	looked down to the unit floor and saw a large group of
29	deputies had V1 pinned down on the ground near the entry/exit
30	door to the sundeck.
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1	
	W2 described there being two deputies on either side of V1
3	<u> </u>
4	the ground. V1 had already been handcuffed and subdued when
	W2 looked out of his window. O3 Bragg was on V1
6	left side, up against the wall of the unit. There was a deputy near
	V1 head, with his knee pressed against his neck and throat
8	area. There was a third deputy on V1 right side, but W2
9	did not know his name and could not see what he was doing
10	to V1 All of the deputies were yelling at V1 to
11	"stop resisting", which W1 thought was strange because they
12	already had him handcuffed and pinned to the floor. V1 was
13	not moving and W2 described him as being "out already", but
14	the deputies were still hitting and kneeing him.
15	
16	W2 stated, "And then ah, out of nowhere the dude in the
17	front, man, just started fucking nailing him with his, kicking him on
18	the top of his head." As he was saying this, W2 stuck his
19	foot out as if he was kicking someone with it. He described the
20	deputy as "standing there straight and rearing back and kicking him
21	in the top of his head, ¿ with his boot."
22	
23	W2 said the deputy kicked V1 a "minimum" of three
24	times and then there was a pool of blood that started "pouring out"
25	of V1 head. Again, W2 reiterated that V1
26	was "out already" when the deputy was kicking him.
27	
28	W2 thought the deputy who was kicking V1 must have
	seen the blood coming from his head after the third kick because it
30	appeared the deputy "freaked out and jammed. He took off." W2
OFFICER'S Brown,	

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1	did not see the deputy any time after that.
2	
3	W2 described O3 Bragg as bent over V1 holding his
4	hands behind his back because V1 was already handcuffed.
5	Although he did not know his name, W2 was able to describe
6	a deputy as being on V1 right side, punching V1 in
7	the ribs with a fist. W2 did not know why the deputy was
8	punching V1 but could hear him yelling "quit resisting".
9	
10	W2 was unable to name the deputy at V1 head,
11	delivering the kicks and later running out of the unit, but described
12	him as possibly being "Latin" or "Asian", with short hair, wearing a
13	green jumpsuit and glasses. W2 did not get a good look at
14	the deputy's face because of the angle he had from his cell and how
15	fast the deputy ran out of the unit, but as he continued to describe
16	him, W2 began to become more certain that the deputy was
17	"Asian with glasses".
18	
19	W2 described V1 as "bleeding profusely" from the
20	head after the deputy kicked him, even saying it started "pooling
21	around his head". The deputy appeared surprised and took off out of
22	the unit. Other deputies tried to pick V1 up, but he
23	appeared limp and the deputies had to carry him, unconscious, out of
24	the unit for treatment.
25	
26	I asked W2 if he thought the deputy standing at V1
27	head and kicking him was in any danger from V1 W2
28	said the deputy was not in danger because the other deputies already
29	had V1 pinned down. He did not hear anyone yelling "let go
30	of my leg" and did not see the deputy kicking V1 ever lose
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1	his balance or fall to the ground at any time. Again, W2
2	said V1 appeared to be unconscious at the time of the
3	incident and was not resisting.
4	
5	W2 did not see any type of argument or confrontation between
6	V1 and O3 Bragg at any point during the day. He had not seen
7	any type of altercation with anyone in the unit since he had been
8	housed there, which had been approximately a week at the time of this
9	incident.
10	
11	When I asked W2 about the amount of force used by O3 Bragg
12	during this incident, he said O3 Bragg was just standing over V1
13	and holding his hands. When I asked about the force used by
14	O2 Murillo, W2 again said O2 Murillo was punching V1
15	even though he was not moving. And when I finally asked
16	about the amount of force used by O1 Tri during this incident, W2
17	said, "That was just a straight up assault", and there was
18	no reason for anyone to kick V1 because he was already pinned
19	down on the ground and not a threat.
20	
21	W2 told us the inmates in the unit had talked about the
22	night of the incident and what happened, but I verified everything he
23	had told me during his statement were things he had personally
24	witnessed and not information he had learned from anyone else. W2
25	did learn from other inmates that V1 and O3 Bragg
26	had a verbal argument earlier that day, but he did not witness the
27	argument and therefore did not include it in his statement.
28	
29	Finally, W2 told me he had been held in cell 24 at the time
30	of the incident and he had a clear view of V1 and the
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1	deputies throughout the event. He described the force used by the
2	deputies as "excessive", "unnecessary", "unethical", and "wrong". At
3	one point, when the deputies were picking V1 up and he was
4	limp, W2 had thought the deputies had "killed him" due to
5	the amount of blood pooled up on the floor near V1 head.
6	W2 even went as far as to say he has never seen anything
7	like that, including all of the time he has previously done in the
8	state prison system.
9	
10	INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
11	
12	I ended my contact with W2 without any further information.
13	I next contacted Witness Inmate (W3 who
14	provided the following recorded statement.
15	
16	STATEMENT OF WITNESS 3 :
17	
18	I began by explaining to W3 the reason for my contact with
	him. While trying to explain this to him and the reason why I was
	there, W3 asked "I take it you're just here to do the right
	thing". When I asked W3 what he thought the right thing
22	was, he responded, "I think the right thing is that the guards
	shouldn't be treating inmates like that."
24	
	W3 stated he was lying on his bed in his cell (cell 14) when
	he heard some "scuffling". W3 got up to look out of the
	window of his cell and saw 03 Bragg lying on top of "some white
	inmate" (V1 W3 did not know V1 and
29	described him as being new to the unit. O3 Bragg had V1
30	pinned down on the ground and handcuffed. W3 assumed O3
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_	
	Bragg had hit his "panic button" because soon thereafter a group of
	deputies came running in to help him.
3	
4	W3 told me he was pretty certain O3 Bragg had V1
5	handcuffed. He saw O3 Bragg lying on top of V1 with one hand
6	controlled using something "silver and spray painted orange". When
7	the other deputies came running in to assist O3 Bragg, O1 Tri was
8	with them.
9	
10	W3 stated, "And then Officer Tri (O1 Tri) comes and he just
11	landed a knee on the guys face. And then he got back up and he
12	positioned himself and he just started stomping the guy's head."
13	
14	Ol Tri was the first deputy in to assist O3 Bragg. W3 did
15	not see V1 resisting or struggling with O3 Bragg at all when
16	Ol Tri came running in. W3 did not feel V1 could
17	get away from O3 Bragg or resist very hard because O3 Bragg is such a
18	large person. As soon as O1 Tri arrived at the location, he "landed
19	a knee to his (V1 face." W3 said O1 Tri got back
20	up onto his feet, placed his hand against the wall for balance, and
21	"just started stomping away".
22	
23	W3 told me O1 Tri did not accidentally fall down to his knees
24	and was never pulled down to the ground. O1 Tri's knee intentionally
25	landed on the right side of V1 face and he then stood up
26	and started kicking V1 V1 never reached around O1
27	Tri's legs or any other part of his body, and he never grabbed or
28	pulled O1 Tri to the ground because he was already handcuffed.
29	
30	W3 stated, "I don;t know how much more vulnerable you can be.
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1	I mean, he was, he was pinned. He had both arms behind his back,
2	handcuffed with big old Bragg (O3 Bragg) sitting right on top of him
3	like he was a horsey."
4	
5	Again, W3 stated O1 Tri came running in and just slammed his
6	knee into V1 face. O1 Tri then got up to his feet,
7	positioned himself, and "just started stomping away" on V1
8	head.
9	
10	Since W3 had used the word "kicking" and then used the word
11	"stomping", I tried to clarify what the difference was between the
12	two and what exactly O1 Tri did to V1 Using his own foot,
13	W3 made an up and down motion, slamming his foot on the
14	floor, and told me he felt this was a stomping motion. When
15	describing a kicking motion, he described it as similar to someone
16	swinging their foot as if kicking a football or soccer ball. I asked
17	W3 what he had witnessed O1 Tri doing to V1 and he
18	told me O1 Tri stomped on the top of V1 head approximately
19	four times. I read an excerpt from a supplemental to the original
20	crime report in which the reporting deputy documented that W3
21	had said he saw "kicking and stomping". I asked W3
22	if he witnessed both kicks and stomps, or just stomps as he had just
23	told me. W3 said he did see O1 Tri do some kicking to V1
24	head, as well as the stomping he spoke of earlier.
25	
26	W3 stated he did not see any blood on V1 or the floor
27	prior to 01 Tri arriving on scene. Once 01 Tri arrived and started
28	stomping on V1 a large amount of blood started to pool on
29	the floor under V1 head. I asked W3 if he felt
30	the blood was as a result of O1 Tri stomping V1 and he said,

1	"Oh, I know it was. It had to be. There's no other way all that												
2	blood would have got there."												
3													
4	A few seconds after O1 Tri arrived on scene to assist, a whole group												
5	of deputies arrived. W3 said it looked as they were trying												
6	to drag V1 out of the unit when another deputy came up and												
7	started to kick him in the side and yell, "Get up!" The deputy was												
8	not helping to get V1 off of the ground because 03 Bragg was												
9	doing it, but continued to kick him in the side for no reason.												
10													
11	I asked W3 if V1 ever posed a threat to O1 Tri while												
12	he was on the scene and he stated, "I didn¿t see, no." I next asked												
13	W3 if he felt V1 was ever in a position to assault												
14	Ol Tri and he stated, "Oh no, no, no, not a chance." I finally asked												
15	W3 if he felt there was any chance V1 was going to												
16	assault or resist O3 Bragg and he stated, "There's no way, I mean he												
17	was handcuffed with both arms behind his back. Unless he started												
18	like trying to head-butt him, but that ain't gonna do nothing, you												
19	know, and I definitely didn't see him trying to jerk his head around,												
20	trying to head-butt him."												
21													
22	Once O1 Tri had stopped stomping V1 head, the deputies												
23	eventually tried to get V1 up to get him out of the unit. O1												
24	Tri left the scene with V1 and the other deputies as they												
25	went out of the unit. As it was happening, W3 was expecting												
26	to see O3 Bragg telling O1 Tri to stop what he was doing, but W3												
27	never saw anyone try to intervene and stop O1 Tri from												
28	stomping V1												
29													
30	W3 tried to clarify that he did not see O3 Bragg using any												
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	force that he felt was unnecessary and even felt O3 Bragg had the
2	"situation taken care of". However, W3 felt O1 Tri's
3	actions were "completely unnecessary" and "uncalled for ".
4	
5	W3 stated he has seen a few inmate versus deputy struggles in
6	the past and did not think to say anything about it or make a
7	statement for an investigation because he did not think anything had
8	been done wrong. However, after witnessing this event he wanted to
9	make sure he reported what had happened because he did not think it
10	was right. He stated, "Yeah, that could have been any one of, that
11	could have been me."
12	
13	As V1 was being escorted out of the unit, W3 thought
14	he was conscious, but appeared to be hurt. W3 described him
15	as appearing "wounded" and "limp", and said V1 wasn't saying
16	anything as he was being taken out of the unit. W3 also did
17	not remember hearing either V1 or any of the deputies yelling
18	anything during the struggle, including hearing someone say "let go
19	of my leg", but did remember hearing the one deputy telling V1
20	to "get on your feet" as they were trying to take him out of
21	the unit.
22	
23	W3 told me he did happen to notice the bag of inmate property
24	next to O3 Bragg's workstation on the day of the incident. He
25	described some items being in the bag, as well as some items being
26	out of the bag and on the floor in the area, as if they had been gone
27	through. W3 said it was not unusual for the deputy to go
28	through an inmate's property when he is newly housed in the unit and
29	he assumed it was just a standard procedure the deputies used for new
30	housings. Although the deputy was able to search W3
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1	property immediately after he was brought to the unit, he has seen												
	previous occasions where the property had to sit at the deputy's												
	station for a while before it could be searched.												
4													
5	W3 said he had a clear view of the incident from his cell												
6	window. The incident occurred in the area in front of the sundeck												
7	door, and W3 is able to clearly see that area from his cell.												
8	After V1 was taken out of the unit, the inmates were all												
9	talking about what they witnessed, but W3 has made sure that												
10	his statements only contained the information he personally saw as he												
11	was looking out his window. I asked W3 if he thought there												
12	was any reason as to why O1 Tri would have stomped on V1												
13	head like he did during this incident. Although W3 could												
14	not speak to any arguments O1 Tri and V1 might have had prior												
15	to V1 coming into the unit, W3 did not see anything												
16	during this incident that would have warranted O1 Tri using such												
17	force.												
18													
19	INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:												
20													
21	I ended my contact with W3 without any further information.
