175 inspection last night.

309 7:00?

311 A: 6:30 or 7:00. It was daylight, and I was pissed 'cause I thought that I missed
312 breakfast 'cause the breakfast is - is - is- is - it's dark at breakfast.

314 Q: Right. (Unintelligible). Were you aware of any incident that happened in the
315 dorm then?

317 A: No.

319 Q: You weren't aware?

321 A: I still am not aware of what happened.

323 Q: Okay. Well, there was a - an, uh - an inmate death last night.

325 A: Wow.

327 Q: Yeah. In - in your unit. But if you didn't hear or see - you didn't hear or see
328 anything?

336 Q: Yes, that's why we're investigating it. Um...
