Yeah, we had clothing...

...and then from there, uh, they gave us 45 minutes program, I believe.
Which is a bonus, right?
Yeah.
All right.
'Cause we - we never come out Wednesdays.

Yeah, lockdown Wednesday.
Yeah.

All right. And then what happened?
And then from there, um, they did, um, bar checks.
Like a small shut down?
Yeah. Uh, clo-...
Clothing check...
Clothing checks.

Yeah.
All right. Any problems during, uh, during the (unintelligible) check?
Yeah. Um, Cell 48, they went in there and 'cause he was.
How many officers were there?
At first it was two and then a third officer came.

Yeah, I don't know.
What about the third guy, (unintelligible)?
Uh, he had a little comb-over, Mexican guy.

A: They went to 48. From the bottom window from our cell, you can - you can see - you can see inside there, you know, 'cause I usually, um, use that bottom - bottom window and watch TV but...
...and this - this incident I heard some screaming so or shouting, I - I should say shouting. Uh, and from there, um.
...no, not you but in general like the - just the C.O.'s or anything?
Yeah. Usually they - usually rough 'em up a little bit because.

A: Yeah. He's pretty - he's always like. 'Cause on the meds he takes, you know, like that mix with coffee, you know, he's - he's not supposed to be taking coffee, you know, so. On the meds he's taking, like, he - he just, like, loses it. Like sometimes he just staring into, like, nowhere. I guess he didn't wanna get up. I guess he got tired, I don't know what, he was tired. Like he was - he was angry about something at program. So he - he locked himself down. And then, um, so I guess, uh, right there. 'Cause that's what - that's usually what they do. They - they see someone, uh, acting up in program, then when they do the shakedowns, that's - that's when they'll, like, start talking to you and, like, and
would, uh. (Unintelligible) you shouting at them, they told him to get on the wall and he got on the wall. Uh, and then from there I - I could see them, like, really close, like, close. I don't know exactly what they're doing, but he - but I saw him earlier he said that he got slapped and he got choked.

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Okay.
Yeah.
Then what they do?
And then from there they went down bottom - bottom tier, they went to 47, 45. They start - started to do shakedown.

Started going backwards, all right.
Yeah.
You still watching?
Yeah, I was still watching the whole time and then...
All right.
...'cause we still had. Uh, they did top tier first...
Okay.
...and, uh, they did.
They started over here.
Yeah, started at one ...
Went to 48.
...all the way to 48 , and then...
Then went to 47 .
... 47.

Q: Okay.
A: And then they're in and out 45, in and out 43, and then in and out 41, and then 39 they, uh, I guess they woke him up or something. And then from there, um, you hear him shouting saying, you know, I don't know what they're doing. I - I could kinda see from the door, but you can't see inside or anything. They're they're. This not the first time they - they did that to him, you know. His first night here, um, they - they brought him in and then he was by the shower. And then the one officer was telling him if you move I will fuck you up. And that was like two days before they just beat me up. And then, um. And so they were gonna put him upstairs in $40-$ in 40 , but then, um, I don't know, like, they - they started talking they said, "Oh, we need a bottom - bottom tier, um, cell." So they put him in Cell 17 'cause they - they moved me from Cell 17 'cause they beat me up and they put me in 29. And then, um, so no one was at 17 at that time. They put him in that cell. And then from there they, um, they he, that's the first time he was there, you know, that he was shouting, screaming, you know, "I'm sorry - I'm sorry." He just started like, I guess he was acting up in booking. And so that was their chance for them to, um, I guess, uh, do what they do. Uh, 'cause the night before they put me in a pretzel. I guess they did the same thing to him when that's how they unshackle you.

Q: His first night?
Yeah, his first night.
Okay.
And then on - and then, um, last night too was the same thing. Like you heard the same - the same screaming as before, you know.

know, and then that's when they closed the door, and they went to 37 , in and out, in and out, in and out, in and out. And then more cells in and out. And then they just finished - finished up.

They got to your cell, right?
Yeah.
How long were they in your cell?
It was in and out.
Did they go in?

They search in it?
...because my cell is a trustee. They're like, "Oh, this a trustee cell."
Oh, okay.
So they're like, all right. And then they just left.

Do you think that when they went in and you heard him yelling. What was he yelling?

I'm sorry.

Before. Wait, before I heard him say that, before he said - he said I'm sorry, I heard him say okay - okay, like they told him do something.

When he was yelling that, did it sound like you and I are talking or what did it sound like was happening?

Like he was shouting and like - like - like screaming it, I would say.
Would you say it was like begging?
Like begging, I would say.
