Like, well it's not funny to normal people, but we get our laughs any way, we can. But, you know what I mean, so when they - we 683 684 all laugh, "Ha ha, he - they trying to fuck up ." (Unintelligible) 685 somebody to fuck up . Because that's the type of cop (Lubrum) is. Like, if you ever check his, like, little past history of - well, just this month, him 686 687 being in there, we done had at least two to three fights, and he say the same 688 thing every time, "I don't see nothing. I didn't see nothing." And on his reports, "I heard it but I didn't see it," or "I didn't hear or see nothing." But you 689 690 got - you got - constantly got inmates rolling it up out of our dorm, constantly 691 got inmates with a black eye. And now he gotta lock our dorm down and bring in cops. And when they asked, 'Hey, what happened?" "I didn't see it. I was 692 watching this side, and it just happened so fast." 693 694 695 MAN: (Unintelligible). 696 697 A: But he know who the inmates are that are beatin' up people. It's a gang called 698 (Northern Riders). He know all of them are.
