Military Equipment Use Report

6-Month Report

OVERVIEW

This report is responsive to the Board of Supervisors request for a 6-month report back on the status of Sheriff's Office military equipment and usage. The format of this report was crafted in a manner that conforms to the statutorily required annual report pursuant to California Government Code section 7072(a) to include the following information: 1.) A summary of the military equipment uses and the purpose; 2.) A summary of any complaints or concerns concerning the military equipment; 3.) The results of any internal audits, information on any violations, and actions taken in response; 4.) The total annual cost for each type of equipment; 5.) The quantity possessed of each type of equipment; 6.) The intent to acquire additional equipment and quantity sought. Assembly Bill 481 (AB 481) was implemented on May 1, 2022; therefore, the reporting period covered in this document is from May 1, 2022 – January 31, 2023 (8 months). The entire timeframe has been included for transparency and consistency, even though the Board formally approved the Sheriff's Office policy on August 30, 2022. The Sheriff's Office intends to submit the statutory required annual report to the Board of Supervisors at the second regular Board of Supervisors meeting in May of each year using a similar format as this report.

Since the Board of Supervisors approved the Sheriff's Office policy regarding the Funding, Acquisition and Use of Military Equipment, the Sheriff's Office is pleased to report that it has established additional mechanisms for tracking use, complaints, and auditing consistent with AB 481. Additionally, the Sheriff's Office is taking measures to overhaul existing equipment tracking and inventory systems to include selecting and procuring software to digitally track all weapons owned by the department. Once in place, the system will streamline and automate equipment inventory and tracking, replacing existing manual and paper-intensive systems. The system is live and the office is working to transition all inventory by the end of the fiscal year.

There were no general or specific complaints made to the office regarding the use of or possession of any of the outlined equipment. Additionally, all uses of this equipment were audited to include report and body worn camera reviews to ensure policy was adhered to. AB 481 equipment usage was low in contrast to the number of incidents Sheriff's Office staff responded to or proactively initiated during this reporting period. The Enforcement Bureau had approx. 91,618 incidents for service by the community and proactive law enforcement activity during the reporting period. There were only 28 uses or deployments across all approved equipment categories during this reporting period (or a .0003% usage rate). Similarly, the Custody Bureau only had 50 uses across all approved equipment categories in both facilities combined during this reporting period, while running a 24/7 operation with a large population. The Sheriff's Office reserve deputies employed by the Stanford Department of Public Safety did not have any deployments across all approved categories of military equipment. It is the position of the Sheriff's Office that this equipment defined under AB 481 is vital in the resolution of critical incidents to keep the public and our staff safe. We also remain committed to transparent reporting and responsible use of the equipment.

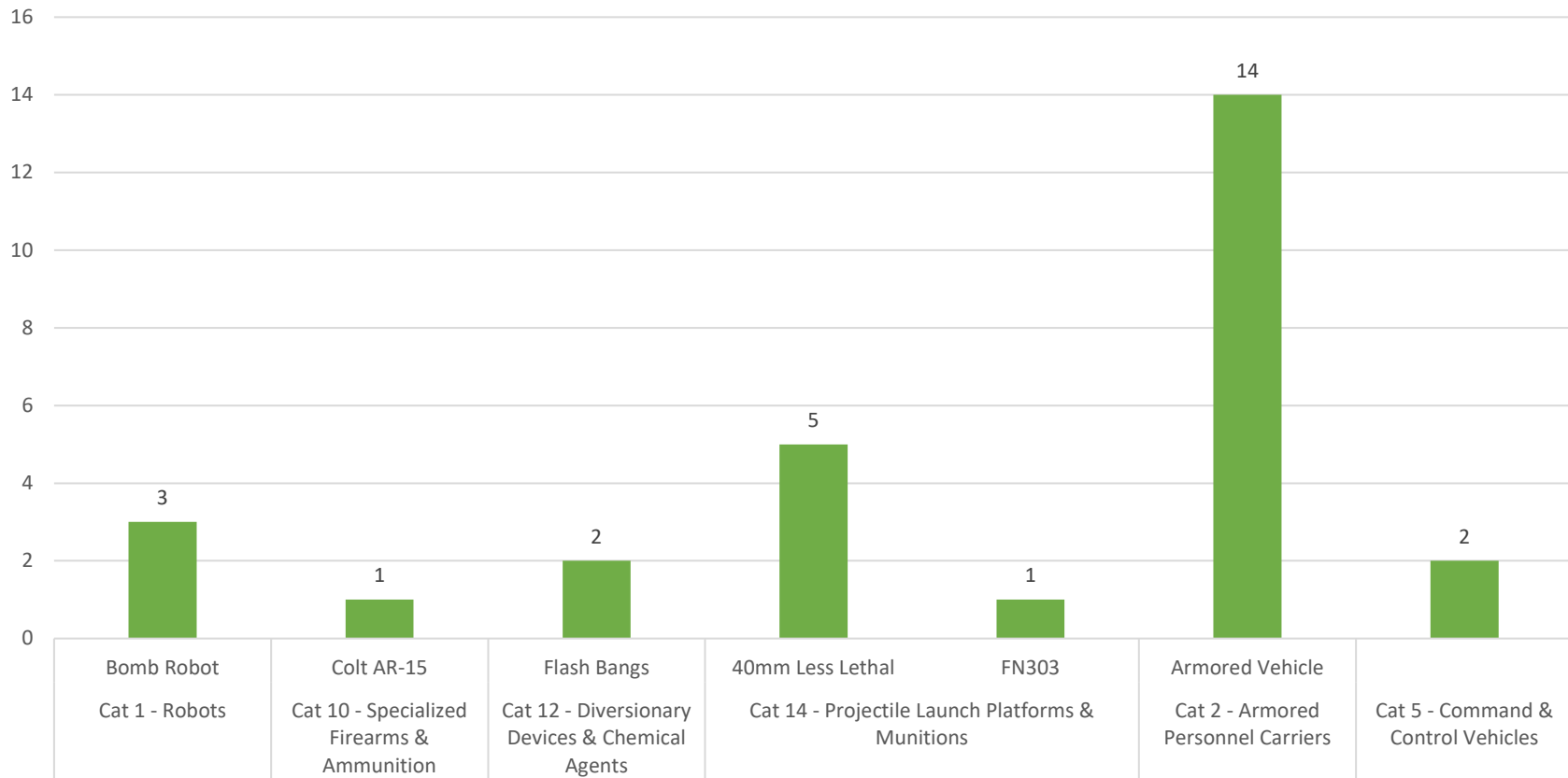


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Enforcement Bureau Reportable Equipment Deployment & Usage Summary Reporting
Period of May 1, 2022 - January 31, 2023



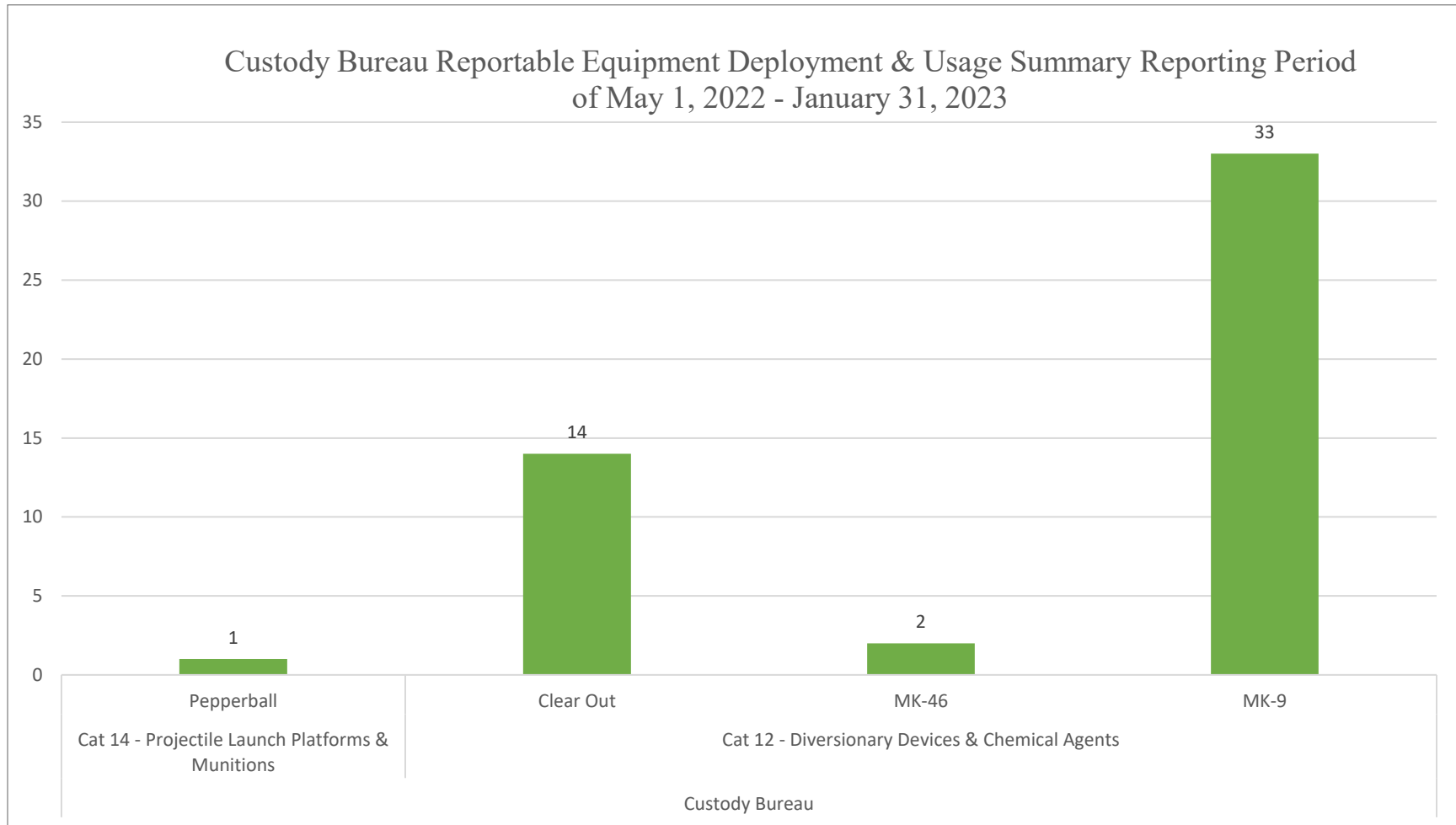

Intended Acquisition in 2023

Remotec Spartan (*Acquisition Pending*); Cost: \$465,000; Quantity: 1.

The Remotec Spartan is a remote operated medium-large sized bomb disposal robot with a manipulator capable of confronting improvised explosive devices (IED), vehicle born improvised explosive devices (VBIED) and large vehicle born improvised explosive devices (LVBIED) that will provide continued Bomb Squad operability in light of an aging fleet of bomb disposal robots. This bomb disposal robot will be entirely purchased through State Homeland Security Grant Program funds.

Total Annual Cost

There are no ongoing annual costs associated to the operation of the bomb disposal robots, however, a bomb disposal robot occasionally experiences damage requiring repairs outside of the ability of staff and specialized repair costs are incurred. No specialized repair costs were incurred during this reporting period. The acquisition and training costs for the Remotec Spartan bomb disposal robot will be covered by grant funding and will not incur any cost to the County.

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Intended Acquisition in 2023

The Sheriff's Office is looking to retire the 1998 Chevrolet Suburban, which is long overdue and continues to have minor mechanical issues due to the age of the vehicle. The Sheriff's Office will seek Board of Supervisors approval once a sufficient replacement has been selected in compliance with AB 481.

Total Annual Cost

The Lenco Bearcat had maintenance and lighting upgrade costs of approximately \$1,000 during this reporting period. The Chevrolet Suburban had approximately \$2,000 in maintenance costs during this reporting period.

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Intended Acquisition in 2023

Mobile Command Post (*Purchase Pending BOS Approval*); Cost: \$450,000; Quantity: 1.

The Mobile Command Post will be primarily used as a mobile office and shelter during prolonged critical incidents and all hazards to aid in the command, control, and deployment of personnel. This vehicle will be outfitted with equipment including, but not limited to, a communications (radio) console and accessories, a large monitor to display live incident updates and tactical considerations, a boom camera for operational security, a conference table, several workstations, chairs, and storage space. *This Mobile Command Post will be purchased using State Homeland Security Grant Program funds.*

Total Annual Cost

The recurring annual maintenance costs for the SERT Tactical Command Post are approximately \$1000 through Santa Clara County Fleet and Facilities (FAF). The acquisition and outfitting costs of Mobile Command Post will be primarily through grant funding and any additional expenses will be absorbed by the Sheriff's Office annual budget.

The Training and Professional Development Division hosted one 24-hour POST-certified Patrol Rifle course (POST certification 2270-32075) in January of 2023 for new users of the Colt AR-15 (.223) and one 80-hour POST-certified Basic SWAT course (POST certification 2270-23000) in



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October of 2022. In addition, approx. 186 deputies qualified with a rifle during the qualification period of July through December 2022, as required by General Order 12.01 (Firearm Issuance and Training).

Intended Acquisition in 2023

The Sheriff's Office has continued to place orders for duty and practice .223 ammunition to maintain an adequate inventory for required bi-annual qualifications, advanced training, and specialized team training demands. Due to the national shortage of law enforcement ammunition, no reportable orders placed in the reporting period have been fulfilled or delivered. The office will seek additional replenishment of inventory used in this category at the year-end reporting in May 2023.

Total Annual Cost

The Sheriff's Office has not purchased any additional inventory during this reporting period and therefore, no additional cost to the County has been incurred. Updated cost projections of purchases for FY2024 will be available when the Sheriff's Office seeks replenishment of inventory in this category at the year-end reporting in May 2023.
