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7 **INTERVIEW WITH OFFICER COSSEY**

8 **Q=Sgt. Owens**

9 **Q1=Sgt. Carrasco**

10 **Q2=Male**

11 **A=Officer Cossey**

12
13
14 A: Goes around, uh, (Mike White)'s car, Officer (White) comes and hits right
15 here 'cause I think at the end, he was trying to get out of the way. I think he
16 puts sergeant's car in there.

17
18 Q: Officer (White).

19
20 A: Right. I come in, I positioned my car here. A little bit further over. Like I'm
21 right here 'cause I'm like and the suspect comes here, goes in reverse back to
22 route. Has a turn, hits here...

23
24 Q: Oh.

25
26 A: ...slides off to this. And from here to here, it just full on gassing it. Right about
27 this, hits me here. Bam. Hits my like front corner panel here. This car turns
28 this way about 10 feet out of the way.

29
30 Q: Mm-hm.

31
32 A: There's a parked vehicle here, just a parked vehicle. Primary vehicle comes
33 and at this point, he comes this way...

34
35 Q: Still in reverse?

36
37 A: Still in reverse.

38
39 Q: Mm-hm.

40
41 A: And just - just gassing it still. This time it's slowing down 'cause he had to
42 push him back but it only slowed him down probably 5 to 7 miles an hour.
43 This time, he's probably - he just fall and gassing it, hits this car here. This
44 time, my car's about right here. (Bruce) had already exited. He comes here. I
45 exit and I come here. The car ends like this facing directly at me.

46
47 Q: Yeah.
48
49 A: So as - as much as I could get out of the way here, so I come up like this. He
50 just starts keeps gassing it, pushes the car up like this, makes enough room to
51 where he can maneuver his vehicle to come out this way.
52
53 Q: Got it. Okay.
54
55 A: I come right here. He looks directly at me right here and puts it in drive and
56 gasses it towards me. I jump out of the way. I end up probably like right here.
57 (Bruce) was standing probably about right here and this car went, whew. So it
58 had to turn right towards him. So he's standing on the passenger side but as
59 soon as he gassed it, he went directly - he would have been directly, you
60 know, so it went like this.
61
62 Q: Now, you said that -
63
64 A: There's no room between there.
65
66 Q: Right here, you were definitely in fear for your life.
67
68 A: Oh yeah, for sure. If I wouldn't have - if I wouldn't have jumped out of the
69 way, I would have been ran over or run into by the car.
70
71 Q: And you said you just jumped out of the way?
72
73 A: I jumped out of the way.
74
75 Q: And are you right-handed or left-handed.
76
77 A: I'm right-handed.
78
79 Q: And you carry your gun in your right hand?
80
81 A: Correct.
82
83 Q: So does the gun fall out of your hand or...
84
85 A: No, no, it did not fall out of my hand. I actually fell...
86
87 Q: Okay.
88
89 A: ...like this and it landed - in my hand like this and I landed down like this and
90 it kinda crushed my thumb underneath my gun way kinda like this.

91
92 Q: Okay.
93
94 A: To be honest, I only remember being on the ground for like one to two
95 seconds 'cause I thought he was gonna keep coming. So as soon as I fell
96 down...
97
98 Q: You wanted to get out of the way.
99
100 A: ...and I'm thinking on my head, oh, shit, I fell in the ground. So I jumped up
101 and I turned around and run but then my car right on me. Oh, he - he turned.
102 He's gonna - he's gonna run again. So then I thought I'm gonna get my car
103 and go and then it was - and I - where was I going to go? I had nowhere to go.
104
105 Q: Yeah.
106
107 A: 'Cause my car was - died. So...
108
109 Q: So you couldn't actually see where, uh, (Bartholomew) was. I mean, you said
110 that he exited the car this way, went this way.
111
112 A: When I - when we exited my car...
113
114 Q: Mm-hm.
115
116 A: ...he was on this side and I was on this side.
117
118 Q: Got it.
119
120 A: I was actually right here because I was approaching the drivers - actually
121 coming on to the driver 'cause there was really not that much room to come in
122 between here.
123
124 Q: Right.
125
126 A: So I came directly on to the driver. Um, that's how I screamed out, put your
127 hands up, police, get out of the car and whatever I could tell him and that's
128 when he's looking at me. And I'm - I'm telling him like turn off the car. And,
129 uh, literally, he looked right at me, and it was kinda like a whatever, puts it in
130 drive and just guns it. So the last time I saw (Bruce), he was on the passenger
131 side and I was directly like headlight. So by the time I jumped, that's where
132 (Bruce) was at.
133
134 Q: What would you say the distance was from the front of this vehicle to where
135 your vehicle was at that time?

136
137 A: Probably 10 feet. I'd say I was probably about four feet in front of the car, and
138 I would say I probably jumped back about five feet falling out, sliding, going
139 back 'cause when I got up, I was probably another two feet from my car. So
140 when I - like I said, when I stood up, I was literally right there, so.
141
142 Q: And what about the distance between initially from where you were, the front
143 corner to the back Officer (White)'s car?
144
145 A: I'd say maybe 5, 6 feet.
146
147 Q2: Yup.
148
149 Q: This is a general question.
150
151 Q2: I hear that all time.
152
153 Q: I guess in the patrol car if you guys got code three equipment on and as soon
154 as you put it into park, I think that sirens are automatically killed, but in
155 unmarked car...
156
157 A: In ours no.
158
159 Q: ...so...
160
161 A: Not even they are a patrol car, they don't do that.
162
163 Q: Oh, okay.
164
165 A: Yeah. And these, they don't. You just - you got a toggle switch underneath.
166 When it's on, it's on.
167
168 Q: Okay.
169
170 A: Just...
171
172 Q: So when you got out of your car and you were approaching the vehicle, and
173 like you said, you made eye contact, you had your gun drawn, you were
174 telling him to get out of the car. The sirens are blaring on almost, uh, let's see,
175 maybe one, two, three, four police cars.
176
177 A: Yeah.
178
179 Q: Okay. So was it pretty loud?
180

181 A: Um, very loud. They're not as loud as a normal patrol car. They don't have
182 those huge speakers and they definitely got that in right level.
183

184 Q: Okay.
185

186 A: But they're loud enough to where it's you'll hear it over your radio.
187

188 Q: Right.
189

190 A: Um, I - I could hear myself yelling. I'll put it that way. And I know what I
191 was yelling and, uh - and you could hear the car crashes louder than anything.
192

193 Q: Sure.
194

195 A: I mean, and you just continue to back up and back up and back up and this.
196

197 Q: Did you hear (Bruce) at all?
198

199 A: No. I can't say I heard him.
200

201 Q: So you said that you jumped back the car, you - you got up right away. You
202 looked - you were facing the car and then you thought, okay, I'm gonna get -
203 he's running or he's - he's gonna evade, so you're thinking about getting back
204 in your car to chase him at which point you heard one gunshot?
205

206 A: Yeah. I - I don't remember if I actually got into my car or if I - I just kinda
207 like on the doorway because my thing was - I wanted to get the hell out of the
208 way because I was thinking - my last thought I saw him, he was coming right
209 at me.
210

211 Q: Right.
212

213 A: And so my thing was, oh, shit - you know, like I'm getting out. So when I - I
214 literally jump off on the ground and I land, my first instinct was don't even
215 look. I just got up and turned. Well my car was right there and I was thinking
216 well he didn't - he wasn't coming towards my car. And so, I don't know if I
217 actually got into my car or I was just thinking of getting into my car but then
218 that's when I heard a shot. So it was within a se - a second, maybe two.
219

220 Q1: Okay.
221

222 Q: But the point is, is that you were face - facing away...
223

224 A: Away from my car. I - I was literally facing the door of my car.
225

226 Q: And then your partner was behind you along with the suspect vehicle?
227
228 A: Correct.
229
230 Q: Okay. And when you turned, what did you see?
231
232 A: When I turned, all I saw was the car driving still at a pretty good speed.
233
234 Q: Can you tell the surroundings?
235
236 A: Yeah. There was - I think there was a - there was a space right here, I think...
237
238 Q: Got it.
239
240 A: ...it's a driveway actually.
241
242 Q: Okay.
243
244 A: And there's two cars parked here and then there's another car parked here.
245 This vehicle comes and hits this car probably at a good 15-20 miles an hour,
246 hits this car, pushes it up on the sidewalk and this car turns and hits this car.
247
248 Q: Okay.
249
250 A: When I turned around, uh, I heard the shot. The car comes, boom, comes here.
251 I come running up this way. Officer (White) had come around to the driver's
252 side and this is - this is probably 30-40 feet, maybe a little bit further.
253
254 Q: Okay.
255
256 A: I think he drove a little way. Um, so by the time I run over here, Officer
257 (White) on the driver's side.
258
259 Q: Is that the first person you saw?
260
261 A: Officer (White).
262
263 Q: Okay.
264
265 A: Um, he's at the driver's side and, uh, I asked him if he's good, if he - he can
266 get up. He said he's - he's good forth. Um, I tell him I need hold on that guy. I
267 go around to the passenger side. At that time, I met up with Officer (Pifferini).
268 Um, Officer (Pifferini), uh, I - I remember him telling the suspect the
269 passenger, um, take your seatbelt off. He opened the door and told the guy,
270 hey, take your seatbelt off. And the guy did. Uh, and, you know, I can't even

271 remember the guy. He just looked like he was out here like what the hell,
272 right.

273

274 Q1: Yeah.

275

276 A: So he got - he take - he got off and then we just grabbed him, um, put him
277 down on the ground.

278

279 Q: In a prone position?

280

281 A: Yeah, we proned him out but we did with our hands. We didn't - we didn't
282 pull him out. We just wanted to get him out of the car.

283

284 Q: Okay.

285

286 A: We pull him out and set him on the ground, immediately put handcuffs on him
287 and I stood him up. I searched a real quick and that's when I was asking him,
288 hey, are you all right? Did anything happen to you? Because he was kind of
289 like what. And, uh, I walked him back to the rear of my car here. Here I
290 conducted a search and that's where I found the, you know, the keys and stuff.
291 Um, then I walked him here and set him here and the patrol officer came and
292 took him from me.

293

294 Q1: Okay.

295

296 Q: You said that you had gone to the, uh, passenger side and you were - were
297 drawn down. Do you remember if Officer (Pifferini) had his weapon out?

298

299 A: I do not recall.

300

301 Q: Okay. Um, did you handcuff the passenger or did (Pifferini) handcuff...
302

303 A: (Pifferini) did. Uh, he took, uh, he had the suspects. When we - when we
304 brought him out and head facing this way, feet facing this way, he was on his
305 right side. He put his right behind how much - well he cuffed here. He had
306 him out. He put his cuff on and just pulled his other hand out. We 10-15 him
307 together.

308

309 Q1: Okay.

310

311 A: And, uh, I just give him back and I got him and I stood him up and that's
312 when I immediately walked him away. Um...

313

314 Q: So you put - you reholstered them, right?

315

316 A: Yeah. After that and once - once we went - handled all of them, I mean, I put
317 it back into my pocket.
318

319 Q1: Okay.
320

321 A: So it was - now we - there's no need for it at that point to have it at that point.
322

323 Q: Do you remember seeing Officer (Bartholomew) there during this?
324

325 A: When I - after I walked back, I saw (Bruce).
326

327 Q: And where was (Bruce) at that point?
328

329 A: Um, he was kinda towards the rear of the suspect vehicle.
330

331 Q: Okay.
332

333 A: Um, and that was the only time I really saw him. And then I asked - and I
334 remember asking him if he was okay and he said, yeah, he's okay. And then,
335 uh, Sergeant (Archer) was about right here and that's - I walked up and
336 Sergeant (Archer) was putting out all the radio traffic. Um, I believe he asked
337 me how I held up, and I said, yeah, I'm good and, uh, I just I pinned the guy
338 against the car and that's the last thing.
339

340 Q: You pinned him here?
341

342 A: Yeah. I just - not really pinned him, I just pushed him against my car like..l
343

344 Q: Oh right.
345

346 A: And then, uh...
347

348 Q: And then eventually brought him over here.
349

350 A: Then I - yeah, after this, they cleared this, made sure everything was go for,
351 um, no one - no other people, no one was harmed. And then after that, I didn't
352 want to stand in the middle of street especially next to all our vehicles 'cause
353 we had guns and stuff still in the backseat. So I brought him over here and sat
354 him down, stayed with him until a patrol officer came.
355

356 Q: Okay. Do you remember where Officer (De la Cruz) was at all when this
357 whole thing was happening?
358

359 A: I don't.
360

361 Q: You don't remember seeing him?
362
363 A: I do not.
364
365 Q: Okay. Um, good, very detailed. Thank you.
366
367 Q1: Okay. All of voice.
368
369 Q: I have one for you. Um...
370
371 A: He...
372
373 Q: ...you jumped out of the way - uh, just real quick for my note and you - you
374 jumped out of the way and you heard the shot, where was the - I know you
375 said you looked away but when you said you looked back where - where was
376 the vehicle at that point in the street?
377
378 A: When I looked back, the vehicle was right - right here.
379
380 Q: And he was driving away from you?
381
382 A: He was driving away from me.
383
384 Q: Okay. Did you see (Bruce) - I - after that?
385
386 A: No, I didn't. I did - I didn't - yup, but to be honest, I really wasn't looking. I
387 was on a more tunnel vision. I saw the car and I kinda was thinking in my
388 head, you know, is he running still because at that point, he was just B lining
389 for cars. I'm thinking in my head, why are you just gonna drive right into
390 those cars.
391
392 Q: Yeah.
393
394 A: So - then that's when I - gunshot, so I hear the gunshot. I'm like, oh, shots
395 fired, so I - that's when I took off running towards the car. You know, I...
396
397 Q: Did - did you, um, either think or 'cause you didn't see (Bruce) at all maybe
398 he had run, you know, run into (Bruce) or?
399
400 A: Yeah, I thought he - as soon as I jumped out of the way and I - I thought in my
401 head that, well, the car didn't come towards me 'cause I got out of the way
402 that Bruce was literally right in front of that car. And so, automatic on my
403 head, I was - that's what I thought. It had to have been (Bruce) because if he
404 didn't get ran over, he - I don't know. I - honestly don't know how he didn't
405 get hit because he had to have done the same thing with me like literally ran

406 out the way. So I thought he was gonna get hit along with me 'cause if he - if
407 he wasn't gonna go straight towards me, the only way he could have gone is
408 this way and that's exactly where (Bruce) was standing.

409
410 Q: So basically, in your - your - in your mind, to get out, he's gonna go to where
411 - or both of you?

412
413 A: Yeah. And the thing I - it - it - for the lack of a better term, tripped me out the
414 most is he literally looks directly at me 'cause I'm telling him stop and I'm
415 like pointing my gun and I'm right in front of him and I'm stopping him. He
416 looks directly at me and just - you can see him put it in gear and just driving
417 as he looks at me.

418
419 Q: (Unintelligible).

420
421 A: Yeah. Oh, he totally would. There's no way. And that the thing we could - I -
422 I mean, I - I walked up and the guy is still wearing a seatbelt, the passenger.
423 So I'm thinking, they had no - they - they didn't want out of the car. It wa- it
424 was all like it was a fun thing for them. The driver was wearing driving gloves
425 and I noticed that - as I walked up, he's wearing like - like leather driving
426 clothes.

427
428 Q: Okay.

429
430 A: I feel like - and it's all up and you know, what my CI was telling me, this is
431 stinky, lights drive out on car and I mean, we knew that coming in. I didn't
432 think it was, you know.

433
434 Q1: Right.

435
436 A: And he - he take it as a fun thing to do.

437
438 Q1: Got it, yeah.

439
440 A: He took it to an extreme.

441
442 Q: Um, did you - after you came back and you brought, um, the suspects in the
443 passenger seat over here, um, did you see anybody else coming over here to
444 assist the white - the suspect one, the driver?

445
446 A: No, I - I - I had my backup at that time. Once I - once I - he gave me a
447 clipboard here. He was going for it. He said he was up and walked around
448 passenger. I gave - (Piff) and me made acknowledgement. We're good. Um,
449 that's when we 10-15 him. As soon as I 10-15 him, I grab him and I let him
450 know I'm good with the body. He said okay and I turned my back and I

451 walked to here. So there was still - (Pifferini) was still here and (Mike Bud)
452 was still here when I turned and walked back.

453
454 Q: Okay.

455
456 A: All right. They're here for probably a good minute and a half, two minutes'
457 worth of time.

458
459 Q: Was anybody in your group tonight wearing, uh, BDs?

460
461 A: No.

462
463 Q: Okay. Um, how long do you think it took the first one to get - to get there?

464
465 A: Very quick, probably within - it seemed like less than a minute and he came in
466 from the - maybe like a minute and a half I think 'cause he came in - he came
467 in on this side. So I'm saying this is...

468
469 Q: This side there?

470
471 A: Yeah, I'm saying this is west Lowell. Maybe that's not right. Maybe, I'm
472 sorry. Saying that's west and then he...

473
474 Q: Okay

475
476 A: You're saying that's west and then this is east.

477
478 Q: Okay.

479
480 A: So he came in from this side.

481
482 Q: All right.

483
484 A: And, um, and I was actually I was really surprised that they came that fast
485 because even, I mean, we get one person comes out. We call them and the
486 drill side. I don't care about that ever. So we think maybe they was right
487 around the corner.

488
489 Q: That's good.

490
491 A: Yeah.

492
493 Q: When you, uh, walked up or ran towards the - the car and you said you saw
494 Officer (White) over here, um, did you notice the driver at that point or did
495 you see if he had any injuries or...

496
497 A: Uh, I just saw blood. Uh, I noticed that he had a - an exit - I mean, a - an exit -
498 a bullet wound, uh, like on his neck area. He was still moving. Um, I don't
499 know if there were residual movements. Uh, he was still moving though and
500 that's why Officer (White), he still was drawing down on him and asked him,
501 hey, are you good with this guy? Yup, I'm good. Um, he wasn't making crazy
502 movements, but he was still moving. I think maybe it was his motor skills or
503 adrenaline. That's when I went around the other side, so.
504
505 Q: Did you hear Officer (White) giving him any commands as far as don't move
506 or?
507
508 A: He didn't - uh, I don't know if it's Officer (White)...
509
510 Q: Show us your hands.
511
512 A: ...but someone was telling him put his hands up and he wasn't doing it. I don't
513 remember if it was Officer (White), but they continued to yell "put your
514 hands, let me see your hands, let me see your hands", and they just kept
515 yelling. I- I - to be honest I don't know if it was Officer (White) 'cause when I
516 was running out. It could have been along the passenger side, but someone
517 was yelling "let me see your hands." And then when I came around this side,
518 the passenger had his hands up.
519
520 Q: Then you, uh, went back towards the vehicle after you had taken the
521 passenger out to the patrol car?
522
523 Q1: Yes.
524
525 A: No, I am a lot bigger. The only I think I walked back is I stood again and then,
526 uh, after I stood with him, I handed him off to patrol officer and then we all
527 kind of gathered up and then they corralled us.
528
529 Q: Okay. Are you given any assignment after this whole incident when you...
530
531 A: Um...
532
533 Q: ...gathered with your team?
534
535 A: Don't talk anyone.
536
537 Q: So your Sergeant didn't give you something to do or...
538
539 A: No. We stood by. I mean it was - at first, it was scene security until enough
540 units got there and there was people walking down the street. Um, there was

541 actually a couple that was walking and they at - at later time, they were trying
542 to walk through again. I told them to go wait in the house. There was a tan
543 house that was - these two vehicles were associated to a tan house.
544

545 Q: Uh-huh.

546

547 A: They were just walking down the street and I asked the people that lived here,
548 hey, these people need to be speaking, spoke to you. Can they just wait in
549 your house?
550

551 Q: Okay.

552

553 A: That is fine. And so they were Spanish speaking only and then I just walked
554 back and forth here and told people to stop walking on the sidewalk and then
555 to stay out. And then maybe within five minutes, there was enough officers
556 within and it was taped off.
557

558 Q: Did you see the scene after it was taped off?

559

560 A: Um, I - you know what, it was getting a little dark then. I saw the vehicles. I
561 never did see this. I never walked all the way back over here. Um, and I never
562 went back to my car right from - we all - once we got corralled, we stood here
563 for a little bit and then our sergeants brought us in here. So from here, I could
564 see just - just the vehicles, the accident.
565

566 Q: So at some point kind of (Sam Hartcher) kind of gathered everybody together?

567

568 A: Correct.

569

570 Q: Come back over here in (Trulia)?

571

572 A: Yes. And it was also the district sergeant as well.
573

574 Q: Okay.

575

576 A: Kind of just sitting and make sure everybody's okay. That's what we did after,
577 uh, Officer (White) got checked out, um, they brought Officer (White) back to
578 pretty much his car. Um, he got a clearance, uh, from, uh, from fire. Once they
579 did that, then they kinda made him go stand in the corner 'cause he - he was
580 trying to be a little bit tougher and he wants to be - he - he's - he's hurt. His
581 neck is all jacked up. His neck and head, got a huge knock on his head so he's
582 going to be in pain tomorrow so we all kinda just stood by him and just held
583 tight.
584

585 Q: Okay. You were pretty, uh, confident that you only heard one shot gun fire?

586
587 A: I only heard one shot.
588
589 Q: That's it. Anything else? I think I have too much colors in this scene. When
590 you were sitting right here, I mean, how scared were you when you were
591 sitting right there?
592
593 A: Oh, I, uh, put it this way. If I wouldn't have jumped out of the way of that car,
594 I would have been dead. And it literally - as soon as I saw that guy pulling
595 forward, the thing that went to my mind, oh shit, I'm hit. And that's why I - I
596 jumped. I was literally on the ground for like .2 seconds. As soon as I hit
597 because I - being so, uh, agile, I guess, I jumped so far. I couldn't catch my
598 feet underneath me.
599
600 Q: Mm-hm.
601
602 A: And so I fell backwards and I literally jumped up thinking - thinking he's
603 going to hit me for sure. So I - I thought I was - I thought I was going to be
604 crushed between the cars. If he was - if I wasn't going to get underneath him.
605 So, yeah, that was - I was definitely scared for my life here. And then I
606 thought (Bruce) was for sure. And as soon as I saw the car turned that way, I
607 didn't really look for (Bruce). I had heard the shot. I didn't really look for
608 (Bruce) but I thought for sure (Bruce), he had to have gotten hit, so.
609
610 Q: So you just have enough time to jump out of the way.
611
612 A: Literally jump out of the way.
613
614 Q: If you would have been any closer would you have maybe taken a shot?
615
616 A: If would have been closer, I - there's no way. If I wouldn't have taken a shot
617 from where I was at, if I would have planned it right and he - and taken a
618 shot, he would have run me over. That's the only reason I jumped out. There's
619 no I could have done anything else except get out of the way.
620
621 Q: Right. Gotcha.
622
623 Q1: Okay.
624
625 Q: Self-preservation at that point in time?
626
627 A: Um, yeah, there's no way. I let the - the guy came driving off right here. I
628 wasn't gonna get dragged down the street underneath a stolen Honda, so.
629
630 Q: All right. Well, do you have anything else? If you could think of anything else

631 then, uh, just let us know. Thank you for your time. We know it's been a long
632 day.
633
634 A: Yeah, same for you guys. Sorry.
635
636 Q: No need to apologize.
637
638 A: Yeah, I - long day.
639
640 Q: That's it. I had too much coverage, I think.
641
642 A: All right.
643
644 Q: Um, we'll go and stop recorder. It's approximately 2:37 am.
645
646 A: (Unintelligible) before.
647
648 Q: It's all right. Do you guys need anything?
649
650 Q1: No, I'm good.
651
652 A: I get it. To be honest, are we - are we good to go? Only thing, I - I have a
653 childcare. I am supposed to be at my house at 1006 because my wife has
654 mandatory - I'm actually taking a day off tomorrow so if not, it's fine. I just
655 need to call. I got to get my brother-in-law en route.
656
657 Q: Um, as far as we are concerned, we are done with you.
658
659 A: Okay.
660
661 Q: Um, I don't know what your agency has waiting for you once you part our
662 doors.
663
664 A: Yeah. I actually I can't miss out (unintelligible)
665
666 Q: And hopefully they'll give some of that to you and your family needs. I don't
667 see why they wouldn't.
668
669 A: Yeah.
670
671 Q: Um, but let's see after the call.
672
673 A: Yeah.
674
675 Q: Um, but once you do part here, you do have the phone with you.

676
677 A: Yeah.
678
679 Q: If you need anything, just, you know, I've been there before. You'll be home
680 tomorrow sitting on the couch and I'll go - it'll hit you.
681
682 A: Yeah.
683
684 Q: Um, feel free to give me a call.
685
686 A: Okay. All right.
687
688 Q: Uh, Sergeant Carrasco a call, um, it's just a matter of me just putting the
689 pieces of the puzzle together and that's all we're doing, so, you know, other
