18	also advised us S1 had abrasion marks on her forehead
19	and face area, potentially the result of her falling to the ground

28	The projectile entering the top of S1 right breast exited her
29	body at the bottom of her right breast, and then re-entered in the

3	The projectile entering S1 lower left abdomen area exited and
4	then re-entered in her left hip area. The projectile came to rest
5	lodged in her left femur/buttocks area.
6	
7	provided the three projectiles to CSI Detective Leonard as
8	evidence. See CSI Detective Leonard's supplemental report for
9	further information.
10	
11	As provided information on the three projectiles, he stated
12	all three were not necessarily lethal shots. However, as a result of
13	the shots, the blood from the wounds had pooled/collected in S1
14	lungs and filled them up, causing death. The autopsy was
15	completed at 1115 hours.
16	
17	Prior to leaving the Medical Examiner's Office, I spoke to the clerk
18	at the front desk. She told me a subject identifying himself as
19	had contacted their office, identified himself as S1

	Later in the investigation, I was able to contact by telephone to
	ask if she would provide a statement. She asked if she could speak
3	with W33 prior to providing a statement to make sure it was all
4	right. However, upon contacting again a few weeks later, she did
5	not want to provide any information.
6	
7	W33 had also provided contact information for , stating he
8	had a similar conversation with him while he was at work and prior to
9	going home on 11/16/13. However, when came to pick W33
10	up from Sheriff's Headquarters, he was extremely upset and did not
11	appear to be prepared to provide a statement. Despite my attempts to
12	contact him by telephone at a later time, I was unable to make any
13	further contact with him or obtain a statement.
14	
15	In continued investigation into this incident, I came across a
16	newspaper article printed on 11/23/13 on the website, ¿Fugitive.com¿
17	(Bay City news, Inc.). At the end of the article, the writer
18	identified ¿a friend¿ of S1 by the name of who
19	stated, had been drinking that evening and had been
20	in a domestic dispute with her husband.¿ I took this information as
21	verification that W33 had spoken to and provided details
22	into the argument he had previously talked about during our
23	interview, but I did not have any further information. I submitted a
24	printed copy of the news article as an attachment to this
25	supplemental report.

27	At approximately 1710 hours, I was contacted by Sergeant McAllister
28	who advised me a copy of the autopsy photographs and X-rays were
29	ready for pick up at the Medical Examiner's Office.

I provided him with a copy 12 of the disc containing crime scene photographs so that he may include 13 photos with the LEICA Scanstation evidence. At approximately 1430 14 hours, CSI Detective Welch provided me with a DVD copy of the 15 completed LEICA Scanstation evidence, which included overall crime 16 scene scans and photographs. 1	On 11/20/13 at approximately 0700 hours, I picked up a CD containing
2	the Sheriff's radio dispatch and 911 caller recordings at County

23	employee of the company handling the lawsuit and worker's
24	compensation claim S1 had made against her previous employer.

11	On the morning of $11/25/13$, I was able to review all written reports
12	completed to that point and determined a canvass had been completed
13	for possible video surveillance in the area at the time of the
14	incident, but no video footage had been located. At approximately
15	1400 hours, I returned to the area and contacted some of the
16	businesses near the south end of Cleveland Avenue to see if they
17	would have video surveillance of the area surrounding
18	•
19	
20	The "Puff-N-Stuff" tobacco shop located on the northwest corner of San
21	Carlos and Cleveland Avenues did not have functioning video
22	surveillance equipment at the time of this incident. The "San Carlos
23	Appliance" center on the northeast corner of San Carlos and Cleveland
24	Avenues did have video surveillance camera operating at the time of
25	the incident, but the cameras only covered an area encompassing the
26	rear parking lot of the business and was
27	completely out of range for these cameras. I was unable to locate
28	any further possible video surveillance in the area.

30	On 12/18/13, Sergeant Carrasco received the returns from the Facebook

6	For future reference, Sergeant Carrasco placed this information onto
7	two Compact Discs (CDs) and provided them to me. One copy of this CD
8	was submitted as an attachment to this supplemental report.

10	EVIDENCE:

12	I packaged the other CD copy of S1 Facebook search warrant
13	returns and submitted it as evidence to the Sheriff's Headquarters
14	Evidence Room.
15	
16	INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:
17	
18	On 12/18/13 at approximately 1625 hours, I received an e-mail copy of
19	the County Crime Lab report for the functionality testing completed
20	on V1 Galan's firearm. The lab report stated the firearm "functioned
21	normally during test firing and the trigger safety was operational".
22	It also stated there was no blood evidence located anywhere on the
	firearm. A copy of this report was submitted as an attachment to
	this supplemental report.
25	
	On 12/24/13 at approximately 1130 hours, I completed the required
	State of California Death in Custody Reporting Form and faxed it to
	the Department of Justice. I was later contacted by the Department
	of Justice and asked complete the U.S. Department of Justice
	Arrest-Related Death Incident Report. I completed this form and

1	submitted it back to the Department of Justice. Copies of both forms
2	were submitted as attachments to this supplemental report.

4	At approximately 1355 hours, I returned a previous telephone call from
5	W33 , who stated he had questions concerning the items removed
6	from the residence by deputies during the investigation. One of W33
7	questions had to do with items that were seized by deputies,
8	such as his guitars, that were not listed on the property sheet
9	previously left in his residence when deputies cleared the scene. I
10	explained to W33 that the items located outside of the
11	residence were located and seized as evidence not related to the
12	search warrant, and therefore would not be listed on the property
13	sheets. However, any items located inside of the residence were
14	located pursuant to the search warrant and would be listed on the
15	property sheets left by the deputies. W33 stated he understood
16	the difference and made a request to have whatever items that could
17	be returned to him done so whenever possible. We ended our
18	conversation.
19	
20	During investigation, I began to prepare a "Search Warrant by Special
21	Master" to obtain the full medical and mental health medical records
22	for S1 . During this time, I spoke with a representative from
23	the records division at Kaiser-Permanente Medical Group who stated
24	they would accept a standard Release of Medical Records and
25	Information request if it was signed by W33 as S1
26	husband. Due to this, I decided to try and contact W33 to see
27	if he would sign the records release form.
28	
29	On 02/07/14 at approximately 1700 hours, Sergeant McAllister and I
30	went to and made contact with W33 as he was

	form. W33 immediately said he had spoken to an attorney who
4	had instructed him not to speak with us regarding this case and,

6	thought he should ask his attorney before making any decisions. I
7	made sure W33 had my contact information and asked him to
8	contact me when he knew whether or not he would sign the release
9	form. W33 later confirmed that he would not be signing the
10	Release of Medical Record Information Form, on advice from his
11	attorney.
12	
13	Just prior to ending our conversation, I happened to ask W33
14	about the health problems he had previously talked about having back
15	when this incident originally occurred. W33 told me his
16	doctors were able to determine his previous health problems, which S1
17	had thought were diseases he contracted while being unfaithful
18	to her, were actually attributed to "Celiac Disease"; an allergy to
19	gluten leading to damage of his intestines. W33 had begun a
20	new diet, which seemed to be improving his health and helping him
21	feel better.
22	
23	On 02/21/14, I completed a Special Master Search Warrant to request S1
24	complete medical records from 01/01/09 through 11/16/13 from
25	Kaiser-Permanente Medical Group. Included in this Special Master
26	Warrant was a request for Kaiser-Permanente Medical Group to provide
27	s1 mental health records from 01/01/07 through 11/16/13.
28	Attorney Kandis Scott was named as the Special Master in the search
29	warrant. This search warrant was presented to Judge C Sevely of the
30	Santa Clara County Superior Court on 02/24/14, which she signed

7	W33 and S1 took the doctor's advice and she began to see
8	a psychiatrist for help. On the day S1 had an appointment
9	with her psychiatrist, W33 actually had to work and could not
10	go with her. When he arrived home from work, S1 was not

12	found out the psychiatrist had S1 "locked up". Although
13	he did not know why, W33 determined the doctor took S1

12	her as "normal", but "stubborn" and "very opinionated".

14	W33 stated S1 smokes medical marijuana to help with the
15	pain related to her MS. S1 has told W33 that she does
16	not suffer from as much pain and is able to do things as normal when
17	she is smoking medical marijuana. However, S1 smokes a lot of
18	marijuana and spends over \$1,000 per month in buying medical
19	marijuana for her pain. W33 stated, "She's been smoking it

21	and uh, I feel I see a change in her."

23	I asked W33 if he felt the change he saw in S1 was for
24	better or for worse, and he said "Worse. Ya know, but she doesn't

8	had a hard time trusting other people, including him, because of the

13	When W33 and S1 would argue, it was mostly a verbal
14	argument with W33 trying to convince S1 of his

24	W33 said, "What are you talking about? Let me in."
25	
26	S1 said "No", and continued to try and keep the door shut to
27	prevent W33 from getting in. Just as W33 was able to get
28	the door open enough to look inside (using his hands, he showed us a
29	space of approximately 8 - 10 inches wide), he could see S1
30	standing there. She yelled, "I don't recognize you! I don't know
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1	who you are!"
2	
3	W33 could see that S1 had a steak knife in her hand as
4	she was by the door, yelling at him, "I don't know you! I don't
5	recognize you! Get outta here!" He demonstrated how S1 was
6	holding the knife by holding his hand up near his head, as if he was
7	holding a knife, and motioned downward in a stabbing motion, telling
8	us it was what she was doing as she yelled at him.
9	
10	W33 described being "freaked out" and said he had never seen S1
11	like this in the past. He did not think S1 would ever
12	be a person to harm someone else, especially since she had such a
13	history of being a victim of violence and was so against it. W33
14	said S1 has never hit him in the past and he could not
15	remember her raising her hand to anyone else in a violent way.
16	
17	W33 backed away and let the door close. Not knowing what was
18	going on or what he was going to do, he made his way back to the van
19	in the driveway. W33 had planned on sleeping in the van,
20	hoping S1 would eventually come out and invite him to come
21	back inside.
22	
23	After thinking about it for a few minutes, W33 realized he had
24	to be at work the next morning and did not want to be late for his
25	shift. Thinking it would be easier to just drive to work and sleep
26	in the van in the parking lot at his job site, he started the van and
27	prepared to leave.
28	
29	Just as W33 was starting to back out of the driveway, he looked
30	back up at the apartment to see S1 come outside and start
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	lking toward him. He stopped the van and rolled the window down a
2 li	ttle bit to talk to S1 However, S1 came up to the
3 va :	n and yelled, "I don't know who you are. What are you doing with
4 my	van? Don't take my van!" Knowing the situation had gone too far
5 fo	r him to be able to go back into the house with S1 W33
6	again started to back out of the driveway.
7	
8 s1	turned and went back into the house. As W33 backed
9 in	to the street and was just about to put the van into drive and pull
10 aw	ray, he looked and saw S1 come back out of the house with his
11 gu	itar in her hand.
12	
13 w3	3 "couldn't believe" what he was seeing as he watched S1
14	swing the guitar and "smash it" on the handrail of the porch
15 in	front of the apartment. He said he was "shocked" and had "tears
16 in	his eyes" as he watched what was happening with S1 . He put
17 th	e van into drive and simply drove away as S1 continued to
18 br	eak the guitar on the porch.
19	
20 I	asked W33 if he thought S1 had ever come out of the
21 ho	use while he was in the van the first time, sleeping for
22 ap	proximately an hour or so. He said he did not think so because he
23 fe	It he would have heard her. He had left the door to the van
24 un	locked in the event she would want to come in and talk to him, but
25 sh	e never did. W33 had parked the van in the northern most
26 pa	rt of the driveway, with a clear view of the front porch, but he
27 ne	ver saw or heard S1 come out of the house during the first
28 pe	riod of time he was in the van.
29	
30 w3	3 could not remember if the lights were on inside the house
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1	when he welled up the people and twied to get in but he teld up C1
	when he walked up the porch and tried to get in, but he told us S1
2	
3	described how he could feel the key turning in his hand as he was
4	unlocking the deadbolt, but S1 was turning the lock back the
5	other way. W33 had not heard S1 walk up to the door as
6	he was trying to unlock it, but also mentioned how she normally sits
7	right next to the door and might have stood up when she heard him
8	coming up the porch.
9	
10	W33 initially tried to open the door, not knowing S1 was
11	there. It opened just a little bit, but then quickly closed. This
12	is what told W33 that S1 was there holding it shut. He
13	applied quite a bit more pressure in an effort to get it open. As it
14	was open approximately 8 inches, as W33 had previously
15	described, he could look in through the opening. This is when he saw
16	S1 standing on the other side, holding a steak knife. Again,
17	W33 motioned with his hand to show how S1 was holding
18	the knife and what she was doing. He held his left hand up by his
19	head as if he was holding a knife and said, "And she was like this ya
20	know, as if she was going to do something."
21	
22	W33 stated he felt certain S1 would not hurt him with the
23	knife, but he had never seen her do anything like that and it
24	"shocked" him. I pointed out to W33 that he had made the
25	demonstration with his left hand and asked if S1 had been
26	holding the knife in her left hand. He said he didn't know, but it
27	seemed like it in his memory, which was unusual because S1 was
28	right handed.
29	
30	To help, I asked W33 how the front door to his apartment
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	normally opened. He said the door would open up to the left if he
2	was standing outside and trying to get in. I next asked W33
3	if, since he had the door open approximately 8 inches, he could see
4	s1 entire body or just a portion of it. W33 stated he
5	could only see S1 face and hand as he stood there looking
6	through the slightly open front door. He did not focus on anything
7	in particular as he was looking through the door, except trying to
8	talk to S1 and get into the house. He also did not notice
9	whether or not there were lights on in the house, but mentioned that
10	s1 was not the type of person to normally sit in a dark room.
11	She preferred to have a lot of lights on wherever she was; therefore
12	he assumed there were lights on inside the house.
13	
14	For clarification, I asked W33 about the motions S1 was
15	making with the steak knife while he could see her through the open
16	door. W33 said she was not really making a stabbing downward
17	motion with the knife, but rather "shaking" it back and forth a
18	little bit. He thought it looked like a normal steak knife, but
19	didn't really look at it enough to describe it or recognize where it
20	came from. He estimated the amount of time he stood there with the
21	door open to be approximately 3 seconds, which was not long enough
22	for him to see the knife and everything else that was happening. He
23	said he was in "shock" and knew he did not want to try to go into the
24	house with the way things were. The door shut and W33 walked
25	away, toward the van. W33 described this interaction between
26	him and S1 as "out of character" for S1 and
27	"bizarre".
28	
29	W33 estimated he waited for less than a minute before starting
30	the van. He knew he could not solve the problem if he wasn't there,
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1 but also recognized he did not know what to do to help this	
2 situation. Although he wanted to stay at the house and wanted to be	
3 with his wife, he felt S1 was going to be screaming and	
4 yelling at him the whole time. W33 waited in the van for a	
5 couple of minutes, hoping S1 would come outside and want to	
6 reconcile or be like a "normal couple", but she did not.	
7	
8 W33 started to back the van out of the driveway, in a direction	
9 to take him northbound and up to Olive Avenue. As he was backing	
10 out, S1 came out of the house and started to approach him.	
11 W33 did not think S1 had anything in her hand at that	
12 time, but also said he was not looking to see if she was carrying	
13 anything, particularly the steak knife.	
14	
15 The van was only partially backed out of the driveway, with the front	
16 of the van still in the driveway and the rear of the van in the	
17 roadway. W33 rolled the window down to talk to S1 but	
18 only a couple of inches. He did this to prevent S1 from	
19 trying to open the door or take the keys from him while he was in the	
20 car, which she had done during previous arguments. If S1 was	
21 going to be friendly, W33 knew he could just stop and open the	
22 door the rest of the way to talk to her. If she was still going to	
23 be upset, W33 could maintain the distance between them by	
24 speaking through the gap in the window and leave without any	
25 problems.	
26	
27 W33 still maintained that he was not in fear of S1 but	
28 if she was not going to stop what she was doing, then he just wanted	
29 to leave. He clarified that he did not open the door and left only a	
30 small gap in the window to keep S1 out of the van so she could	
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1	not prevent him from leaving. He added that he was not in fear at
2	the time he was standing at the front door to the apartment and S1
3	was displaying the steak knife at him. He stated he was "in
4	shock" and made the decision to let the door close, but he was not
5	fearful because he did not think she would harm anybody.
6	
7	W33 estimated the interaction between he and S1 at the
8	van door only lasted for approximately 30 seconds or so. He could
9	not recall exactly what she was saying at that time and said it
10	didn't make sense to him, but thought it had something to do with him
11	not taking the van. W33 tried to explain that it was him and
12	asked S1 what was wrong, but he knew she didn't recognize him.
13	He assumed she knew it was him, but was saying stuff to make him mad
14	because it did not make sense to him that she would not know who he
15	was. Once he realized the situation had not improved and was getting
16	worse, he decided to just leave. He slowly backed the van out of the
17	driveway while S1 walked up the porch and into the house.
18	Once he was backed out of the driveway, W33 paused for a
19	second, still not knowing what to do.
20	
21	I asked W33 to describe S1 mood and the look on her
22	face while this was happening. He stated, "It was something I'd
23	never seen before. It was, it was scary to me. Scary in the
24	fact that I was worried for her, ya know, our relationship didn't
25	seem normal. I mean, ya can't have a conversation with someone when
26	they're, kinda in that state. She didn't seem like she was in the
27	state of 'Let's discuss something'. It wasn't gonna happen."
28	
29	As W33 sat in this van, in the roadway, he looked up at the
30	apartment and saw S1 come back out of the house. As she came
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1	out of the house, she was carrying one of W33 guitars with
	her. W33 heard a noise coming from the porch area, and when he
	looked closer to what S1 was doing, he realized she was
	smashing his guitar on the railing of the porch. He knew things had
	gotten to the point where they could not be repaired with a
	conversation right at that time, so he drove away from his residence
8	and up to his workplace in Fremont.
	One have in Francis W22
	Once he was in Fremont, W33 parked his van in the parking lot
	and tried to go right to sleep. He estimated it was approximately
	0100 hours when he arrived. He did not return home that night or
	throughout the next day because he was working his normal shift. He
13	also had not tried to call S1 at home and had not heard from
14	her all day long.
15	
16	At the end of his shift, which was approximately 1200 hours, W33
17	called a mutual friend of his and S1 , by the name of ,
18	for help. W33 confided in and told her the problems he had
19	with S1 the previous night. He told about the recent
20	history concerning the relationship and S1 beliefs of W33
21	being unfaithful. After hearing this, tried to call S1
22	at home, but did not receive an answer. told W33
23	there was no answer at the house, but also said she had been trying
24	to get a hold of S1 all week without any success.
25	
26	At approximately 1400 hours, W33 still did not know what to do,
27	so he decided to try and call S1 himself. Upon calling home,
28	there was no answer. He left a message for S1 telling her he
29	loved her, missed her, and wanted to come home.
30	
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1	Since S1 did not answer W33 call, he was still unsure
2	if he should go home. He called his friend , whom he also told
3	of the events surrounding the previous night. W33 told us he
4	felt desperate and worried about his relationship. gave W33
5	whatever advice he could and offered to have W33 come to
6	his house. W33 declined the offer, stating he was not in the
7	mood to visit with friends and pretend as if everything was fine.
8	Although W33 was hoping could go by the apartment on
9	Cleveland Avenue to check on S1 , he never mentioned this and
10	never offered. They ended their conversation and W33
11	never spoke to again.
12	
13	After speaking with and W33 took a shower at his
14	workplace to clean up. He then decided to drive to San Jose to pick
15	up a prescription that was ready for him at Safeway. W33 also
16	picked up something to eat at a nearby Burger King so that he could
17	take his medications with food. After eating, he decided to drive
18	passed his house to see if S1 truck was there. However, as
19	he pulled up to Cleveland Avenue, he saw the Sheriff's Office crime
20	scene tape and began to wonder what was going on.
21	
22	W33 mentioned being scared of what was happening because he did
23	not know what was going on and he had not been provided with any
24	information. He agreed to provide me with and telephone
25	numbers so that I may contact them in the future, if needed.
26	
27	Sergeant Leon took this chance to ask W33 a few questions. He
28	asked W33 if he could remember the names of the medications S1
29	was forced to take when she was at the psychiatric hospital in
30	Fremont. Although he could not recall the names of the medications,
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1	he did say S1 acted strange for a period of time after being
	released from the hospital. He described S1 talking to
3	herself, similar to the way she recently was but "not as crazy, she
4	wasn't talking very loud, but she was talking to herself". W33
5	would try to ask S1 what she was saying or what she was
6	talking about, but she was able to explain to him that the
7	medications she had been forced to take were what was making her act
8	that way.
9	
10	W33 also mentioned that the hospital staff had told S1
11	that she had a urinary tract infection while she was at the hospital.
12	As she was being discharged from the hospital, nurses gave her
13	medications, stating they were to treat the infection. S1 was
14	skeptical of this, even telling the nurses, "Yeah right. You don't
15	think I know what this is?" S1 took the medications home, but
16	refused to ever take any of them.
17	
18	Since then, S1 would not take any forms of drugs or
19	medications, including any types of aspirin for a headache. She told
20	W33 the drugs would worsen her pain and advance her MS.
21	Sergeant Leon asked about the medicinal marijuana W33 had
22	earlier mentioned S1 using. W33 said S1 had
23	claimed it actually helped her pain. Although it was expensive, S1
24	had a "card" and W33 did not want to complain about
25	anything that would prevent his wife from being in constant pain.
26	
27	Sergeant Leon asked W33 about S1 drinking alcohol. W33
28	said S1 was not a constant drinker and could stop
29	drinking whenever she wanted, such as the months prior to the
30	previous week. At times in the past, W33 would get upset with
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1 S1 because she would drink by herself for no reason, but for
2 the most part S1 would only drink every so often. When S1
drank, her behavior would change, but only in a verbal way.
4 W33 said S1 would become verbally abusive and could be
5 very hurtful to others. This behavior was certain to occur when S1
6 would drink. Although it could still happen when she was not
7 drunk, it was not such a sure thing and would come and go with her
8 mood.
9
10 W33 told us S1 would normally just drink beer and that
11 they always had it available in the house. S1 would not
12 recognize that her behavior would become so abusive when she had been
13 drinking. It would only take S1 consuming 1 beer before she
14 would already start to change her behavior and start becoming hurtful
15 with her words toward others. W33 had tried to point this out
16 to her in the past, but she would become upset with him, become
17 offended, and deny the claims. W33 learned to not say anything
18 to S1 about her issues with drinking and started to "just live
19 with it" to avoid problems.
20
21 Sergeant Leon tried to have W33 describe the way S1 would
22 physically change while she was drinking. He said she would have a
23 lot of body language, she would become louder, her eyes would bulge
24 out, but he also thought a normal drunk person would act in a similar
25 way. At times, S1 would try to "close the space" between her
26 and him, which W33 described by saying she would "get right in
27 your face". W33 admitted S1 would act this way with
28 him, but when someone else was around, she would not treat them the
29 same way.
30
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1 W33 admitted S1 would "say whatever she had to say to win
2 the argument or to one up you". He described conversations he had
3 with her about being truthful and not being able to solve things if
4 everyone was lying about what was happening. However, ${ t S1}$
5 would be defiant toward others and say anything necessary to win an
6 argument, including denying she was lying about something when W33
7 would point it out. W33 even went on to say S1
8 could be "verbally bullying" when she had been drinking.
9
10 Sergeant Leon went back to W33 previous statement about S1
11 displaying the steak knife and telling him she did not know
12 who he was. He asked W33 if he thought S1 was being
13 truthful about that or if he thought S1 honestly did not
14 recognize him.
15
16 W33 stated, "Ya know, I wasn't sure at that point because like I
17 said, she, for a couple days she'd been acting very strange, so I
18 mean, it's possible that she didn't. But I, ya know, with the, the,
19 like I said, she could say a lot of hurtful things. Uh, my belief,
20 ya know, was just that she was just saying that, but obviously knew
21 it was me, but was saying that to make me mad or whatever. I, but we
22 were looking at each other right in the face."
23
24 W33 could not say whether or not he saw "recognition" in S1
face, but said he did not think it would be logical for her
26 not to recognize him. He again talked about how S1 had been
27 acting "weird" in the previous days and how she would say whatever
28 she wanted to say, just to get her point across, whether she believed
29 it or not.
30
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	W33 started to recall some of the things that were happening as
	he was trying to open the door and get into his apartment. He talked
	about how S1 kept saying "pound cake, pound cake". W33
4	did not know what this meant and did not know why S1 was
5	saying it. S1 also kept calling out for the neighbor's dog
6	"Boston" to come to her aid. According to W33 S1 was
7	saying some "weird stuff" as he was trying to get in, such as "No,
8	no, no, don't come in. Help, help. I don't know who you are." and
9	"Next door, next door. Boston, Boston." W33 was confused as
10	to why S1 was calling the neighbor or the dog, but again said
11	S1 actions were "not her". He decided he should go since he
12	would not be able to talk with S1 and solve the problems they
13	were having that night.
14	
15	Sergeant Leon asked W33 if he thought S1 would have
16	actually stabbed him with the knife she was holding, if he continued
17	to try and get into the house. W33 said he did not think S1
18	would ever actually stab him. He described her as "peaceful"
19	and tried to show us how he was not very far from S1 during
20	the exchange they had at the door. With this information, Sergeant
21	Leon pointed out that they would have been able to clearly see each
22	other through the doorway since they were so close. W33 agreed
23	and said he could see S1 face for as long as 10 seconds as
24	he was looking through the doorway.
25	
26	W33 talked about some of the things S1 had been saying in
27	the previous week. He said she was saying some extremely hurtful
28	things and he had begun to think she was saying them to him or about
29	him. He had tried to avoid being around S1 for a couple of
30	days, including going to a different room when she walked into
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	whatever room he was in. He described her as someone who does not
	normally curse or use foul language. However, in the previous week
3	she was using extremely foul language and was swearing at anyone she
4	would talk to. He said she would swear at him, God, or other people
5	in Heaven.
6	
7	Sergeant Leon asked W33 how he thought S1 would have
8	reacted if Sheriff's Deputies would have shown up at the house the
9	previous night. At first, W33 said it would have depended on
10	whether the deputies believed his story or her story as to what
11	happened. Sergeant Leon clarified his question to be whether or not
12	he felt S1 would have been accepting of the deputies, their
13	presence, and what they were doing. W33 answered by saying he
14	would not know what her reaction would have been if she had been
15	drinking. However, if S1 was sober, W33 felt she would
16	have been able to immediately "see the reality of what's going on".
17	
18	
19

Once the deputies 9 left the house, with W33 still there with S1 , she would 10 again become verbally abusive as if they never came to begin with. thought the best solution was to leave for the night so 12 that things would calm down and they would be able to go back to a 13 normal life together. 14 15 **w33** talked about S1 being sent to the Fremont Hospital by 16 the Kaiser Psychiatrist. He never heard much about the incident 17 after it happened, but he was able to see some of the paperwork from 18 the visit that resulting in S1 commitment to the hospital. 19 He said the paperwork appeared as if the psychiatrist mistook S1 20 for someone else and was asking questions pertaining to the 21 other patient. This upset S1 s1 had also brought 22 pictures with her to an appointment, which she interpreted to be "the 23 hand of God". This was met with negative results by the 24 psychiatrist, which eventually led to her being taken the Fremont 25 Hospital. W33 could understand why S1 was so upset with 26 the treatment by Kaiser, but he did not know how it led to her 27 commitment to the hospital in Fremont. 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1 pain related problems, including her neck and head pain. When the
2 doctors suggested S1 see a psychiatrist to assist with these
3 pain related issues, W33 took it as good advice and encouraged
4 S1 to seek this assistance. He did not know it would result
5 in her commitment to the Fremont Hospital.

7 We asked W33 if there was anything, other than the guitar he had
8 previously mentioned, that S1 destroyed or broke during this
9 argument. W33 did not see S1 actually break anything
10 else, but did mention a small ukulele type guitar he had seen lying
11 on the porch. As he was in his van in the driveway, he actually
12 heard S1 kick the ukulele as she was coming out of the house,
13 which drew his attention to the porch. Upon seeing S1 on the
14 porch with his guitar, breaking it over the railing, he thought it
15 was "the last straw". Thinking S1 $$

17 He drove away thinking it would show S1 she was doing it for

21 Sergeant Leon verified that W33 had call the apartment to

23 could not simply go home on his own. W33 reiterated he had
24 never seen S1 acting like she did the night before. He has
25 left the house in the past, to get away from an argument or stop S1
from verbally abusing him. A short time later, he would start
27 to miss S1 and return home to be with her. Upon arriving home
28 however, he discovered S1 was not over what had occurred and
29 the argument would start all over again. As a result of this, W33
30 knew he had to wait long periods of time, until S1 was

	W33 stated S1 behavior had progressively become worse
	over the previous 3-4 days, with the previous night being the worst
	he had ever seen her act. Sergeant Leon asked if W33 felt,
	with S1 behavior worsening, he should try to encourage her
9	to go back to see another psychiatrist. W33 said had
10	actually discussed this with him during their previous conversation,
11	but he felt it would be hard for him to do because he loved her so
12	much. People had described S1 as "crazy" in the past and she
13	had gone to great lengths to prove them wrong. W33 wanted to
14	be on S1 side through all of that and felt he would be
15	"stabbing her in the back" if he was to approach her about going back
16	to a psychiatrist.
17	
18	Sergeant Leon attempted to clarify what he was saying and tried to
19	reassure W33 that he was not calling S1 "crazy". To
20	this, W33 stated, "Well, it's like this. Between us, she is a
21	little crazy, I think, but, uh, you know, I love her anyway." W33
22	tried to continue, but lost his train of thought.
23	
24	After some brief conversation, we took a break from W33
25	statement. Just prior to the break, I showed W33 a photograph
26	I had previously printed of S1 driver's license picture and
27	asked him who it was in the photo. W33 immediately identified
28	the person in the photograph as S1 . He also showed us some of
29	the family photographs he carries with him. I asked if S1 had
30	any children, to which W33 said she had a son and a daughter
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1	whom he believed live in Nevada. He identified S1 son as
2	, but said he did not know where he lived in Nevada. He
3	identified S1 daughter as and said she
4	previously lived in Elko, Nevada, but he did not know if she was
5	still there.
6	
7	We took a break from the interview and all left the room.
8	Approximately 17 minutes later, we returned to the interview room and
9	continued speaking with W33
10	
11	Upon resuming our conversation, I asked W33 further questions
12	about S1 marijuana usage. He stated she possesses a card
13	for the use of medicinal marijuana to assist with pain management.
14	She usually purchases her marijuana from a business called the San
15	Jose Patients Group, located on The Alameda in San Jose. Although
16	W33 has driven S1 to the business so she could buy
17	marijuana, he has never been inside of the business because he does
18	not possess a card for the usage of marijuana. W33 was unsure
19	of how often S1 would go to the Patients Group to buy
20	marijuana because she normally goes while he is at work. However, he
21	has found a few bills around the house in relation to S1
22	medicinal marijuana purchases and was able to estimate she spends
23	over \$1,000 a month on marijuana. S1 receives disability
	checks every month in the amount of \$1,200 and W33 estimated
	she spends nearly all of this money on purchasing medicinal
	marijuana.
27	
	I asked W33 if he thought S1 may have smoked marijuana
	during the day on Friday, while he was at work. He stated he was at
30	work all day and did not know if she smoked while he was working, or
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1 before he left for work. When he get home the went right into the
1 before he left for work. When he got home, she went right into the
2 bathroom and he did not see if she was smoking then. He did not see
3 S1 again that night until the altercations took place at the
4 doorway of the apartment. However, W33 made it a point to tell
5 us "She smokes every day, all day long." He talked about how she has
6 a marijuana cigarette in her hand at all times and it has come to the
7 point where he does not even notice it anymore because it has become
8 so normal.
9
10 At this point in the interview, neither Sergeant Leon nor I had any
11 further questions for W33 $$. Upon my initial contact with W33
12 he had asked what was going on at his house and what had
13 happened to his wife. As I had promised him at the time of this
14 contact, I began to tell W33 of the events from the previous
15 night after he left and drove to his workplace in Fremont to sleep.
16 This included the notification to him that Sheriff's Deputies on the
17 scene of the call had discharged their firearms as a result of a
18 threat from S1 as she confronted them with the steak knife, as
19 well as the fact that S1 had passed away as a result of the
20 incident.

22 W33 immediately began to cry. I passed on condolences to W33
23 to which he thanked me for. I tried to assure W33 of
24 the investigation we were conducting, why it was being done, and let
25 him know we were trying to determine why these events took place the
26 way they had. As I continued to talk, W33 looked at me and
27 asked, "She's passed away, huh?" I confirmed with W33 that S1
had passed away and he continued to cry.

12	Over the next hour, we talked with W33 about various aspects of
13	the investigation, his life with S1 her previous problems,
14	and we continued to try and comfort him. W33 talked about how
15	S1 would not hurt anyone, even if she had a knife, but he did
16	say he knew the officers would not know this about her. He talked
17	about the deputies not realizing S1 would not have hurt them,
18	them not knowing she had never been violent with others, and they
19	could not know that the fact S1 having a knife did not mean
20	she would hurt them with it. W33 said "I feel for them too"

V1 Galan was currently assigned as the "61B1" 2 unit, which is a unit covering the Bascom Avenue and San Carlos 3 Avenue areas of Central San Jose. V1 Galan has been assigned to this 4 midnight shift since returning from Parks Patrol in October, and 5 working the 61B1 beat for the previous 2-3 weeks. Approximately a 6 week ago, V2 Brown came to work in the Central San Jose area, and has 7 been working there ever since. 8 9 V1 Galan said she does not normally have much trouble sleeping during 10 the day, in preparation for her night shifts. She tries to go to sleep as soon as she gets home from work and will normally sleep for approximately 7-8 hours. In the week prior to this incident, V1 13 Galan was able to get some rest on Tuesday prior to coming in for her 14 first shift of the week. 1 When V1 Galan arrived for her scheduled shift on Thursday night, she 2 was advised there would not be a briefing due to a "shots fired" call 3 on the East side of San Jose. Midnight personnel were advised to 4 load their duty gear and respond to the scene as soon as possible. $5\,$ V1 Galan learned the incident was a Homicide detail that had occurred 6 in Sheriff's Office jurisdiction. She checked in at the Command Post for the incident and was assigned to canvass the area in search of 8 possible video surveillance of the incident. 10 During her canvass of the area, V1 Galan located video surveillance from a residence that showed the entire Homicide incident. 12 viewed the video, saw the incident take place as captured by the 13 video surveillance, and stayed at that location until another deputy could respond to collect the video as evidence. 4	I asked V1 Galan if she could estimate how close S1 got to V2
5	Brown as he was backing away from her. V1 Galan responded, "Oh God,
6	super close. Too close." V1 Galan said S1 kept the knife
7	down by her side as she advanced on V2 Brown, but she could not
8	recall if S1 ever raised the knife up or swung it at V2 Brown
9	in a threatening manner as she followed him.
10	
11	V1 Galan could not be sure why S1 changed her focus from V2
12	Brown to her and V3 Espinosa, but thought it may have been a
13	combination of a few different things. First, V1 Galan described her
14	and V3 Espinosa yelling at S1 which may have drew her
15	attention away from V2 Brown. I asked if there may have been too
16	much distance between V2 Brown and S1 after he turned to run
17	behind the parked vehicle. However, V1 Galan said S1 had
18	already turned to face her and V3 Espinosa before V2 Brown took off
19	running.
20	
21	V1 Galan described S1 walking toward her and V3 Espinosa in a
22	very "aggressive" and "confrontational" manner. Although V1 Galan
23	could not remember if she still had her flashlight in her hand or
24	not, she knew she had her firearm out and in a good shooting grip.
25	S1 was still yelling at V1 Galan and V3 Espinosa, but only
26	holding the knife down by her side as she had done earlier. When I
27	asked V1 Galan to describe the look she saw of S1 face as
28	she was advancing toward them, she quickly said, "Crazy. Mad. She
29	looked high. She looked uhm nothing we were saying was even
30	registering with her."

2 With this information, I asked V1 Galan if she thought S1

- 3 all of the commands the deputies were yelling at her throughout the

- 15 short enough that she could see V3 Espinosa over the top of the hood
- 16 of the car from where she was on the North side of the vehicle.

- 18 V1 Galan continued by telling me she kept backing up and away from S1
- 19 She eventually found there was "stuff" and "stairs" behind
- 20 her. V1 Galan again began to cry as she stated, "And she just got
- 21 really close. She came to like 4 feet from me. She was super close.
- 22 Then she raised the knife up to like her waist, chest area. That's
- 23 when I fired."

- 25 For clarification, I asked what S1 was doing with the knife
- 26 when she raised it from her side. V1 Galan said S1 did not
- 27 swing the knife, or poke at her with the knife, but she raised it up
- 28 from her side. V1 Galan told us she was in fear for her life, as
- 29 well as her partners' lives, and thought S1 was going to lunge

16	V3 Espinosa moved to V1 Galan's location to check on her welfare and
17	escort her away from the scene. V1 Galan told V3 Espinosa that they
18	needed to clear the apartment to make sure there were no other
19	threats or victims inside. V3 Espinosa again asked V1 Galan if she
20	was all right, which she said she was, but they needed to go to the
21	apartment.
22	
23	V1 Galan and V3 Espinosa cleared the apartment while V2 Brown stayed
24	outside with S1 After clearing the apartment, they holstered
25	their firearms and exited the building. V1 Galan and V3 Espinosa
26	walked passed where V2 Brown and S1 were located and to the
27	intersection of Cleveland and Olive Avenues, where V3 Espinosa left
28	V1 Galan in the care Deputy Ledesma until further contact by
29	responding investigators.

1 V1 Galan clarified that V2 Brown had handcuffed S1 prior to her 2 and V3 Espinosa going in to clear the building. Upon leaving the 3 scene, V1 Galan described V2 Brown as standing with S1 and 4 waiting for assistance. 5 6 I asked V1 Galan to describe what she saw in the apartment when she 7 and V3 Espinosa went in. She said they did not locate anyone else inside the apartment. The door to the apartment did not open all the 9 way due to large amounts of items placed behind it. Inside the front 10 door were a couch and a mirror in the first room. The kitchen was just inside the front door and to the right. There was a hallway to a doorway leading into a garage, which was also cleared. 13 hallway was a closet door, bedroom door, and bathroom door. house was in somewhat disarray, with items scattered throughout that 15 made it difficult to open some of the doors. There appeared to be 16 items thrown about the inside of the house as if there was an 17 argument inside prior to this event. 18 19 V1 Galan also described there being items left outside on the porch 20 area in front of the apartment.
