59 A: Um, an employee, Brandon Marshal had entered a conference room where
60 they had a meeting going on and...

62 Q2: 12 (unintelligible) if you can get the (unintelligible).

64 Q: Okay. Called you. Okay.
65
66 Q1: Uh, less near traffic. 10-9. Uh, 1 Victor unit ID.
67
68 Q: Okay. What - uh, why would he call you?
69
70 A: Um, he called me because in the middle of this meeting, um...
71
72 Q2: (Unintelligible) security (unintelligible).
73
74 A: ...Bran - Brandon Marshal, one of our employees entered the conference
75 room, he wasn't invited to the meeting.
76
77 Dispatch: 16 to 65...

79 A: Came in, started eating their food and popping pills, and...
80
81 Q: Was it a private meeting or?
82
83 A: It was a meeting with an outside vendor. So he was not privy to this meeting
84 or invited to the meeting, he just walked into the conference room.

86 Q: He started eating the food?
87
88 A: Yeah. And then they said he started popping pills. He was very upset, and that
89 time they informed me they dialed 911 and I turned around I came back.
90

91 Q: called 911?
92
93 A: I believe it - I'm not sure if - I'm not sure. But someone...
94
95 Q: But someone from that meeting called.
96
97 A: Yeah, someone from that meeting called 911.
98
99 Q: Was he, uh, reluctant to leave the meeting?
100
101 A: Um, I - I wasn't privy to that. I wasn't in the meeting.
102
103 Q: Oh, okay.
104
105 A: I didn't know.
106
107 Q: Did you ever make it to the conference room?
108
109 A: No. I got - by the time I got back to campus here, I found...

111 Q: You were already off - off site?
112
113 A: Yes.
114
115 Q: So you were off - when you got the call, that's through your cell phone?
116
117 A: Yup. It was - tell you exactly the time.
118
119 Q: Okay. So you were off site on, um, on lunch?
120
121 A: Yup.
122
123 Q: Okay. Okay.
124
125 A: So it's 32 minutes ago, so it would have been at 12:12.
126
127 Q: 12:12 is when, um, called you?
128
129 A: Yup.
130
131 Q: Okay.
132
133 A: That's when I hung up. But according to that but 12 - but...
134
135 Q: How - it was a pretty quick call?

136
137 A: Yeah. A very quick call.
138
139 Q: So you came back to deal with the employee?
140
141 A: Yeah. To find out - came back to deal with the employee. By the time I -
142 when I arrived back here, I saw - and walking, um, with - I'd - I - I'd
143 also informed to contact, um, Brandon's manager.
144
145 Q: You - you - you- you called him on the...
146
147 A: Well, no. When I was on the same conversation, I asked...
148
149 Q: Okay.
150
151 A: ... to get a hold of, um...
152
153 Q: His immediate supervisor?
154
155 A: His immediate supervisor to meet me back here. And when I came into the
156 parking lot, um, I met and the manager in the parking lot. We started
157 - I asked them where they were at - where Brandon was at. They said that he
158 was behind this building here, that they had called 911, and the paramedics,
159 and the fire department.
160
161 Q: So when you got here, he had already left the conference room?
162
163 A: He had already left the conference room.
164
165 Q: Okay. What - do you know what time you got here?
166
167 A: Um, gosh, it - it - I was literally maybe less than five minutes away.
168
169 Q: On...
170
171 A: I got here pretty quickly.
172
173 Q: ...site.
174
175 A: My guess is quarter after 12.
176
177 Q: So, about, uh - you said you were only about five minutes away?
178
179 A: Less than that, yeah. I was like Saratoga and Campbell, you know, kind of up
180 here.

181
182 Q: Okay. And you met, um, in the...
183
184 A: In the parking lot. Right up here from the building.
185
186 Q: And did we, uh, get the (unintelligible) on the rest of those?
187
188 Q1: On who?
189
190 Q: The rest of the people that were out here?
191
192 Q1: Where are they?
193
194 A: I think they were in a conference room. I think they're interviewing him in the
195 conference room.

197 Q: Okay. Oh, you saw somebody go with him?
198
199 Q1: Oh, is there somebody with him in there?
200
201 A: Yeah, yeah.

203 Q: Oh, okay.

205 A: I think our - our head of our facilities gave them a conference room, yeah.

207 Q: So, someone - someone from my office?

209 A: Well, yeah. Yeah.

211 Q: Oh, okay. You saw them. Okay.

213 A: Absolutely. Yeah.

240 the IT.

243 on.

273 Q: And that's when, um, told you that he had...

275 A: That they called 911 and that the paramedics and the fire truck were behind
276 the building here...

278 Q2: Control 2 (unintelligible) 1013 (unintelligible).

280 A: And so I started walking over this way to...
281
282 Q: Okay. He told you that 911 was called.
283
284 A: Yup.
285
286 Q: And the fire and medics were...
287
288 A: Were - were back here behind this building.
289
290 Q: Okay. Fire and medics were behind building.
291
292 A: Yup.
293
294 Q: This is the...
295
296 A: It would be - I think this is considered Suite D, 12980 Suite D I believe.
297
298 Q: Suite D, 12980. Okay.
299
300 A: And so started walking up the sidewalk here or the - or the driveway here to
301 come see what was going on. About this time, one of our other employees
302 drove by, um, I believe it's I'll validate that. And he said "the
303 police just shot him." And we were like, "Shot who?" And he said Brandon -
304 or he didn't know who. But that's when we came around the corner...

310 Q: Did that happen prior to you getting here or?
311
312 Dispatch: 10-1 Bravo (unintelligible).

314 A: Uh, I don't know how quickly it was. I didn't hear any guns or anything go
315 off.

317 Q: Oh, okay.

319 A: So I - I...

321 Q: So - so you - you talked to briefly and then, uh...
322
323 A: We started walking this way.
324
325 Q: And then, uh, another gentleman comes up and - and tells you. If you can just
326 - uh, if you can just repeat that for me.
327
328 A: Yeah. So, one of our employees was...
329
330 Q: Because you - you - you were only with briefly then, correct?
331
332 A: Absolutely. Absolutely.
333
334 Q: Okay. So just a - just a second. I, uh - I hate to have you repeat yourself. I
335 just...
336
337 A: No, no, no. That's fine. That's fine.
338
339 Q: So spoke with, uh, briefly and then, uh, you're not - you're not sure
340 who it was but...
341
342 A: I bel- I believe it was . I, the - it's the - he works - um, the one
343 manager of - of Brandon.
344
345 Dispatch: 10 (unintelligible) 10.

347 Q: How do you spell ?
348
349 A: Um, I think .
350
351 Q2: Can I get a...
352
353 Q: Okay.
354
355 Q2: Actually (unintelligible).
356
357 A: Okay. Who was driving by in his car leaving for lunch and had said they just
358 shot him.

360 Dispatch: (Unintelligible).

362 Q: Oh, so you were having your conversation with and he comes...
363
364 A: Walking up and he was driving by.
365
366 Q: ...he comes by and that's, you know, "Hey, this is what happened."
367
368 Q1: (Unintelligible).

370 A: Yeah, yeah.
371
372 Q: Okay. So drives by...
373
374 A: Mm-hm.
375
376 Q: ...in car.
377
378 A: Mm-hm.
379
380 Q: And he said exact - what did he say exactly?
381
382 Dispatch: 72 Bravo 6 (unintelligible) living room window.
383
384 A: I think he said, "They shot him."
385
386 Q2: 10-4.
387
388 A: Um, to be honest, it wasn't registering with me at the second.
389
390 Q: Did he, uh - did he - where's ?
391
392 A: So, um, I asked the manager to call him and tell him to come back to the
393 property.
394
395 Q: Okay. Is - is he back, do you know?
396
397 A: I don't know. I've been here...
398
399 Q2: 1012 (unintelligible).
400
401 Q: Okay.
402
403 A: Um, that's his manager right there. I can find out, but...
404
405 Q: Okay.

406
407 A: ...um, they asked him to come back because they - I don't - I don't know if he
408 saw anything.
409
410 Q: You - you did not see or hear anything, correct?
411
412 A: I did not see or hear anything.
413
414 Dispatch: 7110, go ahead.
415
416 A: Um, when I came around the corner, the...
417
418 Q1: Yes. Uh...
419
420 Q: Just a second. So...
421
422 A: Sure.
423
424 Q1: ...if you can get a hold of the deputy that (unintelligible) with the suspect.
425 There should be two deputies. Have one of those - one of the deputies need to
426 give me a 10-21.
427
428 Q: Did, uh, tell you anything else or?
429
430 Dispatch: (Unintelligible) control.
431
432 A: Yeah. Well - yeah. He was saying that - when I asked him what happened...
433
434 Q1: (Unintelligible) go with the last four.
435
436 A: ...as we were walking and he said, you know, it was strangest thing he's ever
437 seen. The guy just comes and...
438
439 Q: Where were you guys walking to?
440
441 Dispatch: (Unintelligible).
442
443 A: Were walking this way at this - up the street to down...
444
445 Q: To where the medics were?
446
447 A: Yeah. Yeah.
448
449 Q2: 10-4. I'll get (unintelligible) in a second.

451 A: To see how Brandon was.
452
453 Q: So, um, for...
454
455 Q2: (Unintelligible).
456
457 Q: So you and ...
458
459 Q2: (Unintelligible).
460
461 Q: ...walked to the rear where the fire and medics?
462
463 A: Yup.
464
465 Q2: Confirm, uh, (unintelligible) start calling and (unintelligible).
466
467 Q: To check on, uh, Mr. Marshal?
468
469 A: Brandon. Yup.
470
471 Q1: Affirmative. They can start (unintelligible).
472
473 Q2: 10-4.
474
475 Q: And - and, um, what - what did you see when you got over there?
476
477 A: When we came around the corner, um...
478
479 Q1: (Unintelligible).
480
481 A: ...the - uh, there was...
482
483 Dispatch: (Unintelligible).
484
485 A: ...it look like one sheriff and, um, a couple of paramedics were trying to
486 restrain him on the ground.
487
488 Q1: Um, yeah, I see he's gonna be at the polling address.
489
490 Q: So a sheriff.
491
492 A: And a couple paramedics...
493
494 Dispatch: (Unintelligible) 1050 - 12950.
495

496 A: ...and they were asking him to stop resisting.
497
498 Q: Paramedics. Did they say anything?
499
500 A: The - the officer was...
501
502 Q2: (Unintelligible).

504 A: I - well, the best of my memory, I thought it was the sheriff's, um, um, officer
505 who said, tell him to quit resisting when he was on the ground. And...
506
507 Q: Okay. So sheriff told Marshal?
508
509 A: Yeah. I believe it was him.
510
511 Q: To stop resisting?
512
513 A: Yeah.
514
515 Q: Did you see any - did you see this?
516
517 A: Yeah. I saw him when - when I came around the ground he was on the
518 ground.
519
520 Q: Did Mr. Marshal, um, did he comply with the orders?
521
522 A: Well, um, hard to say because he was groaning and, um, uh, he - I couldn't
523 tell whether he was complying or anything at the time.
524
525 Q: Okay.
526
527 A: Because they had - at that time they had some bodies on him and, um, I heard
528 - I think one of the paramedics say he - they can't - um, couldn't get him
529 restrained. He's really strong.
530
531 Q: Okay.
532
533 A: And that's all I heard.
534
535 Q: Okay. One of medics...
536
537 A: Yeah.
538
539 Q: ...stated they can't restrain Mr. Marshal.
540

541 Q1: All right.
542
543 A: And he was really strong.
544
545 Q: Really strong.
546
547 A: Yeah.
548
549 Q: Okay. What, uh - did you notice anything after that?
550
551 A: You know, that - um, tried to keep our distance and then when - look like the -
552 you know, some other officers showed up and it look like they had him, um,
553 subdued by that time. I stepped forward to let the one paramedic know that I
554 was the VP of HR and they told us to go back, get out. So we complied and
555 came back here until you showed up.
556
557 Q: So - so you - you stood back and waited for the other units to come?
558
559 A: Yeah. Absolutely.
560
561 Q: Okay.
562
563 A: Absolutely.
564
565 Q: And you just stood at the front of the driveway here?
566
567 A: Yup.
568
569 Q: Okay. Stood with - were you standing with other employees?
570
571 A: I was - so with um...
572
573 Q: With...
574
575 A: ...with
576
577 Q:
578
579 A: Yeah. Um, uh, an outside vendor.
580
581 Q: The - was that from the meeting?
582
583 A: Yeah.
584
585 Q: And they're from meeting?

586
587 A: Yeah. His name is - I just happen to know him personally, it was the smallest
588 thing in the universe here, but
589
590 Q: I'm sorry, ?
591
592 A: Yeah. I believe is how he spells his name.
593
594 Q: . Okay.
595
596 A: They're interviewing him inside there.
597
598 Q: Okay. So then, uh, after, you know, the paramedics, um, were trying to, um,
599 tend to him. They...
600
601 A: Yup.
602
603 Q: They requested that you step back...
604
605 A: Yup.
606
607 Q: And you waited in the driveway and then you were met by?
608
609 A: Um, I think you were the first...
610
611 Q: Okay.
612
613 A: ...person that came up and addressed us. I - well, I walked back down to get
614 your guys' attention...
615
616 Q: Okay.
617
618 A: ...because I have his - I have his emergency contact information.
619
620 Q: Asked - they asked all of you or - or just you?
621
622 A: All of us.
623
624 Q: ...ask.
625
626 A: You know, there was four of us.
627
628 Q: Group of four. Step back...
629
630 Q1: Yeah.

631
632 Q2: Yeah.
633
634 Q: ...back under - step back to the, uh, entrance of the driveway and waited for
635 my, uh - or waited for somebody to talk to you?
636
637 A: Yup. Yup.
638
639 Q: To, uh, driveway?
640
641 A: Yeah. And once they were putting him in the ambulance, I thought it was safe
642 enough to step forward and make contact with you to let you know about an
643 emergency contact.
644
645 Q: Okay. Who - who's the, uh, first, uh, deputy that came up to talk to you?
646
647 A: I don't remember. Don't recall, you know. I mean, is - you were the first one I
648 walked over and, um, I - I...
649
650 Q: So, I'm - I'm -I'm...
651
652 A: ...another officer...
653
654 Q: ...the o - I'm the only - I'm the only one...
655
656 A: Another officer told me just one second and about that time I think you
657 came...
658
659 Q: Okay. So I'm the only one who's talked to you. Okay.
660
661 Dispatch: 72 Charles (unintelligible) available for calls.
662
663 Q: Okay. Uh, briefly let me...
664
665 Q2: 70 (unintelligible) to dispatch, available for calls.
666
667 Q: And you just provided me with the following statement, correct?
668
669 A: Yup.
670
671 Q2: (Unintelligible).
672
673 Dispatch: (Unintelligible).
674
675 Q2: And also available for call.

676
677 Dispatch: 74 Charles (unintelligible).
678
679 Q: Do you know Mr. Marshal?
680
681 A: You know, I've had, um, two meetings with him.
682
683 Dispatch: (Unintelligible).
684
685 Q: Two meetings?
686
687 A: Yeah.
688
689 Dispatch: (Unintelligible).
690
691 Q: With...
692
693 Q1: (Unintelligible) Charles, uh, just to clarify, (unintelligible).
694
695 Q: ...Marshal?
696
697 A: Yeah.
698
699 Q1: ...from (unintelligible).
700
701 Q: Um, were those just work-related or?
702
703 Dispatch: 74 Charles (unintelligible).
704
705 A: Well, um, they were work-related and - but they were - have to do with - um, I
706 don't know what the right way to say this is, he, um, had some - good way to
707 say, it was somewhat paranoid and that he believed that, um, somebody was
708 damaging his motorcycle and that there was somebody out on the internet
709 spreading bad things.
710
711 Q: So he seem...
712
713 A: He seemed paranoid in nature.
714
715 Q: Paranoid. Thought someone was damaging his motorcycle?
716
717 A: His motorcycle and hacking into his - the internet and spreading bad things
718 about him.
719
720 Q: Okay. And - and then, uh, spreading what on the internet?

721
722 A: Just, you know, saying bad things about him and...
723
724 Q: Bad...
725
726 A: Yeah.
727
728 Q: ...things on...
729
730 A: He claimed he was involved in a - um, a large lawsuit that - um, class action
731 lawsuit that he was worried that the people he was suing would come and get
732 him.
733
734 Q: Okay. So he claimed that he was involve - involved in a large...
735
736 A: Class action lawsuit.
737
738 Q: ...class action lawsuit.
739
740 A: Yup.
741
742 Q: He was afraid that people would come - were gonna come get him?
743
744 A: Yeah.
745
746 Q1: Yeah. Could you call Tell him that he wanted to, uh...
747
748 Q2: (Unintelligible) paramedic.
749
750 Q1: Hold on, I got him right here.
751
752 Q: To - were - were both - were both of the, uh, meetings kind of the same - just
753 of the same?
754
755 A: Yeah. It was only - so, um, I had this meeting with him and his manager
756 that I mentioned to you earlier.
757
758 Q: Okay.
759
760 A: And, um, um, it's not unusual for engineers to be a little different.
761
762 Q: Okay.
763
764 A: So, um, at that time, I really didn't, um - you know, we didn't take - I mean,
765 we took the - his concerns about his personally property on our - that

766 seriously...

767

768 Q: But you didn't see any safety issues or anything concerns?

769

770 A: Nothing at all. His productivity and everything has been fine.

771

772 Q: Okay.

773

774 A: Um...

775

776 Q: He's...

777

778 A: A little quirky guy but, uh...

779

780 Q: Productivity, was - was...

781

782 A: Was fine.

783

784 Q: His productivity was good.

785

786 A: Yeah.

787

788 Q: Uh, okay. And you, um, you took - you took his statement...

789

790 A: Took his...

791

792 Q: ...just - just kind of, um...

793

794 A: We - we - I informed facilities, our facilities director and our receptionist to...

795

796 Q: Told facil - facilities...

797

798 A: Mm-hm.

799

800 Q: ...receptionist.

801

802 A: To, you know, where he parked his motorcycle at is right - literally right in

803 front of the building.

804

805 Q: Okay.

806

807 A: And our receptionist, she drives a motorcycle from time-to-time so I just ask

808 her to keep her eye on if she ever notice anybody messing with the

809 motorcycle.

810

811 Q: Okay.
812
813 A: And she said she hadn't.
814
815 Q: Ask keep eye on Marshal...
816
817 A: Mm-hm.
818
819 Q: ...motorcycle.
820
821 A: When - I informed Brandon that if he thought that his physical, um - if he was
822 physically worried about himself that he should contact the police. Um, which
823 he claimed he had.
824
825 Q: Told him to call police.
826
827 A: Yeah. To apply all his statement.
828
829 Q1: (Unintelligible).
830
831 Q: If he felt - if he felt himself on danger.
832
833 A: Yup.
834
835 Dispatch: (Unintelligible) 39 10-4.
836
837 Q: No - now...
838
839 A: And then...
840
841 Q: Ju - just so - just so I'm clear...
842
843 A: Yeah.
844
845 Q1: (Unintelligible) 82 and, uh (unintelligible)
846
847 Q: ...you - you say he's, um - he - he's been - he's - he acted a little off, I think
848 that was your...
849
850 A: Yeah.
851
852 Q: I think that was your words.
853
854 A: Yeah.
855

856 Q: But there was nothing, um...
857
858 Q1: (Unintelligible)
859
860 Q: ...prior to the day that was - any flags of any safety issues?
861
862 Q1: (Unintelligible).
863
864 A: None at all.
865
866 Q1: In front of her.
867
868 Q: Okay.
869
870 A: None at all. This is completely outside of this.
871
872 Q: And - and that - that is your word, correct?
873
874 A: Absolutely. There's nothing...
875
876 Q: Okay.
877
878 Q2: (Unintelligible).
879
880 A: Uh, none of his behavior up to this point today would ever leads you to
881 believe that this...
882
883 Dispatch: (Unintelligible) 39, uh, 408 1041 (unintelligible) 292.
884
885 Q: Acted off?
886
887 A: Yeah.
888
889 Q: Um, none...
890
891 Dispatch: 10401592 (unintelligible) #161201235.

893 Q: ...of his behavior up until today?
894
895 A: Yup.
896
897 Q: Today.
898
899 A: Yeah.
900

901 Q: Um, led you?
902
903 A: Absolutely.
904
905 Q1: 39 (unintelligible).
906
907 Q: to believe Marshal or you guys were in danger?
908
909 A: Exactly.
910
911 Q: Okay. Or staff of...
912
913 Q1: 02 (unintelligible).
914
915 Q: ...(unintelligible) in danger.
916
917 Q2: (Unintelligible).
918
919 Q: Okay. When were those meetings? Just, um...
920
921 A: Um...
922
923 Q2: (Unintelligible).
924
925 A: ...you know, I would have the dates at my office. But I don't know.
926
927 Q: Can - can you...
928
929 A: They're probably two months ago, maybe, you know, and...
930
931 Q: Meetings two months ago. When, uh - so I put you back about October or?
932
933 A: Yeah. It sounds like probably right would be about October.
934
935 Q: For - do you - mid October, first part of October?
936
937 A: Um, early part of October. I guess, uh, I can - I have it on my calendar where I
938 can...
939
940 Q: Were they both about the same time?
941
942 A: Yeah. Yeah.
943
944 Q: Uh, a week apart, a couple days apart?
945

946 A: Um...

947

948 Q: Just pretty close?

949

950 A: Yeah. I - I guess. I - I just don't recall. To be honest, I would have to look at

951 the dates.

952

953 Q: Anything else you know about Mr. Marshal or?

954

955 A: No, I don't. I don't.

956

957 Q: So this is, uh - this - this episode was kind of a shock?

958

959 A: Yeah, absolutely. Absolutely. I mean, I - you know, we've got 220 employees,

960 so I don't get to know everybody but, um, you know...

961

962 Q1: (Unintelligible) I could move my car.

963

964 A: ...you know, my conversations with, you know, the managers and everybody,

965 there's - I've never heard anything about his behavior. Something that we

966 don't believe this - this is normal.

967

968 Q: Okay. Never heard anything, uh, that state that he was, uh - that he was a

969 safety issue?

970

971 A: Absolutely not. He - we wouldn't have him here if that was the case.

972

973 Q: Okay. Um...

974
