68		know, it's kind of weird he's coming in now. He seemed a little bit out of
69 70		sorts. Um - um, so he sat down and, uh, you know, we were - we were
70 71		continuing our meeting. Um, it was clear from the reaction of the guys at
71 72		Roku, that they - they at least recognized this individual. Whether or not he
72		was supposed to be present or not, I was still not sure of. It seemed like something strange was going on. Um, so we, uh, you know, we offered him a
73 74		sandwich, 'cause we had - we had brought food. So he started, uh, eating the
75		sandwich, just kind of very - in a very aggressive style that wouldn't be
76		consistent with, uh, you know, a meeting. He was, uh, he was eating it
77		quickly. He was just kind of, um, sloppy about it. And then, um, at some
78		point during the meeting, um, he - he kind of reached for the phone. He was
79		fiddling with the phone a little bit. Um, and he proceeded to dial a number on
80		the phone. And that's when it, like, it really got everyone's attention. 'Cause
81		that was where the first thing that was extremely out of the ordinary. Um, so
82		he started dialing this number, uh, when the, uh, it was a doctor's office that
83		answered. He said, uh - uh, something to the effect of, "I need to speak my
84		dad," or whatever. It was clear that he was calling his father at that

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85 86 87 88		point. Um, they got - he got his father on the line. Um, his father didn't really say too much. At this point, we didn't know if it actually was his father, but we did confirm that later. Um, he wasn't really saying much. Uh, (Brandon), who I found out the individual's name was, um

94		and he was just kind - but he was just kind of matter of factly saying, "You
95		need to come here now. You need to come here now." He probably said that,
96		like, five or six times. Um, so we were trying to talk to his - to his dad, trying
97		to s- you know, explain the situation. Um, hey, you know, like, "Hey, he just
98		walked into our conference room. He's calling you." Uh, you know, and we
99		were trying to ask his dad. "What should we do?" You know, "How can you
100		help us?" Like, "We're not sure, you know, what he's doing or what the - what
101		the problem is." You know, "What's, uh, what's protocol here?" And his dad
102		wasn't really saying too much to him. He was just saying, "Can I get
103		(Brandon) back on the line?" And we tried to explain, y- "He - he's on the line
104		right now. This is a conference call." And he said, "Well, can I talk to just
105		(Brandon) by himself?" And we're like, "This is the only phone that we have,
106		um, in the room. So this is really the only way to communicate." Uh, around
107		that time, uh, (Brandon) had actually picked up his gray bag, um, and left the
108		room. Um, and he was, uh, oh no, it was at one point, like, just prior to that,
109		he had, like, stood up and it was like he was throwing up. He was - he was
110		gagging. He was - it was almost like he was trying to gag himself, um, to
111		throw up, but he - at that point, he came back and got his bag and went out
112		into the lobby that was just outside the conference room. Um, and go- he was
113		down on his hands and knees and he was going through his bag. And, um, at
114		that point, I walked out 'cause I - I just wanted to, you know, try and stop him
115		from continuing to - to take the pills that he had started taking. Um, and so
116		when I went out into the lobby, he had, you know, he was - he had the pill
117		bottle open. Um, he was just popping pills in his mouth and he was just
118		chewing them right on the spot. He was chewing the pills. Um, he put the -
119		the pill bag back in his bag. Um, it was a small pill container. It looked like a
120		prescription container. I have no idea what kind or anything. They were
121		yellow pills. Um, so at that point, um, back in the room where I was no
122		longer present, they had - they had hung up on his father and started calling
123		911. Um, so at that point, when - when (Brandon) left to go out in the parking let L. I followed him out there just to kinda keep a visual on him to to know
124		lot, I - I followed him out there just to kinda keep a visual on him to - to know where he was you know when someone showed up. So we would know up
125 126		where he was, you know, when someone showed up. So we would know, uh, if he like fled the seene whit which direction he was going or something like
120		if he, like, fled the scene, whi- which direction he was going or something like

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127 that. And he wasn't really - he - he wasn't going anywhere. He was kind of 128 just going around more or less in circles. Like, he was on the phone, uh, 129 presumably with his dad on his cell phone now, um, talking to him. Just kind of, uh, frantic. He was saying things like, uh, you know, like - kind of like 130 131 "they're out to get me" type of stuff. He was saying, "I'm Illuminati. You're Illuminati. You know what this is all about." Um, "It's happening 132 133 now." That kind of thing. Um, and so I was just trying to, you know, I was 134 trying to reach out to him, you know, verbally and say, "Hey, (Brandon), why 135 don't you come back in the lobby?" Um, you know, "Just wait for your dad or 136 someone to get here." Um, "So they know where to find you," and that kind of thing. And then he - he said something to the effect of, "They're chasing 137 138 me now. They're chasing me." And he - he ran away from me. So at that 139 point, I decided it was probably not a good idea to follow him, uh, so as to not 140 chase him off further. Um, I went back inside. Um, at that point, they were 141 on the phone with 911. And then, um, from there, it was probably le-less 142 than two minutes that - that, you know, we heard sirens. Um, but we had no longer had visual contact with (Brandon). He had gone around the other side 143 144 of the building. Um, so we were kind of talking amongst ourselves. Um, you 145 know, some- sometimes one of us would leave, other times, uh, you know, we'd all kind of be in the same room, just kind of, you know, fi- you know, 146 talking about how crazy that - that whole episode was. Um, I'd say, within 147 148 five minutes or so, we walked out around the building. Um, and that's when, 149 uh, I encountered Officer OBrien and, uh, and gave my statement. Uh, but 150 that's really the extent, uh, of my knowledge of the - the whole situation. 151 152 Q: Okay, could you just describe what, uh, had, uh, who you were calling 153 (Brandon) was wearing (unintelligible)? 154 155 A: Uh, so, the individual had - I think he had on jeans. Uh, kinda, like, faded blue jeans. He had some of those, like, webbed toe running shoe sort of 156 157 things, um, which is one of the things that made me realize that maybe he was 158 in the wrong place. Um, he had, like, an orange T-shirt on. Uh, like, an old 159 faded T-shirt. Um, he did, uh, so, it seemed - so, he was - I kinda had my 160 back to the door when he walked in. So I didn't look directly at him when he 161 walked in, but it seemed like he had a lot of stuff with him. Um, and then, actually, so this is something. So later on, after all of this had happened, we 162 163 were back in the - the meeting room just kind of gathering our stuff and - and 164 cleaning up and leaving. And we noticed there was another bag in the room, um, that we presume was (Brandon)'s. So we brought that to the attention of, 165 166 uh, another officer there, but, um, it - as far as what he was wearing, he didn't 167 have a hat on of any kind. He had, uh, kind of, like, a dark/gravish hair. Um, 168 at some point during the - the whole thing, uh, his name was spoken by I

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169 170 171 172 173		believe, uh, someone in HR. Someone - someone said, "(Brandon Marshall)". And that's when, uh, I figured out that, you know, he was an individual that I went to high school with. So I do know that his age is, you know, he's, like, 41 years old - 43 years old. Um, is that how old I am? Yeah, 43. Um, yeah, but that's - that's kind of what he was wearing. Um.
