153 ready in the car and like have a nice vehicle (unintelligible).

157 A: So I'm like okay, that sounds like fun.

159 Q: Mm-hm.

160

161 A: So that's what we went to go do. We go to the gas station, meet this guy I've  
162 never met him before in my life. He's like a black guy.

163

166 A: Uh, (Heimy) - (Heim), I don't even remember his name but he thought we  
167 were attractive and he wanted to smoke a blunt with us.

169 Q: Okay.

171 A: So he (unintelligible) just smoke blunt with us.

174  
175 A: So we were like okay the more weed the better. So as you can see makeup,  
176 I'm getting ready to start...

184 A: ...'cause we're smoking blunt in his car 'cause it was bigger.

188 A: And we go - I go - I get back in the car and then we're gonna leave and then,  
189 like the sheriff comes and then he's like asking for our I.D so I'm looking into  
190 my bag and I'm like, looking for I.D and then you hear boom the car hits the  
191 police car and then there's shot and - and he's gone. And I'm just like, " What  
192 the fuck?" Like...  
193  
194 Q: Yeah, no kidding.  
195  
196 A: That's crazy, like - like, I was really like what the hell, like s- stuck and  
197 shocked.  
198  
199 Q: Okay.

201 A: Like the keychain I was about to hook onto my phone I hooked it onto my  
202 thumb 'cause I didn't know what the hell to do.

235 A: I - I'll give it to you if you want like, I - I'm - I'm...

237 Q: Okay. Well, since I mean, you were there, I - I - you're gonna be my basically  
238 kind of like my - my - my eyes to...  
239  
240 A: Yeah, there's (unintelligible).  
241  
242 Q: ...to - to - to whatever happened, right? So, um, if we can kind of just talk  
243 about it a little bit more in detail, um, I would really appreciate it.

298 Q: Okay.  
299  
300 A: ...screw you if somebody is like...  
301  
302 Q: Right, right.  
303  
304 A: ...gonna hurt me or something, like, I mean, his younger sister. So I went over  
305 to the complex and then the guy - there is this guy I started talking to which is  
306 not that surprising at all.  
307  
308 Q: Yeah.

312 Q: (Unintelligible).  
313  
314 A: ...his name is that who I'm fucking (unintelligible).

338  
339 A: At the gas station. I don't even know the boy name. I really don't remember it.  
340  
341 Q: 'Cause you said Hen- something (  
342  
343 A: He - he - it's something with H though.  
344  
345 Q: Okay.  
346  
347 A: But (Heim)...  
348  
349 Q: What was...  
350  
351 A: ...(unintelligible) (Heim).  
352  
353 Q: ...she calling him?  
354  
355 A: He - she didn't call him shit. He - she didn't even introduce me and him, like,  
356 w- didn't introduce. It wasn't like an introduction, hi, I am...  
357  
358 Q: Is this the first time you...  
359  
360 A: I've never met this individuals someone that she had knew from whenever.  
361  
362 Q: Okay.  
363  
364 A: I had never met him.  
365  
366 Q: Okay.  
367  
368 A: So I was just like, well, hey, you got some weed, ready to go smoke a bunch  
369 of blunt.  
370  
371 Q: And where you meet him at?  
372  
373 A: Is by the gas station.  
374  
375 Q: Which gas station is it?  
376  
377 A: By - okay, so you pull out it's called mobile, mobile.  
378

379 Q: Mm-hm.  
380  
381 A: It's like right there on Julian.  
382  
383 Q: On Julian?  
384  
385 A: Yeah.  
386  
387 Q: Julian and what?  
388  
389 A: What is it? The Stranger. It's - I think it's 26 - but it sounds like High it's like,  
390 um, 28...  
391  
392 Q: So it's - so it's - it's still here in San Jose and not necessarily...  
393  
394 A: It was in San Jo...  
395  
396 Q: ...the place where everything happened?  
397  
398 A: I don't even know where that place was. I was driving, I was looking at two  
399 huge houses...  
400  
401 Q: Mm-hm.  
402  
403 A: ...and I was asking the officer like, what kind of area is this? Like is this a  
404 community or something? Like...  
405  
406 Q: Well have you ever been there at all?  
407  
408 A: Never in my life.  
409  
410 Q: Oh, no.  
411  
412 A: Never. I was born in San Francisco.  
413  
414 Q: Okay.  
415  
416 A: I wasn't born out here but I came out here when I was younger.  
417  
418 Q: Mm-hm.  
419  
420 A: But I still haven't...

421  
422 Q: Yeah.  
423  
424 A: ...seen every...  
425  
426 Q: Right.  
427  
428 A: ...I guess every part.  
429  
430 Q: No. Well, app- apparently it's like a place where people go to hang out and  
431 stuff so.  
432  
433 A: That's what I figured when we...  
434  
435 Q: Yeah.  
436  
437 A: ...pulled up...  
438  
439 Q: Yeah.  
440  
441 A: ...and we were like parked up there. I figured it was somewhere people did go  
442 and like...  
443  
444 Q: Mm-hm.  
445  
446 A: ...smoke and have a nice view.  
447  
448 Q: Right.  
449  
450 A: 'Cause the view is beautiful.  
451  
452 Q: That's right.  
453  
454 A: I even told the - I even told the officer...  
455  
456 Q: Yeah.  
457  
458 A: ...this is a pretty view.  
459  
460 Q: Yeah.  
461  
462 A: Like it's...

463  
464 Q: That's why the - like going there.  
465  
466 A: ...sitting there for hell hours before (unintelligible) it's so nice.  
467  
468 Q: Right.  
469  
470 A: Right.  
471  
472 Q: Okay. So, um, you met - you - you met him at the mobile gas station?  
473  
474 A: Yeah, by the gas station.  
475  
476 Q: Okay. Where...  
477  
478 A: ...nearby the complex. We were all like buying and he said that...  
479  
480 Q: By the complex where - where you were picked up?  
481  
482 A: Yeah. Where I was picked up.  
483  
484 Q: Oh, Okay.  
485  
486 A: I don't know if she had talked to him before that. I don't know any of that.  
487  
488 Q: Mm-hm.  
489  
490 A: All I know is, sit in the car let's smoke some weed.  
491  
492 Q: So he says, yeah, I (unintelligible).  
493  
494 A: He's like I got - I got little blunt let's smashed so I'm like, more weed...  
495  
496 Q: What is that? What is a blunt - blunt what?  
497  
498 A: Blunt he has m- he has...  
499  
500 Q: No, no but you said a blunt smashed.  
501  
502 A: A blunt let's smash.  
503  
504 Q: Oh, oh.

505  
506 A: So like let's just smoke a blunt together...  
507  
508 Q: Oh, oh.  
509  
510 A: ...so we smoked two blunt (unintelligible).  
511  
512 Q: Oh man, I'm so behind. You're making me feel really old now. Okay. Um,  
513 okay, so you guys get together. Uh, were you in the same car or separate?  
514  
515 A: No separate cars I was in car.

517 Q: Okay.

539 guys drive up to this location, uh, your friend is re- is driving.  
540  
541 A: Yeah I'm in the car with her.  
542  
543 Q: You're in the passenger seat.  
544  
545 A: Yeah.  
546

547 Q: Um, who is in front and who's in back?  
548  
549 A: is in the back and he's up here.  
550  
551 Q: And so he's driving up front first?  
552  
553 A: Yeah.  
554  
555 Q: Okay. Um, so eventually you get to your destination.  
556  
557 A: Yeah.  
558  
559 Q: Which is where you said...  
560  
561 A: Exactly where...  
562  
563 Q: The view or whatever, right?  
564  
565 A: Yeah, exactly there.  
566  
567 Q: Okay. So, um, wh- so where does he park?  
568  
569 A: He parked in front of us...  
570  
571 Q: Where does he park his car?  
572  
573 A: ...and we parked behind him.  
574  
575 Q: Okay.  
576  
577 A: Like...  
578  
579 Q: Okay.  
580  
581 A: ...literally he parked right here...  
582  
583 Q: Mm-hm.  
584  
585 A: ...and we parked right there.  
586  
587 Q: And where is the view? Is it this side or is it...  
588

589 A: It's right in front of us.  
590  
591 Q: So this side?  
592  
593 A: Like right in front like me coming this side it's like right here but we're parked  
594 right here but it's like right here.  
595  
596 Q: Okay. But are the cars, um, facing...  
597  
598 A: They're facing...  
599  
600 Q: ...this way or this way?  
601  
602 A: This way.  
603  
604 Q: Oh, okay.  
605  
606 A: They're facing like downhill.  
607  
608 Q: Okay, so cars are facing downhill, view is - would be to...  
609  
610 A: Like across the front...  
611  
612 Q: ...your right?  
613  
614 A: ...right-ish...  
615  
616 Q: Mm-hm.  
617  
618 A: ...area I guess...  
619  
620 Q: Okay.  
621  
622 A: ...so like this side.  
623  
624 Q: Okay. And your car with is in the back...  
625  
626 A: Yeah, we were...  
627  
628 Q: ...and his in front?  
629  
630 A: ...eh, behind his car.

631  
632 Q: Okay. So, um, you get together to smoke the blunt w- and you said...  
633  
634 A: We s- s- all sat in one car.  
635  
636 Q: So you...  
637  
638 A: And I was - I was...  
639  
640 Q:  
641  
642 A: ...putting my makeup.  
643  
644 Q: ...and, uh, the guy were all in one car?  
645  
646 A: In one car.  
647  
648 Q: In his car?  
649  
650 A: Yes.  
651  
652 Q: Okay, so who was in what seat?  
653  
654 A: I was in the driver's seat 'cause I was putting on my makeup...  
655  
656 Q: Okay.  
657  
658 A: ...and I didn't have a mirror big enough. So I was sitting right here, he was  
659 sitting in the passenger seat and was sitting right behind me.  
660  
661 Q: Okay.  
662  
663 A: And then went and started cleaning on her car 'cause she doesn't  
664 smoke a lot...  
665  
666 Q: Mm-hm.  
667  
668 A: ...'cause she smoked the first blunt and was like, " Oh, my I'm gonna go cl-  
669 clean my car."  
670  
671 Q: (Unintelligible). Yeah.  
672



673 A: So I was like, okay, I'm gonna just smoke weed.  
674  
675 Q: Mm-hm.  
676  
677 A: So I'm like, I was smoking the blunt and I was putting on my makeup and  
678 everything, you know, (unintelligible) phone with his girlfriend or whatever,  
679 whoever girl, whatever it was. And I first putting on my makeup and then...  
680  
681 Q: Oh, so he's got a girlfriend.  
682  
683 A: Yeah, that's what I'm saying like it was...  
684  
685 Q: So was he hitting on the - or is it just...  
686  
687 A: He wasn't - he wasn't trying to hit on me.  
688  
689 Q: Oh, okay.  
690  
691 A: I know that but I know he - he was like, you're very beautiful dah, dah, dah  
692 but he wasn't trying to like, mark on me I guess...  
693  
694 Q: Mm-hm.  
695  
696 A: ...like turn...  
697  
698 Q: Mm-hm.  
699  
700 A: ...me into a girl or something...  
701  
702 Q: Right, right.  
703  
704 A: ...like it was nothing like that and I didn't get that vibe from him and (Jazzy)  
705  
706 Q: Oh, okay, so just hanging out then as just friends?  
707  
708 A: Yeah, it was just - we were just all smoking and chilling (unintelligible) up.  
709  
710 Q: Yeah. Oh, well, that's good to know.  
711  
712 A: Yeah, it was just really normal, like...  
713  
714 Q: Okay.

715

716 A: ...(unintelligible) but, hm, oh.

717

718 Q: So - so what happened from the time that your friend went to - back to her  
719 car?

720

721 A: She went to her car...

722

723 Q: You're still...

724

725 A: ...I finished (unintelligible)...

726

727 Q: Okay.

728

729 A: ...and put my mascara on it looks good (unintelligible)...

730

731 Q: Mm-hm.

732

733 A: ...I took a million selfies.

734

735 Q: Oh.

736

737 A: So if we ever get to my phone, you will be able to see me...

738

739 Q: Oh yeah, selfie.

740

741 A: ...smoking the blunt and all the shit, all lighting it everything.

742

743 Q: Oh, while you were in the car.

744

745 A: ...li- literally li- I'm not even (unintelligible)...

746

747 Q: (Unintelligible) thing.

748

749 A: N- no, for real, yeah, 'cause that's like one thing I like to do, I like modeling  
750 so...

751

752 Q: Oh, good.

753

754 A: ...I - I always take selfies and, uh, there's (unintelligible) is (unintelligible) it's  
755 about 30 I think and I just have to take - and I wasn't even talking to him. I  
756 was smoking weed, taking pictures of myself and he's on the phone. And then

757 I gathered my things once - once I was done and I went right back to  
758 car. Right when I opened the door, I looked and the sheriff pulled up in front  
759 of his car.  
760  
761 Q: Okay. Um, okay, so you said the - the sheriff shows up and what does he tell  
762 you guys or...  
763  
764 A: The sheriff get out the car and he asked him for information for his I.D - I.D.  
765 And then he asked for the I.D and he asked me for mine.  
766  
767 Q: Okay.  
768  
769 A: I went looking through my purse. I don't know what the fuck he did but I  
770 know the car hit the sheriff's car and he was trying to get the fuck off.  
771  
772 Q: Mm-hm.  
773  
774 A: Like and went to wallet grabbed her I.D like me and we were looking  
775 for our shit to into some, you know, like...  
776  
777 Q: Yeah, yeah.  
778  
779 A: ...he's a police officer asking us for stuff.  
780  
781 Q: Yeah.  
782  
783 A: We were gonna give it to him.  
784  
785 Q: Right.  
786  
787 A: And he was in the passenger's. I don't even know how the fuck you scouted  
788 over.  
789  
790 Q: Uh-huh.  
791  
792 A: I don't know. I have no fucking idea.  
793  
794 Q: So quick...  
795  
796 A: Eh, hou-  
797  
798 Q: ...quick stop.

799

800 A: ...Houdini.

801

802 Q: Yeah.

803

804 A: That shit was crazy. I was like, what the f- how the fuck did he even - I didn't  
805 even know he had the car start 'cause the car was off. I didn't hear the car  
806 start...

807

808 Q: Mm-hm.

809

810 A: ...like nothing.

811

812 Q: But so - okay, so when the police officer comes up and starts asking you for  
813 your I.D...

814

815 A: Yeah.

816

817 Q: Um, what's the next thing you remember hearing?

818

819 A: Boom.

820

821 Q: You heard the crash?

822

823 A: I heard the crash that's what made me look up. That's what made look.

824

825 Q: Okay. Okay. And what was the officer when you - when you looked up?

826

827 A: Like, um, so okay, how was I standing? So our car right here...

828

829 Q: Mm-hm.

830

831 A: ...the officer was kinda like - I would say kinda in the middle of both cars. I -  
832 were like speaking of both...

833

834 Q: Okay.

835

836 A: ...both like 'cause it was clear we separate 'cause it was - he was in his shit  
837 and...

838

839 Q: Yeah, yeah.

840

841 A: ...we were over here...  
842  
843 Q: Yeah.  
844  
845 A: ...um, it was like he was trying to speak to both parties I guess...  
846  
847 Q: Okay.  
848  
849 A: ...would be the right way to word it.  
850  
851 Q: Okay.  
852  
853 A: Um, but it was like kinda in the middle but it was to the side over there. And  
854 then the crash, it was like the side of his front car. He like the - the - the  
855 bumper or whatever that black thing is that looks like the bike holder that the  
856 bus be having...  
857  
858 Q: Oh, okay.  
859  
860 A: ...something like that.  
861  
862 Q: For the - the police car?  
863  
864 A: Yeah. That's what - that's what the s- the front right side of his car hit.  
865  
866 Q: So front right side of...  
867  
868 A: And then...  
869  
870 Q: ...of - of your friend's car, your friend's - friend's car?  
871  
872 A: Yeah, acquaintance shit, that's what - what - what I (unintelligible).  
873  
874 Q: Maybe acquaintance.  
875  
876 A: (Unintelligible).  
877  
878 Q: Let's just say the acquaintance. Okay, so his right front (unintelligible)...  
879  
880 A: It hit the police car, that's what made me even look up...  
881  
882 Q: Oh, okay.

883

884 A: ...from going through all my stuff, like, where' is I.D at.

885

886 Q: Okay.

887

888 A: And then we've seen that. And then another sheriff was pulling up and he was  
889 like - I don't know. He was - he was trying not to hit the hill by trying to back  
890 up 'cause he had hit the police car so he couldn't go straight no more. So he  
891 like backed up and sco- moving around. And as he was next to the other  
892 officer, the officer shot at the car multiple times. I don't know how many I  
893 wasn't paying attention, I was, like, oh my god, oh my god, I'm literally was  
894 saying, oh my god...

895

896 Q: Okay.

898 A: ...what the fuck is going on?

899

900 Q: Yeah, I bet.

902 A: And then they said - then we got yelled at to get to the floor and to shut up and  
903 it's like, I'm like, oh, excuse me (unintelligible)...

909 Q: Mm-hm.

911 A: I was like, what he say, he's like, I had just - I just pull - I just fired on blah,  
912 blah, I just fired on a car, whatever, whatever, whatever. I said, "Yeah..."

914 Q: Mm-hm.

915

916 A: ...I seen it." You know what I mean? Like, what the hell dog...

917

918 Q: I was here.

919

920 A: ...he mad at me...

921

922 Q: Yeah...

923

924 A: ...the hell I - I got - what the - the fuck, like...

925  
926 Q: Yeah.  
927  
928 A: And he was like, my bad, whatever. I was like okay (unintelligible) ten.  
929  
930 Q: Yeah.  
931  
932 A: I'm trying - I'm not working against y'all, like, you're all doing your job. I  
933 don't know the rules and the laws and shit up on that hill.  
934  
935 Q: Mmm.  
936  
937 A: I never been there before.  
938  
939 Q: Mm-hm. But I bet just as - as surreal as it was for you it was probably as  
940 surreal for them.  
941  
942 A: F- for him...  
943  
944 Q: Yeah.  
945  
946 A: ...at the same time.  
947  
948 Q: Okay. Okay. Um, can you, um, can you just kind of draw - I'm - I'm a visual  
949 person so I - I...  
950  
951 A: (Unintelligible).  
952  
953 Q: ...kind of understand, I kinda understand what you're saying...  
954  
955 A: But just for...  
956  
957 Q: Yeah, for - for clarification purposes. So if you can draw the, um, where your  
958 car was at the acquaintance car and then the...  
959  
960 A: Yeah, like I said that's the hill.  
961  
962 Q: Mm-hm.  
963  
964 A: Right. And this shit or whatever. Right. So this is the street.  
965  
966 Q: Mm-hm.

967  
968 A: (Unintelligible) whatever, whatever, like, the view was right here...  
969  
970 Q: Mm-hm.  
971  
972 A: ...and then his car was right here and then car was right here.  
973  
974 Q: Okay.  
975  
976 A: And then the officer guy was like right here and then his car pulled up right  
977 here...  
978  
979 Q: Okay.  
980  
981 A: I'll just put 1 and then 2  
982  
983 Q: That make sense.  
984  
985 A: And then we'll put X1 'cause that's the cop and...  
986  
987 Q: Right.  
988  
989 A: I'm sorry. I'm really...  
990  
991 Q: I'm following you.  
992  
993 A: ...I'm very like, organized the hell, um, like, I used to get - made fun of for this  
994 but...  
995  
996 Q: I...  
997  
998 A: ...then I color - color in all type of shit.  
999  
1000 Q: ...I don't have colors. I'm sorry.  
1001  
1002 A: And then this like where the other officer was...  
1003  
1004 Q: Mm-hm.  
1005  
1006 A: ...when he shot. And then car like once it pulled this way like shh and then it  
1007 hit the front bumper of the car right there...  
1008



1009 Q: Mm-hm.  
1010  
1011 A: ...and then he backed up and then the kept going when he got right here that's  
1012 when the officer started shooting.  
1013  
1014 Q: Was the car coming at the officer?  
1015  
1016 A: And the car was right there. It was coming towards the officer.  
1017  
1018 Q: Mm-hm.  
1019  
1020 A: I don't know. I didn't really pay too much attention on how close they really  
1021 were. So I don't really know if the officer would have or could have got hit. I  
1022 really, I'm not sure but it was going towards that direction...  
1023  
1024 Q: Okay.  
1025  
1026 A: ...that's how he - he had pulled his car up. It was kind of an angle.  
1027  
1028 Q: Mm-hm.  
1029  
1030 A: And he walked out and was in front of the car on the side right here.  
1031  
1032 Q: Okay.  
1033  
1034 A: ...so...  
1035  
1036 Q: So - so when he comes out the officer is somewhere...  
1037  
1038 A: Yeah, officer was pulling up to the scene...  
1039  
1040 Q: Mm-hm.  
1041  
1042 A: ...as he hit the car that car was coming up...  
1043  
1044 Q: Okay.  
1045  
1046 A: ...and this officer draw the gun...  
1047  
1048 Q: Okay.  
1049  
1050 A: And the car backed up and then went back that way.

1051

1052 Q: So when did...

1053

1054 A: And the officer - when the officer got right here that's when he was sh- it was  
1055 when the car was passing, like, he was ri- like he was shooting straight,  
1056 basically. Like, basically like it was, the car was coming towards him in a  
1057 way. I wanna say towards him 'cause he only shot at the side of the car. On the  
1058 side of the car is the side windows is what got busted. This - they went shh,  
1059 like the glass broke and shit on the street.

1060

1061 Q: Oh, you saw the - the - the windows...

1062

1063 A: Yeah...

1064

1065 Q: ...shatter?

1066

1067 A: ...I was watching him shoot at the car. It was crazy.

1068

1069 Q: So when he's standing uo and he's - he's...

1070

1071 A: Yeah, yeah.

1072

1073 Q: ...standing with his hands up...

1074

1075 A: Yeah, the gun - and the other officer...

1076

1077 Q: ...straight up front?

1078

1079 A: ...has the gun looking like - he's looking trying - trying to find a shot.

1080

1081 Q: Mm-hm.

1082

1083 A: Oh yeah, it was a real. It was fucking real.

1084

1085 Q: Okay. So you - so you - so you...

1086

1087 A: (Unintelligible).

1088

1089 Q: ...said you see - you saw the, uh, the window shatter then, right?

1090

1091 A: Yeah, the - yeah, the window broke 'cause the glass was in in the middle of  
1092 the street.

1093

1094 Q: Which - which window was it?

1095

1096 A: I think it was the front - it was either the front passenger window or the back  
1097 of the passenger window.

1098

1099 Q: The passenger side?

1100

1101 A: Yeah.

1102

1103 Q: Okay.

1104

1105 A: Because as he was driving by, the - the officer was shooting like...

1106

1107 Q: Mm-hm.

1108

1109 A: ...and it was like a straight kinda angle like...

1110

1111 Q: Mm-hm.

1112

1113 A: ...it was just straight. Like...

1114

1115 Q: Right.

1116

1117 A: ...at least from where I was standing it looked straight.

1118

1119 Q: It looked straight, yeah.

1120

1121 A: You know, um...

1122

1123 Q: Okay.

1124

1125 A: ...it looked straight.

1126

1127 Q: Okay. So, um, so he ends up shooting and, uh, you said, you saw - you  
1128 actually saw the window shatter. Okay. Um, and did you hear anybody yell  
1129 anything? Did your friend yell anything?

1130

1131 A: I was yelling oh, my god. She yelled, I heard a screech I don't know for sure it  
1132 go like (unintelligible) fuck is going on, oh, my god what the fuck is going on.

1133

1134 Q: Yeah. Okay.

1135  
1136 A: But I really - yeah, I stood there and stuck for a good second.  
1137  
1138 Q: And...  
1139  
1140 A: And then they turned the guns on us and was like get on the floor and then I  
1141 really freaked I was like, oh my god, what the hell? Like...  
1142  
1143 Q: No.  
1144  
1145 A: ...now - now what the fuck? Now, hold on people make jokes about police  
1146 shoot at people and how they don't play no more and how they're shooting -  
1147 like my grandma...  
1148  
1149 Q: Mm-hm.  
1150  
1151 A: ...before she died she's used to tell me like don't play with them police, yeah,  
1152 I've been up there with police because they are shooting nowadays, they're not  
1153 tasing, they're shooting and you will die.  
1154  
1155 Q: Mm-hm.  
1156  
1157 A: And like, you know, just like little stuff like that and it's like you hear that shit  
1158 and then you see it and then it gets directed toward you because you're there.  
1159 So it's like you're guilty by fucking association and is fucked off.  
1160  
1161 Q: Right.  
1162  
1163 A: 'Cause that shit is real, even in groups of friends.  
1164  
1165 Q: With the acquaintance.  
1166  
1167 A: They're saying...  
1168  
1169 Q: Right  
1170  
1171 A: Exactly.  
1172  
1173 Q: Okay.  
1174  
1175 A: And that's fucking bullshit. And I'm hell mad I should have stayed asleep  
1176 weed was not that important. Weed was not that important.

1177

1178 Q: Did you hear the officers say anything?

1179

1180 A: He said stop. He was - he repeatedly yelled stop. Um, he told us to get out the  
1181 car. He told us to put our hands up, get - lay on the floor, fall on the floor. Um,  
1182 I didn't hear the o- other officer say - say - say anything until he was coming  
1183 to me, telling me to shut the fuck up.

1184

1185 Q: Which one was that? The...

1186

1187 A: The one that was shooting.

1188

1189 Q: The - the one over here?

1190

1191 A: Yeah.

1192

1193 Q: The one you labelled X2?

1194

1195 A: Yeah.

1196

1197 Q: Okay.

1198

1199 A: Eh, yeah, he was, um, when he ca- came towards me and he was probably  
1200 frazzled or whatever because he did say, you know, he's like, you know, that  
1201 he, hm, you know, apologize, I guess, is the right term or whatever...

1202

1203 Q: Yeah, yeah.

1204

1205 A: And I was like, I don't care, like, it's fine. Like, I understand it's...

1206

1207 Q: Mm-hm.

1208

1209 A: ...the - it's trauma. It's traumatic. That shit is crazy.

1210

1211 Q: Yeah, yeah. I bet.

1212

1213 A: You know, that shit is crazy. Jesus it's crazy.

1214

1215 Q: Okay, so - so...

1216

1217 A: (Unintelligible).

1218

1219 Q: ...um, but you - you said you heard, um, somebody say s- one of the officers  
1220 say stop was that (unintelligible)?  
1221  
1222 A: Yeah, the first officer...  
1223  
1224 Q: Okay.  
1225  
1226 A: ...because he was only one out the car and was there when the car hit...  
1227  
1228 Q: Okay.  
1229  
1230 A: ...when the car hit I think that when the officer paid attention to.  
1231  
1232 Q: Right.  
1233  
1234 A: You know, 'cause I think he was paying more attention to me going through  
1235 my purse...  
1236  
1237 Q: Mm-hm.  
1238  
1239 A: ...and fidgeting through stuff in the car...  
1240  
1241 Q: Mm-hm.  
1242  
1243 A: ...than paying attention to the first car in the front which is probably how he  
1244 got to the car on and moving, you know what I mean without...  
1245  
1246 Q: So - so was the second officer already out of the car?  
1247  
1248 A: N- no. The second officer was pulling up...  
1249  
1250 Q: Was pulling up.  
1251  
1252 A: ...when this car was backing up...  
1253  
1254 Q: Got it.  
1255  
1256 A: ...going that way.  
1257  
1258 Q: Okay.  
1259

1260 A: And he jumped out and he had his gun out, so he jumped out and had pulled  
1261 his gun immediately...  
1262

1263 Q: Mm-hm.  
1264

1265 A: ...and got right here. And as the car was passing and he was shooting.  
1266

1267 Q: Okay. When they pulled out their guns, um, you said they were pointing it at  
1268 the acquaintance?  
1269

1270 A: At - yeah, it was at the car and then it wasn't and then so that car left that they  
1271 turned to us and like get on the floor.  
1272

1273 Q: Okay.  
1274

1275 A: ...and I was just like come on.  
1276

1277 Q: So they pointed their guns at him not necessarily, you guys.  
1278

1279 A: Yeah.  
1280

1281 Q: Until after?  
1282

1283 A: Until after. Yeah.  
1284

1285 Q: Okay. Um, anything else you remember hearing this officer say besides stop?  
1286

1287 A: He's - he was being cool at first.  
1288

1289 Q: Mm-hm.  
1290

1291 A: Like - he was just like can I see your I'Ds and - and he was yelling stop he  
1292 said I'll fire. I think he gave the warning, like I'll fire or whatever, but...  
1293

1294 Q: When he was talking to - to...  
1295

1296 A: (Unintelligible)...  
1297

1298 Q: ...the acquaintance?  
1299

1300 A: ...the car.  
1301

1302 Q: Okay, so - so...  
1303  
1304 A: (Unintelligible).  
1305  
1306 Q: Okay, so you heard stop...  
1307  
1308 A: I heard - I heard...  
1309  
1310 Q: ...I'll fire or something like that?  
1311  
1312 A: ...stop. I heard, like, you know, trying to let the motherfucker know, like...  
1313  
1314 Q: Mm-hm.  
1315  
1316 A: ...he would die.  
1317  
1318 Q: Yeah.  
1319  
1320 A: You know, like, it's fucked up how I say things but it's just...  
1321  
1322 Q: But I understand.  
1323  
1324 A: Yeah, and that's the point, like...  
1325  
1326 Q: Do you think - do you think he was able to hear those commands?  
1327  
1328 A: I have no idea. I don't know what that boy heard. All I know is I was watching  
1329 a fucking in real life...  
1330  
1331 Q: Yeah.  
1332  
1333 A: ...(unintelligible) movie in front of my face...  
1334  
1335 Q: Yeah.  
1336  
1337 A: ...and I don't know what the hell to do.  
1338  
1339 Q: Okay. You - you couldn't see him from where you were - from where you  
1340 were standing or...  
1341  
1342 A: I think he ducked.  
1343



1344 Q: He ducked.  
1345  
1346 A: I - I think he ducked. I'm not sure but...  
1347  
1348 Q: And...  
1349  
1350 A: ...I don't 'cause I - 'cause the hoodie fell off the car, 'cause he had a hoodie on  
1351 the back of the car like - like I said, I was in (unintelligible) on my  
1352 outfit if you look at clothes, my clothes and shit are in the back seat...  
1353  
1354 Q: Everything is there. I know.  
1355  
1356 A: The curl, leave-in conditioner are just there, like, li- I'm getting ready for my  
1357 day regardless...  
1358  
1359 Q: Yeah, yeah.  
1360  
1361 A: ...of whatever.  
1362  
1363 Q: Yeah.  
1364  
1365 A: And then - then, like I said, I'm homeless, I don't have anywhere to live. So  
1366 where - where and when I could get ready and look like it's a whole new day I  
1367 take advantage whether it's...  
1368  
1369 Q: Of, course.  
1370  
1371 A: ...McDonald's or a pretty ass view, you know...  
1372  
1373 Q: Mm-hm...  
1374  
1375 A: ...like...  
1376  
1377 Q: ...mm-hm.  
1378  
1379 A: I was just trying to dressed.  
1380  
1381 Q: So you w- so you saw him duck was - when did he duck?  
1382  
1383 A: W- when the gun was - when the gun went off.  
1384  
1385 Q: When they pulled out the guns?

1386  
1387 A: Yeah, when the guns went off.  
1388  
1389 Q: Oh, when the gun went off.  
1390  
1391 A: When - when the gun went off I think, eh, I think he went - I think he knew  
1392 when the gun was a little like...  
1393  
1394 Q: Oh.  
1395  
1396 A: ...like - like a menace to society movie like all that.  
1397  
1398 Q: Menace to society.  
1399  
1400 A: Like (unintelligible).  
1401  
1402 Q: I have to watch the movie again I - I - it's been a long time. Okay, so anyways,  
1403 um, so you - you saw them pull out the guns. You - this one, this officer you  
1404 said, kind of mentioned something like stop or...  
1405  
1406 A: Yeah. He...  
1407  
1408 Q: ...right?  
1409  
1410 A: Yeah.  
1411  
1412 Q: Um, and what did you hear this one say?  
1413  
1414 A: Nothing.  
1415  
1416 Q: Nothing?  
1417  
1418 A: I didn't hear that one say nothing.  
1419  
1420 Q: Okay.  
1421  
1422 A: That one hopped out of the car ready to shoot.  
1423  
1424 Q: Mm-hm.  
1425  
1426 A: But I - I, I mean, he was just pulling up to the scene and didn't know what was  
1427 going on.

1428  
1429 Q: Mm-hm.  
1430  
1431 A: I don't know. Maybe I - I could just see the whole perspective and so I was  
1432 just sitting there like, okay, whatever you all want here you go.  
1433  
1434 Q: Yeah.  
1435  
1436 A: 'Cause I get it like, that's crazy, that's crazy. It's the shit my aunty be telling  
1437 me about...  
1438  
1439 Q: So when the - when the shot was fired, um, you said you saw the acquaintance  
1440 and kind of just ducked down?  
1441  
1442 A: Yeah, yeah. I think he was just kind of like moving, um...  
1443  
1444 Q: Okay.  
1445  
1446 A: I mean, that's what I would do...  
1447  
1448 Q: Right.  
1449  
1450 A: Shit, if someone gonna shoot a gun at me I'm gonna (unintelligible)...  
1451  
1452 Q: Yeah.  
1453  
1454 A: ...I believe that (unintelligible) I don't wanna die.  
1455  
1456 Q: Matrix or s- something?  
1457  
1458 A: I don't wanna die.  
1459  
1460 Q: Okay.  
1461  
1462 A: You know, like, I mean, that shit is (unintelligible) be telling me in my brain...  
1463  
1464 Q: Yeah.  
1465  
1466 A: ...like, if somebody, if you're driving - it would be one of them, like...  
1467  
1468 Q: Yeah.  
1469

1470 A: ...little Menace to Society is saying, like, ty- you know, what's a - what's the 9-  
1471 1-1? Um, boys in the hood..  
1472  
1473 Q: Okay.  
1474  
1475 A: ...like one of those kind of like....  
1476  
1477 Q: One of those old movies.  
1478  
1479 A: Yeah. Like...  
1480  
1481 Q: Okay. Um, and what kind of - what kind of car did he have?  
1482  
1483 A: It was green.  
1484  
1485 Q: A green what?  
1486  
1487 A: Fuck I don't know. See I'm horrible with that. That's one thing cars I don't...  
1488  
1489 Q: You don't know cars? Okay. Um, was it like a newer car?  
1490  
1491 A: No. But it had good paint...  
1492  
1493 Q: Mm-hm.  
1494  
1495 A: ...and the interior was cool. It was probably like somebody's grandma car.  
1496 Like, that's what I, uh, like his grandma car or something like 'cause my  
1497 grandma car was like, it was like an older...  
1498  
1499 Q: Mm-hm.  
1500  
1501 A: ...but it was like kept nice and it was kept up, does that make sense?  
1502  
1503 Q: Yeah, yeah, yeah.  
1504  
1505 A: It's kind of like that. Like...  
1506  
1507 Q: It was probably the same thing.  
1508  
1509 A: ...it was a brand new ass car but it wasn't no...  
1510  
1511 Q: But well-kept?

1512  
1513 A: Yeah. It was an old ass...  
1514  
1515 Q: Yeah.  
1516  
1517 A: ...like beat mobile or something.  
1518  
1519 Q: Yeah.  
1520  
1521 A: It was - it was green, though, but it wasn't - I do remember (unintelligible)...  
1522  
1523 Q: Two-door or four-door?  
1524  
1525 A: Four.  
1526  
1527 Q: Four-door. Okay.  
1528  
1529 A: 'Cause her - 'cause only has two-door and it wasn't like that in his  
1530 car is because he had four doors and it was bigger and spacious so we can  
1531 both get our makeup on...  
1532  
1533 Q: Yeah.  
1534  
1535 A: ...we can all fit and will all smoke together.  
1536  
1537 Q: Yeah. All right. Um, and your - your friend, uh, is it - you call her  
1538  
1539 A: I call her .  
1540  
1541 Q: Yeah. So did tell you anything else about this guy?  
1542  
1543 A: No. Just that he's so cute.  
1544  
1545 Q: Yeah. And how do you know, uh...  
1546  
1547 A: Mm-hm.  
1548  
1549 Q: ...how do you know her...  
1550  
1551 A: Her?  
1552  
1553 Q:

1554  
1555 A: I've known her since I was like 12.  
1556  
1557 Q: Oh, really.  
1558  
1559 A: Like 12 (unintelligible).  
1560  
1561 Q: Way back?  
1562  
1563 A: Yeah. Like, we started high school and shit together, like at the same school.  
1564  
1565 Q: Mm-hm.  
1566  
1567 A: That I did not wanna go to. We had the same little group of friends but I was  
1568 like a secret nerd like I like to read and research shit and but like, I got made  
1569 fun of for it because I don't look like I'm supposed to like that kind of stuff...  
1570  
1571 Q: Mm-hm.  
1572  
1573 A: ...like puzzles and...  
1574  
1575 Q: Mm-hm.  
1576  
1577 A: ...and sh- her as well, like we both got teased for it. Um, but she was more  
1578 accepted within - within herself. Does that make sense?  
1579  
1580 Q: Yeah, yeah.  
1581  
1582 A: Like than I was so I covered it and masked it. And she just kind of embraced  
1583 it. And that's kind of where we clicked 'cause we both understood we're both  
1584 nerds. You know what I mean? Like...  
1585  
1586 Q: Oh, good.  
1587  
1588 A: ...when we hang out we could hang out and be normal. It was like me and her  
1589 were friend. And then, like the other three girls, when they were around, we're  
1590 all friends. But if then three girls weren't around then me and her were like,  
1591 best friends, like...  
1592  
1593 Q: Oh, good. Okay.  
1594  
1595 A: ...like I've been to her grandma's house and everything like...

1596  
1597 Q: Okay, so you - you know her fa- fairly well then?  
1598  
1599 A: Yeah, like fairly.  
1600  
1601 Q: And as - and what about the, uh, this guy then? So does she tend to associate  
1602 with...  
1603  
1604 A: No.  
1605  
1606 Q: ...people like this?  
1607  
1608 A: I've never seen her even say with a guy...  
1609  
1610 Q: No.  
1611  
1612 A: ...that looked kind of thuggish was cute it was funny.  
1613  
1614 Q: Really. So she's - she's kind of into him?  
1615  
1616 A: I don't know if she's into him...  
1617  
1618 Q: Mm-hm.  
1619  
1620 A: ...but she says he's cute.  
1621  
1622 Q: Yeah.  
1623  
1624 A: 'Cause I know I can think people are cute, though, like being like, oh my god,  
1625 I wanna be with you. Like I could like, you know, you're attractive...  
1626  
1627 Q: Yeah, yeah.  
1628  
1629 A: ...you're cute. But she was like, " Yeah, he's cute."  
1630  
1631 Q: Well, is he good-looking or no?  
1632  
1633 A: I don't think so.  
1634  
1635 Q: No?  
1636  
1637 A: Not my type.

1638

1639 Q: He's thuggish...

1640

1641 A: Yeah.

1642

1643 Q: ...you said? Mm-hm.

1644

1645 A: (Unintelligible).

1646

1647 Q: How old is he?

1648

1649 A: Uh, I didn't even ask.

1650

1651 Q: But does he look older?

1652

1653 A: He's - he's older than me. I'm 24. Um...

1654

1655 Q: So you think he could (unintelligible).

1656

1657 A: He could be 32.

1658

1659 Q: Early 30s?

1660

1661 A: He's - he's - I - he could be 32.

1662

1663 Q: Yeah.

1664

1665 A: Like 32, 33. I think he could be. Yeah.

1666

1667 Q: And when you say he's not - he's not good-looking, why is that?

1668

1669 A: In my type...

1670

1671 Q: Yeah.

1672

1673 A: ...because I like light skin, I like, like, you know, swole or supper big...

1674

1675 Q: Like he's working out.

1676

1677 A: Yeah, like...

1678

1679 Q: Mm-hm.



1680

1681 A: ... I like the guy that look like - like they could have been to prison or they are  
1682 on their way to prison it's the best...

1683

1684 Q: What?

1685

1686 A: ...way to say it. It a...

1687

1688 Q: Seriously, that's what you're into?

1689

1690 A: Unfortunately.

1691

1692 Q: Oh, my god. Okay.

1693

1694 A: What...

1695

1696 Q: And he doesn't look like that?

1697

1698 A: Mm...

1699

1700 Q: What does he look like?

1701

1702 A: He's dark. Yeah, yeah that - that (unintelligible).

1703

1704 Q: No. I mean, but...

1705

1706 A: He's...

1707

1708 Q: Wow.

1709

1710 A: ...he's ugly and he was like really, really tall. And he's slim, slimmer, like,  
1711 slim slender.

1712

1713 Q: So how tall are you?

1714

1715 A: I'm 5'5".

1716

1717 Q: And he's taller than you?

1718

1719 A: Oh, yeah, he's like 6'4". Like he's tall.

1720

1721 Q: Oh, super tall?

1722  
1723 A: Yeah, like he's six foot. Like, he's tall.  
1724  
1725 Q: And super thin?  
1726  
1727 A: Not super thin.  
1728  
1729 Q: Oh.  
1730  
1731 A: He's not light skin seed.  
1732  
1733 Q: Mm-hm.  
1734  
1735 A: But he's probably if you stretch me up...  
1736  
1737 Q: That...  
1738  
1739 A: ...it would probably be like even, like...  
1740  
1741 Q: Oh.  
1742  
1743 A: ...if you took me and just stretch me like this...  
1744  
1745 Q: Mm-hm.  
1746  
1747 A: ...if that makes any sense...  
1748  
1749 Q: Mm-hm, mm-hm.  
1750  
1751 A: ...it'd be like, we probably weigh about the same if he doesn't weigh a little bit  
1752 more 'cause I'm just gonna say I (unintelligible) feel better. Um...  
1753  
1754 Q: Interesting.  
1755  
1756 A: But yeah, if you - 'cause - yeah. And he...  
1757  
1758 Q: Yeah.  
1759  
1760 A: Yeah. If - if you stretch me...  
1761  
1762 Q: How (unintelligible)?  
1763

1764 A: ...and kind of - maybe like 2-, maybe - maybe 189 to 220 in the range of  
1765 weight maybe...  
1766  
1767 Q: Okay.  
1768  
1769 A: ...like, but he isn't - I like big guys.  
1770  
1771 Q: Mm-hm.  
1772
