92 Q: And what is that?  
93  
94 A: Uh, also a cell phone.  
95  
96 Q: Another cell phone? They both belong to you?  
97  
98 A: Yeah.  
99  
100 Q: Okay. Which one is the one you prefer?  
101  
102 A: Uh, the first one.  
103  
104 Q: The first one. So this is number one. But this is like a backup?  
105  
106 A: Mm-hm.  
107  
108 Q: Okay. And they both belong to you?  
109  
110 A: Yes.  
111  
112 Q: Okay. So, um, tell us why - why are we talking to you?  
113  
114 A: Um, apparently because I was in the wrong place, the wrong time.  
115  
116 Q: Okay. So what happened?  
117  
118 A: Um, well, um, a friend of mine, uh, took us to see the view on the hill. And  
119 then we were just about to leave and, um, like, right when we were about to  
120 leave, and my friend - my friend Shae got in my car. Like, um, I looked up  
121 and I noticed that like the police were right there. And, um, after that, it went  
122 all downhill. Um, the officer came up and asked us for IDs and I walked up  
123 and gave him mine. And then soon as he started, um, going on the radio and  
124 asking to check the license plates ...  
125  
126 Q: Mm-hm.  
127  
128 A: ... um, like my other friend, um, that took us up there to see the view, um,  
129 started to take off. And then they, like, shot at him. I closed my eyes, like  
130 when that happened?  
131  
132 Q: Mm-hm.  
133  
134 A: And yeah, that's pretty much it.  
135

136 Q: So you said your other friend that took you - who's the friend that took you to  
137 - to ...  
138  
139 A: Um, uh, I only know the nickname ...  
140  
141 Q: What's his name?  
142  
143 A: Um, (Hennessy).  
144  
145 Q: (Hennessy)?  
146  
147 A: Yeah, that's his nickname, like I call him by that name.  
148  
149 Q: Okay. What other people call him by?  
150  
151 A: That's all I know.  
152  
153 Q: A male or a female?  
154  
155 A: Male.  
156  
157 Q: Male? How old is he?  
158  
159 A: Uh, in his 30s.  
160  
161 Q: Okay. And he's the one that took you to - where - and where is this at  
162 actually? How do you know where it's at?  
163  
164 A: I didn't even know. It was at first time, Piedmont Hills, like I guess like ...  
165  
166 Q: Okay.  
167  
168 A: ... in Piedmont area ...  
169  
170 Q: Mm-hm.  
171  
172 A: ... the hilly.  
173  
174 Q: Mm-hm.  
175  
176 A: Um, like you see, like, all of San Jose right there.  
177  
178 Q: Oh, yeah, the kind of overdrive? Okay. I've been there.  
179  
180 A: Yeah.

181  
182 Q: So it overlooks the city?  
183  
184 A: Mm-hm.  
185  
186 Q: Uh-huh. Were there any other vehicles besides, uh, the one you're in and your  
187 friend's?  
188  
189 A: Um, there were not any.  
190  
191 Q: So you said two cars then, right?  
192  
193 A: Yeah.  
194  
195 Q: Okay. So you were in the car with whom?  
196  
197 A: Um, I was in a car with myself because I really want to sleep. I was listening  
198 to music and like cleaning the car out. And, um, so we could all go in, um,  
199 'cause we were gonna drop his car off, um, so he could, you know, get it  
200 fixed.  
201  
202 Q: Mm-hm.  
203  
204 A: So, um, like, as soon as, like, I was packing all my stuff, like my other friend  
205 got in my car and he was gonna drive by himself.  
206  
207 Q: Mm-hm.  
208  
209 A: So, yeah.  
210  
211 Q: Okay. So I'm kind of trying to understand everything that's going on, and I  
212 don't know everybody that was there.  
213  
214 A: Mm-hm.  
215  
216 Q: Um, but you're saying friends.  
217  
218 A: Yeah. Sorry.  
219  
220 Q: So was there - were there two cars or one car?  
221  
222 A: There were two cars.  
223  
224 Q: Two cars?  
225

226 A: Yes.  
227  
228 Q: So who shows up and who's in the first car?  
229  
230 A: The first car? Um, that's my friend (Henny) - (Hennessy).  
231  
232 Q: Okay. Your friend (Hennessy) is the first car?  
233  
234 A: Mm-hm.  
235  
236 Q: Okay. And was there anybody else with him in that car?  
237  
238 A: No. And my - my friend, um, Shae had just gotten out of that car, so she was  
239 like outside. She was staying outside. Like, she was like getting into mine.  
240  
241 Q: Okay. Well, that's - that's - that's back it away further. When you show up to  
242 look at the view ...  
243  
244 A: Mm-hm.  
245  
246 Q: Who shows up in the car with (Hennessy)?  
247  
248 A: Oh, no one. We followed him there.  
249  
250 Q: You followed him?  
251  
252 A: Yeah.  
253  
254 Q: Okay. So let's call his car the first car.  
255  
256 A: Okay.  
257  
258 Q: So (Hennessy) is driving the first car.  
259  
260 A: Mm-hm.  
261  
262 Q: What kind of car does he have?  
263  
264 A: I don't even know what kind of car it was. I just know it was green.  
265  
266 Q: A green car?  
267  
268 A: Mm-hm.  
269  
270 Q: Two-door? Four-door?

271  
272 A: Um, four.  
273  
274 Q: A four-door?  
275  
276 A: Mm-hm.  
277  
278 Q: Older? Newer?  
279  
280 A: Um, like, probably like a 2000, 2002 probably, like mine.  
281  
282 Q: Okay. So is it like the boxy type or round?  
283  
284 A: A round.  
285  
286 Q: Round?  
287  
288 A: Mm-hm.  
289  
290 Q: Okay. So he's driving that green car?  
291  
292 A: Mm-hm.  
293  
294 Q: And he's in vehicle number one. Who's in vehicle number two.  
295  
296 A: Um, and I.  
297  
298 Q: Okay. You and another friend?  
299  
300 A: Mm-hm.  
301  
302 Q: And what's your friend's name?  
303  
304 A:  
305  
306 Q:  
307  
308 A: I'm pretty sure. Yeah. Or, um, , probably.  
309  
310 Q: Okay.  
311  
312 A: Yeah.  
313  
314 Q: And what's her last name?  
315

316 A: I'm not sure. We went to high school together and we just barely got back up  
317 so ...  
318  
319 Q: Oh, you were in high school together?  
320  
321 A: Yeah.  
322  
323 Q: What high school?  
324  
325 A: Um, Yerba Buena.  
326  
327 Q: Yerba Buena?  
328  
329 A: Mm-hm.  
330  
331 Q: What year did you graduate?  
332  
333 A: Um, in 2008.  
334  
335 Q: Oh, okay. All right. So you were in high school together. You just started  
336 hanging out again. Okay. Um, and she's in the car with you.  
337  
338 A: Mm-hm.  
339  
340 Q: Who's driving that car?  
341  
342 A: Me?  
343  
344 Q: Is it your car?  
345  
346 A: Yes.  
347  
348 Q: Okay. And what kind of car do you have?  
349  
350 A: A 2002 Chrysler Sebring.  
351  
352 Q: Okay. Um, so you follow your friend (Hennessy) ...  
353  
354 A: Mm-hm.  
355  
356 Q: ... to this area to just take a look.  
357  
358 A: Mm-hm.  
359  
360 Q: Okay. Um, and how long were you there for?



361  
362 A: Um, we were there for like too long, obviously. Um, for about like an hour.  
363  
364 Q: For about an hour?  
365  
366 A: Yeah.  
367  
368 Q: Okay. Before the - the police showed up?  
369  
370 A: Yeah. Well, actually, no, like, probably like 30 minutes, because like - yeah,  
371 probably like 30 minutes to an hour.  
372  
373 Q: Okay. So you're - you're there for about 30 minutes ...  
374  
375 A: Mm-hm.  
376  
377 Q: ... beforehand? What were you guys doing?  
378  
379 A: Uh, we were like just sitting there, like watching the view, and like just to  
380 keep it 100, like they smoked the blunt.  
381  
382 Q: Mm-hm.  
383  
384 A: That's why - that's why I was in a separate car.  
385  
386 Q: Mm-hm.  
387  
388 A: Um, and like, pretty much after that, I guess after they finished the blunt, like  
389 that's when all this stuff went down. Um, and also, like, while we're there,  
390 um, he was like putting antifreeze and coolant stuff in his car. Like, his car is  
391 running funny.  
392  
393 Q: Uh.  
394  
395 A: And I had all the stuff in my car, so I let him use it.  
396  
397 Q: Oh, you carry antifreeze?  
398  
399 A: Yeah.  
400  
401 Q: Oh, nice.  
402  
403 A: Yeah, 'cause my car has been acting up crazy.  
404  
405 Q: Oh, okay.

406  
407 A: So, yeah. And, um, I let him use that stuff. So we were like just waiting for it.  
408 Like, you know, he's just messing with the car.  
409  
410 Q: Mm-hm.  
411  
412 A: I was staying out behind.  
413  
414 Q: Mm-hm.  
415  
416 A: 'Cause I'm moving, so I have all the stuff in my car.  
417  
418 Q: Moving where?  
419  
420 A: Um, I'm moving, um, to the east side 'cause I - I live with my grandmother.  
421 So she's - she has Section 8 and, um, we have to downsize.  
422  
423 Q: Okay.  
424  
425 A: So I'm moving like Saturday.  
426  
427 Q: Oh, that kind of sucks.  
428  
429 A: Yeah.  
430  
431 Q: Not by choice then?  
432  
433 A: Um, not really, no, not by choice.  
434  
435 Q: Okay. So this is the - the address you're living at right now?  
436  
437 A: Mm-hm.  
438  
439 Q: So what address are you moving to?  
440  
441 A: I don't know it yet.  
442  
443 Q: They haven't told you guys where you're gonna ...  
444  
445 A: Um, she knows, but I haven't seen the house yet.  
446  
447 Q: Oh, you haven't?  
448  
449 A: No.  
450

451 Q: Okay. And your grandmother's name is what?  
452  
453 A: Um,  
454  
455 Q:  
456  
457 A: Mm-hm.  
458  
459 Q: Same last name as you?  
460  
461 A: Yeah. Um, except with that  
462  
463 Q: I'm sorry.  
464  
465 A: Without the just  
466  
467 Q: Just  
468  
469 A: Mm-hm.  
470  
471 Q: Okay. Is that from your, uh ...  
472  
473 A: Dad.  
474  
475 Q: Yeah. Okay. Um, so she's the one that has Section 8 housing, though?  
476  
477 A: Yeah.  
478  
479 Q: Your grandmother? Okay. Um, and you said you were moving this weekend?  
480  
481 A: Yeah.  
482  
483 Q: So you have a lot of stuff in your car?  
484  
485 A: I mean, just like my memory boxes. Like, I have memory boxes just to store  
486 out pictures and stuff. So that's all.  
487  
488 Q: Oh, okay. So just a lot of photos?  
489  
490 A: Mm-hm.  
491  
492 Q: What about clothes and stuff like that?  
493  
494 A: Um, yeah, um, in the trunk.  
495

496 Q: Okay. Um, so you - okay, so you show up with the, um - you're there for  
497 about half an hour ...  
498  
499 A: To an hour.  
500  
501 Q: You said he's putting antifreeze in his car.  
502  
503 A: Mm-hm.  
504  
505 Q: Okay. Um, and they smoked the blunt, not you?  
506  
507 A: No.  
508  
509 Q: Okay.  
510  
511 A: I get discombobulated.  
512  
513 Q: You get what?  
514  
515 A: I get discombobulated.  
516  
517 Q: How so?  
518  
519 A: I'm so discombobulated, um, 'cause I can't really handle the marijuana.  
520  
521 Q: Oh, really? It affects you?  
522  
523 A: Yeah. And I use it for sleep mostly.  
524  
525 Q: Oh, okay. So you weren't ready to go to sleep?  
526  
527 A: Yeah - no.  
528  
529 Q: Okay.  
530  
531 A: It was like they started just too early.  
532  
533 Q: Yeah. Yeah. Okay. So - so they were the ones that were smoking?  
534  
535 A: Mm-hm.  
536  
537 Q: Okay. Um, and they were smoking where?  
538  
539 A: Oh, there's smoking in his car.  
540

541 Q: Oh, okay.  
542  
543 A: Mm-hm.  
544  
545 Q: Um, so while they were smoking, what were you doing?  
546  
547 A: I was in my car. I was listening to music and I was like just going through my  
548 pictures.  
549  
550 Q: Mm-hm.  
551  
552 A: And I started sticking them on the dashboard.  
553  
554 Q: Oh.  
555  
556 A: Like the ones of like, you know, my closest family members.  
557  
558 Q: Okay. Okay. Um, and how long have you known (Hennessy) for?  
559  
560 A: Uh, like, five years, like, you know, like we're - we don't - you know, he's  
561 one of those people who just kind of like disappear out of nowhere, you know,  
562 and then like - but you somehow run in back into each other.  
563  
564 Q: Okay. Um, how did you run back into?  
565  
566 A: Um, when did we run back into? Um, a friend of mine just got out from jail ...  
567  
568 Q: Mm-hm.  
569  
570 A: And like, her and him are really close.  
571  
572 Q: Okay.  
573  
574 A: And, um, I saw her, like, I met in this complex, um, that my car like stopped  
575 at and, um ...  
576  
577 Q: By chance?  
578  
579 A: Yeah.  
580  
581 Q: Oh, wow.  
582  
583 A: And he was with her.  
584  
585 Q: Mm-hm.

586  
587 A: Well, it's where my - my brother hangs out so ...  
588  
589 Q: Okay.  
590  
591 A: 'Cause we're pretty close.  
592  
593 Q: Okay. So he was at this complex?  
594  
595 A: Yeah.  
596  
597 Q: Uh-huh. Okay. And that's where you met him again?  
598  
599 A: Yeah.  
600  
601 Q: Okay. And that was when?  
602  
603 A: Like two weeks ago.  
604  
605 Q: Okay. So just recently then?  
606  
607 A: Yeah. Two weeks.  
608  
609 Q: But you've known him for how long?  
610  
611 A: Like five years.  
612  
613 Q: Did he also go to high school with you?  
614  
615 A: No.  
616  
617 Q: No? So where did you, uh, originally meet him?  
618  
619 A: Um, through my brother, um, 'cause like, um - yeah, it was through - through  
620 my brother.  
621  
622 Q: Did you ever have ...  
623  
624 A: Uh, through my brother and like someone else, though, like I was with at that  
625 time. Like, um, they were all really close together.  
626  
627 Q: Mm-hm.  
628  
629 A: I'm actually, like, not - pretty much not allowed to hang - hang out with  
630 anyone that my brother hangs out with, but I don't really listen.

631  
632 Q: Why is that?  
633  
634 A: Oh, just, um, how they feel - like my dad, like, didn't let me hang out with  
635 anyone 'cause like they're streetwise. You know, like, I'm - you know, I was  
636 raised by my grandma.  
637  
638 Q: Mm-hm.  
639  
640 A: Like, you know, my dad is in the streets. So like, you know, just doesn't want  
641 me hanging out with his friends 'cause that's ...  
642  
643 Q: Oh.  
644  
645 A: ... the purpose, so ...  
646  
647 Q: So, is your brother older or younger than you?  
648  
649 A: He's older.  
650  
651 Q: Okay. Uh, how much older?  
652  
653 A: He's is 26, 27.  
654  
655 Q: Okay. So, um ...  
656  
657 A: Oh, no, whoa, whoa, whoa, back up. He's like, um, almost in his 30s or he's  
658 29. He's 29. Sorry. We don't really - weren't that close 'cause on my dad's  
659 side family, so I believe he's 29 years old.  
660  
661 Q: Okay. So you - you're not close with your brother? No? You only have one  
662 brother?  
663  
664 A: Oh, no, I have two.  
665  
666 Q: Okay. So he's which - or where do you fall? Your - you have your older  
667 brother, you and who?  
668  
669 A: And my - my younger brother from my mom.  
670  
671 Q: So a younger one?  
672  
673 A: Yeah.  
674  
675 Q: Okay. And what's your older brother's name?

676  
677 A: Um,  
678  
679 Q: Same last name? What's his last name?  
680  
681 A: Um,  
682  
683 Q:  
684  
685 A: Mm-hm. Yeah, he's mixed.  
686  
687 Q: He's what?  
688  
689 A: He's mixed too. Um, half Mexican, half black.  
690  
691 Q: Oh, okay. Oh, okay. That explains a lot. Same then, huh?  
692  
693 A: Yeah.  
694  
695 Q: Okay. Um, so basic- so he's his friend then. (Hennessy) is, uh, friends with  
696 your brother Is it or  
697  
698 A: Um, yeah, His mom called him or Yeah.  
699  
700 Q:  
701  
702 A: Yeah.  
703  
704 Q: Yeah. 'Cause normally, like I said, we just say right?  
705  
706 A: Yeah.  
707  
708 Q: Okay. So Okay. And, um, so that's he - that's how you originally met  
709 (Hennessy)?  
710  
711 A: Mm-hm.  
712  
713 Q: Okay. And what does, uh, call (Hennessy)?  
714  
715 A: Um, he just called him hen- (Hennessy). Like, everyone calls him (Hennessy).  
716 Like, there's actually like a few (Hennessy)'s in our circle. So it's like ...  
717  
718 Q: Don't you get him confused?  
719  
720 A: Um, no, 'cause there's a female one and he's the male one. But, like, yeah,



721 people get it confused. Like, it's kind of irritating. But, you know, you just  
722 have to address if it's the female or male, you know.  
723  
724 Q: Oh, they say it's a female (Hennessy)?  
725  
726 A: Yeah.  
727  
728 Q: Really? That's kind of weird.  
729  
730 A: Yeah. Uh, there's like some other guy named (Hennessy), but I don't know - I  
731 haven't met him before. So, yeah.  
732  
733 Q: Multiple (Hennessys)? Really?  
734  
735 A: Yeah. Like, we'll - we'll ...  
736  
737 Q: I would say you guys should just go by your real name, you know?  
738  
739 A: Right. And multiple blacks, like multiple - like everything, like everybody  
740 like, you know, um, just everything. Like all the nicknames like you just run  
741 into a whole bunch and it gets ...  
742  
743 Q: Yeah, yeah.  
744  
745 A: ... complicated.  
746  
747 Q: How did he get named (Hennessy)?  
748  
749 A: No idea.  
750  
751 Q: Does he ...  
752  
753 A: It is how I got introduced to him so ...  
754  
755 Q: Does he like - like the alcoholic drink?  
756  
757 A: I've actually never seen (Hennessy) drink Hennessy. Uh, that's a good  
758 question.  
759  
760 Q: That'd be like cannibalism, huh?  
761  
762 A: Yeah, pretty much crazy.  
763  
764 Q: Okay. So anyways, um, I - I think we got off side-track.  
765

766 A: Sorry.  
767  
768 Q: Um.  
769  
770 A: I wouldn't do that.  
771  
772 Q: I know. Uh, I so do I. Um, so - so we were talking about, um, he was smoking  
773 with your friend.  
774  
775 A: Mm-hm.  
776  
777 Q: And you were fixing your memory box and your stuff inside your car. Um,  
778 and then eventually, he ends up using your antifreeze. So what happened after  
779 that?  
780  
781 A: Oh, um, he was using the antifreeze before like, um, they had smoked blunt.  
782  
783 Q: Okay. So he fixed his car before smoking?  
784  
785 A: Yeah.  
786  
787 Q: Okay.  
788  
789 A: So, um, pretty much after that, that's when everything popped off. That's  
790 when like, um - like - and I was sorting out pictures, like Shae walked into the  
791 car and like - I was like, "Oh, you're ready?" And she was like, "Yeah, we're  
792 ready."  
793  
794 Q: Mm-hm.  
795  
796 A: And then, um, I started - I'm just putting all the stuff back in the box and like  
797 took them in the backseat. She was in - in the - in the, um, passenger seat.  
798  
799 Q: Mm-hm.  
800  
801 A: And then before she even sat in the car, like, um, I looked up and there were  
802 two sheriff cars, um, in front of (Hennessy)'s car.  
803  
804 Q: Mm-hm.  
805  
806 A: Um, and after that, um ...  
807  
808 Q: So were they - you said they were in front, so were the deputies already out of  
809 their cars, or were they inside their cars?  
810

811 A: They were inside their cars.  
812  
813 Q: They were inside their cars? Okay. So where were you parked and - and  
814 where was (Hennessy) parked?  
815  
816 A: Well, like the - like the road goes on like that.  
817  
818 Q: Mm-hm.  
819  
820 A: Um, like there was like the curb, like, right to see the view. Um, (Hennessy)  
821 was like, like right here, and like I was behind him - directly behind him and  
822 then two cop cars were in front of him.  
823  
824 Q: Oh, okay. Okay. So it's - uh, in the view is this way?  
825  
826 A: Yeah.  
827  
828 Q: Okay. So the curb that's, um - is there a sign that says the - that says  
829 something about parking?  
830  
831 A: No. It's just said ...  
832  
833 Q: Is that where this at?  
834  
835 A: It said no littering - no littering and ...  
836  
837 Q: No littering, right?  
838  
839 A: Yeah.  
840  
841 Q: So there's this - okay, so I think I know where it's at. So - but - and that's like  
842 the one that actually leads like right out to ...  
843  
844 A: Yeah.  
845  
846 Q: You could, uh, see everything that's there.  
847  
848 A: Yeah.  
849  
850 Q: Okay. So he's parked right around the, uh - the corner?  
851  
852 A: Mm-hm.  
853  
854 Q: And then you're right behind him? Okay. And then the sheriff's cars came up,  
855 uh, you said this way?

856

857 A: Mm-hm. In front of them. Yeah.

858

859 Q: Okay. Um, and then what happened?

860

861 A: Um, um, the, um, officer got out, um, pretty aggressively like - 'cause we

862 were - you know, like my friend who just said, "Oh, hi." You know what I'm

863 saying? 'Cause we weren't up to anything, you know.

864

865 Q: Mm-hm.

866

867 A: And then he like - you know, he was like, "Okay, I need to see your ID and

868 like, your ID and your ID." So I walked up and I gave him my ID. Um, I

869 believe - I guess the other two didn't have an ID, which is always the case. I

870 don't know. And, um, so I - I gave him mine. And then after that, um, he

871 started asking about - oh, he got on the radio and started, um, "I'm running the

872 plates."

873

874 Q: Okay.

875

876 A: As soon as that started, like I - I already knew (Hennessy) is gonna take off,

877 like 'cause I - I heard the car starting to take off.

878

879 Q: Mm-hm.

880

881 A: And then like he backed up and then went forward, hit the car, and then

882 backed up again.

883

884 Q: Hey, look, whose car?

885

886 A: Um, the sheriff's.

887

888 Q: Oh, okay.

889

890 A: And backed up again and then went forward again.

891

892 Q: So you said you knew he was gonna take off? Why?

893

894 A: Uh, just like - just like - 'cause of what was going on. I didn't even know he

895 was already in the driver's seat 'cause like when, um, him and her were like

896 smoking in the car ...

897

898 Q: Mm-hm.

899

900 A: ... like he was in the passenger, she was in the driver's.

901  
902 Q: Okay.  
903  
904 A: So like, um, by the time like all that stuff happened, 'cause I wasn't paying  
905 attention to them. I was in my own world.  
906  
907 Q: Yeah. Your memory box.  
908  
909 A: Yeah.  
910  
911 Q: Yeah.  
912  
913 A: And I'm - by time, like, all that stuff happening, he's already in the driver's.  
914 And then once I heard that car start, I just - just knew he was gonna take off.  
915  
916 Q: You know that was him or - or you think that it was your - your friend?  
917  
918 A: Oh, no, it was - it was him because he was only one in the car. 'Cause  
919 remember she was - she was getting in my car 'cause like ...  
920  
921 Q: Oh, that's right. She came over to your car. That's right. She was getting  
922 ready to go in.  
923  
924 A: Yeah.  
925  
926 Q: So, um - okay. And so - so when the, uh - but when the deputies showed up,  
927 where was (Hennessy)? Was he inside his car? Was he outside?  
928  
929 A: Yeah, he was inside.  
930  
931 Q: He was inside his car? Okay. So he, um - so you said you knew he was gonna  
932 take off. Does - does he normally do this?  
933  
934 A: No, like there's a - you know, the, uh - there's - you know, there's people that  
935 are - I was asking the officer about this.  
936  
937 Q: Mm-hm.  
938  
939 A: There's a lot of people that like, you know, act totally intimidated. And, like,  
940 it makes them act out and like without thinking, you know.  
941  
942 Q: Mm-hm.  
943  
944 A: Like, when it comes to an officer, you know what I'm saying? Even if they  
945 just see them like driving, you know, around the corner or something, you

946 know, they just try to dodge them. I'm saying like ...  
947  
948 Q: He's naturally paranoid?  
949  
950 A: Naturally, just - I don't know, I guess so. I think it's because of, you know, his  
951 kids and stuff like that, you know. Like ...  
952  
953 Q: What - what do you mean?  
954  
955 A: Like, you know, um, he has a lot kids. You know, he doesn't want to ever put  
956 himself in a predicament, you know, get in trouble.  
957  
958 Q: Mm-hm.  
959  
960 A: But I don't know the rest of it. I don't know like anything like this, but ...  
961  
962 Q: Okay. How many kids does he have?  
963  
964 A: I'm actually not sure. I never met his kids.  
965  
966 Q: But you know he has kids?  
967  
968 A: Yeah.  
969  
970 Q: Okay. So is he a family man then or ...  
971  
972 A: Well, that's what we were working on. That's why we were together 'cause,  
973 um, we - we were working to work on, you know, like building our life. You  
974 know, like, yeah, 'cause I'm in - going transition of like, you know, trying to  
975 be on our own feet.  
976  
977 Q: Yeah, yeah.  
978  
979 A: So we're gonna like, you know, do applications and stuff, or like housing  
980 assistance, all that.  
981  
982 Q: Mm-hm.  
983  
984 A: Like, today was the day we were gonna finally do that, and then this stuff  
985 happened.  
986  
987 Q: So you're gonna do that with - with (Hennessy) and your other friend, or just  
988 (Hennessy)?  
989  
990 A: Oh, just (Hennessy).

991  
992 Q: Just (Hennessy)? Okay. Um, but you said, uh, just - you guys went there first,  
993 instead of doing the applications and stuff beforehand?  
994  
995 A: Yeah. Because we were following him and, um - 'cause we were following  
996 him to where he's gonna drop his car off then ...  
997  
998 Q: Mm-hm.  
999  
1000 A: ... um, to get it fixed.  
1001  
1002 Q: Mm-hm.  
1003  
1004 A: But then instead, like, he like, I guess, surprised me and like took us up there  
1005 to see the view.  
1006  
1007 Q: Okay.  
1008  
1009 A: Like, we needed it. You know what I'm saying? It's always nice to do that.  
1010 But ...  
1011  
1012 Q: To just chill for a bit?  
1013  
1014 A: Yeah.  
1015  
1016 Q: Absolutely.  
1017  
1018 A: I actually feel like it's my fault.  
1019  
1020 Q: No, no. You know, we just have to, uh - like I said I'm just trying to figure out  
1021 what happened. I - I don't know.  
1022  
1023 A: So, um, after, um, he took off, and then like they pointed the guns at him. And  
1024 they told him that, you know, like, "Don't proceed or you know, you'll be  
1025 shot at." And then like, at that point, I'm pretty much just like put my ears and  
1026 like closed my eyes and like squealed 'cause like I've never been in that  
1027 predicament, you know.  
1028  
1029 Q: Oh, wow.  
1030  
1031 A: So, um, yeah, and he took off and that's - that's all that happened.  
1032  
1033 Q: But when you said you plugged your ears, what - what do you mean? Did you  
1034 ...  
1035

1036 A: Oh, I was - I was going like this.  
1037  
1038 Q: Oh, so you actually put your hands up to your ears?  
1039  
1040 A: Yeah, 'cause they're - they're pointing the - the guns at him and like, he ...  
1041  
1042 Q: Uh-huh.  
1043  
1044 A: He kept going and like they warned him about it, so ...  
1045  
1046 Q: Okay.  
1047  
1048 A: I got a little scared so ...  
1049  
1050 Q: So what were the officers saying?  
1051  
1052 A: Um, they're like, oh, um - they're like, "Stop, stop," and then like - like - I  
1053 don't know if it's like "Stop the car," pretty much and like ...  
1054  
1055 Q: Mm-hm.  
1056  
1057 A: You know, like, "We'll shoot if you, you know, keep going."  
1058  
1059 Q: Okay.  
1060  
1061 A: And he just kept - 'cause like they were talking to - like the one that got out of  
1062 the car ...  
1063  
1064 Q: Mm-hm.  
1065  
1066 A: He was talking to, uh, my friend and I. So like (Hennessy) is all the way over  
1067 here in his car, you know.  
1068  
1069 Q: Okay.  
1070  
1071 A: So like - like they weren't paying attention to him, you know ...  
1072  
1073 Q: Okay.  
1074  
1075 A: ... at that moment, you know, because they're collecting IDs. I was - I just  
1076 barely passed the guy my ID - the officer.  
1077  
1078 Q: Mm-hm.  
1079  
1080 A: And that's just when all happened.



1081  
1082 Q: Okay. So were both officers then by your car?  
1083  
1084 A: Um, yeah. The other one, I didn't really - it's kind of like cloudy on that area.  
1085  
1086 Q: Okay. So who's - who's the one that you were talking to?  
1087  
1088 A: Um, I'm not sure of his name. But like the first one that got out of the car  
1089 asked for the IDs.  
1090  
1091 Q: Mm-hm.  
1092  
1093 A: That's who I was talking to.  
1094  
1095 Q: Uh, do you remember what he you looked like?  
1096  
1097 A: I'm not really - like, it's kind of a blur.  
1098  
1099 Q: Mm-hm.  
1100  
1101 A: I'm stripping on everything else.  
1102  
1103 Q: Yeah, yeah. Okay. Um, so you heard - you heard - you said you heard the -  
1104 the, uh, car turned on. Um, and you heard the officer say, uh, "Stop."  
1105  
1106 A: Yeah. Like when the car turned on, but I don't think it get even clipped with  
1107 officers that ...  
1108  
1109 Q: Mm-hm.  
1110  
1111 A: ... he is about to leave him, you know what I'm saying?  
1112  
1113 Q: Okay.  
1114  
1115 A: Like 'cause, um - yeah, they clicked, and then right when he started backing  
1116 up and moving forward and stuff, that - that's when they started yelling at him  
1117 to stop.  
1118  
1119 Q: Did he hit your car?  
1120  
1121 A: No.  
1122  
1123 Q: Your car - he didn't hit your car? But you said it hit the - the deputy's car?  
1124  
1125 A: Yeah, 'cause it was like directly in front of them. So in order for him to get

1126 out, he had to, you know, kind of go around them. But he just went straight  
1127 forward when he was trying to get out of there.  
1128  
1129 Q: I'm more of a visual person.  
1130  
1131 A: Mm-hm.  
1132  
1133 Q: Would you just draw like - like where - where the, uh, car was at?  
1134  
1135 A: Mm-hm.  
1136  
1137 Q: I think it would help me, um, just - as far as - okay. So - so if the view is this  
1138 way, right?  
1139  
1140 A: Mm-hm.  
1141  
1142 Q: Okay.  
1143  
1144 A: So this is like - this is the view.  
1145  
1146 Q: Okay.  
1147  
1148 A: Um, this is like all the trees and stuff.  
1149  
1150 Q: Mm-hm.  
1151  
1152 A: And like, my car is - my car is right here.  
1153  
1154 Q: Okay.  
1155  
1156 A: His car is on - here's his car like - pretty much like at the curb kinda, 'cause  
1157 he wasn't directly in front.  
1158  
1159 Q: Mm-hm.  
1160  
1161 A: But it's like the whole distance.  
1162  
1163 Q: Yeah.  
1164  
1165 A: And then, um, Car 1. You said one, right? Car 1?  
1166  
1167 Q: Yeah.  
1168  
1169 A: Okay. Car 2, and then, um, the officers like we're parked like directly in front  
1170 of him like that. So like, instead of backing up, like in - so he can get out ...

1171  
1172 Q: Mm-hm.  
1173  
1174 A: And he just went for first, and like tried to turn out in order to get ...  
1175  
1176 Q: Mm-hm.  
1177  
1178 A: ... get out of there.  
1179  
1180 Q: Mm-hm.  
1181  
1182 A: Yeah. So that's how we hit the car.  
1183  
1184 Q: Okay. So the - the front of the deputies' car is this way or that way?  
1185  
1186 A: Um, this way. It's facing us.  
1187  
1188 Q: Okay. So that way?  
1189  
1190 A: Mm-hm.  
1191  
1192 Q: Okay.  
1193  
1194 A: Yeah.  
1195  
1196 Q: So - so when the, um - when the deputy came over, he started talking to - to  
1197 you first ...  
1198  
1199 A: Yeah.  
1200  
1201 Q: Instead of ...  
1202  
1203 A: Well, you know, he point- he pointed at (Hennessy) first.  
1204  
1205 Q: Mm-hm.  
1206  
1207 A: He pointed at him and said, "Okay, I need your ID."  
1208  
1209 Q: Mm-hm.  
1210  
1211 A: And he walked at like - right to like - really like right here, kind of.  
1212  
1213 Q: Mm-hm.  
1214  
1215 A: Then he - he point - he pointed to both and I ...

1216  
1217 Q: Okay.  
1218  
1219 A: ... and asked us for ID.  
1220  
1221 Q: Okay.  
1222  
1223 A: And so like, I walked up to him, and then hand him mine.  
1224  
1225 Q: Okay.  
1226  
1227 A: And then as I was walking into him, like, then the - that maneuver.  
1228  
1229 Q: Mm-hm. So you only re- you - you said you only remember seeing the one  
1230 you interacted with?  
1231  
1232 A: Yeah.  
1233  
1234 Q: That one deputy? Okay.  
1235  
1236 A: He was like pretty much like over here somewhere. Like - like, no, like,  
1237 actually behind right here 'cause he - he - the second car.  
1238  
1239 Q: Okay.  
1240  
1241 A: So, um, yeah.  
1242  
1243 Q: Okay. So where was when - when, um ...  
1244  
1245 A: Oh, was right here on the other side.  
1246  
1247 Q: So she was outside?  
1248  
1249 A: Yeah.  
1250  
1251 Q: Okay. And you ended up walking up to the deputy?  
1252  
1253 A: Yeah.  
1254  
1255 Q: Okay. So that when you - you said you heard the deputy, um, yelling to stop,  
1256 who was yelling? Was it him or is it the other deputy?  
1257  
1258 A: Um, mostly, I think it was - it was this one.  
1259  
1260 Q: Okay.

1261  
1262 A: The one I was talking to. Um, the one that was not the one - the one that I  
1263 didn't - hadn't talked to at all ...  
1264  
1265 Q: Mm-hm. Mm-hm.  
1266  
1267 A: ... um, he was the one who shot.  
1268  
1269 Q: Okay. And how do you know that?  
1270  
1271 A: Um, because, um, I remember he was the one with his gun pointed. I just  
1272 remember visually - like I just remember he had a gun pointed. And like, um,  
1273 (Hennessy) like drove pretty much like this way. And he was like pretty much  
1274 in the middle, like right here.  
1275  
1276 Q: Mm-hm.  
1277  
1278 A: And that was like ...  
1279  
1280 Q: Who was right here?  
1281  
1282 A: Um, Car 1. So he maneu- he maneuvered ...  
1283  
1284 Q: Okay.  
1285  
1286 A: ... to there. And, um, by the time he got right there, like then that's pretty  
1287 much like they started shooting.  
1288  
1289 Q: Okay.  
1290  
1291 A: He only got right there because like being - it was obvious that he wasn't  
1292 gonna stop.  
1293  
1294 Q: Okay. And so where was the officer at, that was shooting?  
1295  
1296 A: Uh, he was right here. So like when he started - start the car and all that, I  
1297 guess he probably - he probably ran this way. Because I didn't pay that much  
1298 attention to that guy. So he probably ran like around the car, and then ended  
1299 up right there and he started shooting.  
1300  
1301 Q: Okay.  
1302  
1303 A: 'Cause he - he was on this side of the car like by the time all the - he started  
1304 shooting. So like - 'cause he - remember he started out right here.  
1305

1306 Q: Yeah. So you - you said you - you saw him somewhere out here.  
1307  
1308 A: Yeah.  
1309  
1310 Q: But you were dealing with this one?  
1311  
1312 A: Yeah.  
1313  
1314 Q: And then you heard the - the stop?  
1315  
1316 A: Yeah.  
1317  
1318 Q: Right? Okay. So then, um - and he obviously ends up hitting one of the cars  
1319 like you said.  
1320  
1321 A: Mm-hm.  
1322  
1323 Q: Um, that you - were you always - I mean, I don't know, um.  
1324  
1325 A: Well, I was right here the whole time. Um, he - he was standing right there.  
1326  
1327 Q: Mm-hm.  
1328  
1329 A: He walked towards it. But the one, um - the one ...  
1330  
1331 Q: But the other officer - I mean, there's - from this point to this point, do you  
1332 remember seeing him walk or run, or do anything?  
1333  
1334 A: No.  
1335  
1336 Q: No?  
1337  
1338 A: I - I think do remember, um, seeing him run over there. I just remember seeing  
1339 - I remember that he ended up on this side of the car.  
1340  
1341 Q: Okay. So you - so when you saw him, you saw him here. And the - the next  
1342 time you saw him over here?  
1343  
1344 A: Yeah.  
1345  
1346 Q: And when you saw him over here, um, was that before or after the car had  
1347 passed, or during the car passing?  
1348  
1349 A: That was like - um, when he made that maneuver ...  
1350

- 1351 Q: Mm-hm.  
1352
- 1353 A: That was like during the, um - like the starting of the car then the reversing.  
1354
- 1355 Q: Yeah, yeah.  
1356
- 1357 A: I believe so.  
1358
- 1359 Q: Okay. And what else do you remember hearing?  
1360
- 1361 A: Um, just like the gunshots and me screaming, and that's about it. That way -  
1362 and then after that, like, then, um, 'cause, um, Shae and I were - you know, we  
1363 were cooperating.  
1364
- 1365 Q: Mm-hm.  
1366
- 1367 A: So like after that, like, um, the other officer that I had been talking to in the  
1368 beginning, um, and the one I had in my YouTube, um, he, like, was pointing  
1369 the gun at us and like yelling at us, you know what I'm saying, like to get  
1370 down, this and that. And, um, just I know it was insanely, um ...  
1371
- 1372 Q: Stressful, huh?  
1373
- 1374 A: Yeah. Um, yeah, he was pointing the gun at us. He told us to put our hands up.  
1375 Actually, I was still in the car. I'm like, you know, "What's that? Fuck, what's  
1376 going on?" I was in the car. Like I was giving my ID and then, um, yeah, he -  
1377 he - yeah. So I was standing right there still after giving my ID.  
1378
- 1379 Q: Mm-hm.  
1380
- 1381 A: He had a gun pointed at me. And he goes, he got around. And then, um, even  
1382 after we were on the ground, like he was still pointing it at us, like yelling and  
1383 stuff. And then he eventually calmed down, like after he got - after he, um,  
1384 went on him on the mic or whatever. Then, um, after that, like he put us in  
1385 handcuffs, and that was it.  
1386
- 1387 Q: Okay. How many shots did you hear?  
1388
- 1389 A: I tried not to hear them.  
1390
- 1391 Q: Mm-hm.  
1392
- 1393 A: So I could probably approximately say like three.  
1394
- 1395 Q: So you - you heard three? And I know you were trying to cover your ears and

1396 trying to ...  
1397  
1398 A: Not hear, um.  
1399  
1400 Q: ... not hear all the stuff that was going on. But what you did hear was three  
1401 shots?  
1402  
1403 A: Let me think, um, it's like three or four.  
1404  
1405 Q: Okay. Um, what else do you remember hearing besides the shots and - and the  
1406 car turning on?  
1407  
1408 A: I just hear them on the - on the intercom thing ...  
1409  
1410 Q: Mm-hm.  
1411  
1412 A: ... shots fired and this and that. And then the officer that actually, like, was  
1413 shooting at him, um, like he was a little freaked out about it, you know.  
1414  
1415 Q: Mm-hm.  
1416  
1417 A: ... 'cause it's not easy doing that stuff. So he's a little freaked out. And I just  
1418 heard him saying to himself, like, "Shots fired, shots fired." That's all I  
1419 remember.  
1420  
1421 Q: Mm-hm.  
1422  
1423 A: And I was just standing on all the chaos. And after that, we just sat in the  
1424 vehicles for quite a bit.  
1425  
1426 Q: That's what you remembered hearing the - the other officer say? Okay. Did he  
1427 say anything else? No?  
1428  
1429 A: Uh, just like when the other officers came up, they were just talking about his  
1430 aim and like how the aim was and you know. That's all.  
1431  
1432 Q: Okay. Um, did your friend, uh, Shae say anything?  
1433  
1434 A: I know, um, when they told us to go on the ground, she asked the officer if she  
1435 could, um - 'cause we're going kind of downhill.  
1436  
1437 Q: Mm-hm.  
1438  
1439 A: So, um, she asked the off-officer if she could put her - put her head and face  
1440 the other way, you know, and then like the one that, um, had done - done the



1441 shooting, like he just like - he was like, "Oh, yeah, yeah," like, "Shut up," you  
1442 know, like - just like for no apparent reason, you know.  
1443

1444 Q: Mm-hm.  
1445

1446 A: And she asked like kindly, so I don't - and then that, um - that's pretty much  
1447 it.  
1448

1449 Q: Okay. Um, was your car shot or anything? No? Okay. You weren't injured in  
1450 any sort of way? Okay. Um, anything else you think that we didn't talk about?  
1451

1452 A: No.  
1453

1454 Q: No? Where - where is your friend now?  
1455

1456 A: She, um, apparently is here, I know.  
1457

1458 Q: Okay.  
1459

1460 A: Um, I'd like to know as well - like they didn't tell us anything. You know,  
1461 like - usually like I would think that they'll tell you something.  
1462

1463 Q: Mm-hm. Mm-hm.  
1464

1465 A: But he just put us in handcuffs and like put us in the car.  
1466

1467 Q: Okay.  
1468

1469 A: Like, we sat there pretty long, so like without hearing a word, you know.  
1470

1471 Q: And what about, uh, (Hennessy), where's he at?  
1472

1473 A: I have no idea.  
1474

1475 Q: Where did he drive to, do you know? Okay. Where do you think he would  
1476 drive to?  
1477

1478 A: Honestly, like, I don't think he would drive anywhere. Like, that I wouldn't  
1479 know that you would drive to - you know what I mean? Like, I think he would  
1480 just - he would just drive to ...  
1481

1482 Q: Mm-hm.  
1483

1484 A: ... like to make sure he's cool, you know.  
1485

1486 Q: And leave you guys there?  
1487  
1488 A: Well, he has a (unintelligible), I guess. But, um, I'm - I'm pretty sure like, you  
1489 know, he probably would have known that I would have been okay, you know  
1490 what I'm saying? Because I don't - I don't get in trouble and stuff. And so - so  
1491 like, I - I was thinking that - the same thing in the car.  
1492  
1493 Q: Mm-hm.  
1494  
1495 A: Like, why would you leave me? Like, you know, it's kind of messed up.  
1496  
1497 Q: Yes.  
1498  
1499 A: That happened, and so people ...  
1500  
1501 Q: Hmm, I don't know. I wouldn't leave her.  
1502  
1503 A: Yeah.  
1504  
1505 Q: I think - yeah, but - okay. Um, do you want some water?  
1506  
1507 A: No, I'm okay. I just had some. Thank you.  
1508  
1509 Q: Are you sure?  
1510  
1511 A: Mm-hm.  
1512  
1513 Q: 'Cause I'm gonna get some water, though. I'm kind of thirsty.  
1514  
1515 A: Okay.  
1516  
1517 Q: So I'll be right back. Okay? Are you sure? I think I'll just get you a cup of  
1518 water and you know ...  
1519  
1520 A: Okay. Thank you.  
1521  
1522 Q: Sure. Everything okay?  
1523  
1524 A: Yeah. I'm just wondering if, like, he's okay, and you know.  
1525  
1526 Q: And who's okay?  
1527  
1528 A: Um, my friend (Hennessy).  
1529  
1530 Q: Yeah. How would you get ahold of him?

1531  
1532 A: Um, actually, there's never a way to get ahold of him. Like, it's like  
1533 impossible. I mean, I don't reach him for like couple days. But, um, like,  
1534 usually, like I just run into him or pop into him 'cause like sometimes we chill  
1535 in the same locations, you know.  
1536  
1537 Q: Yeah?  
1538  
1539 A: Yeah. So, like, I just stop staying in those locations 'cause I'm trying, you  
1540 know - and try to do everything, you know.  
1541  
1542 Q: Mm-hm. Yeah. So how did you guys end up hooking up today?  
1543  
1544 A: Um, well, like, we just meet up long time ago. And, um, like - I guess he's -  
1545 he was having car trouble. And so I told him, like, from my other friend's  
1546 phone, I told him that my phones are broken. Like, I just like cracked them.  
1547 The screens are actually in my car now.  
1548  
1549 Q: Um, that happens.  
1550  
1551 A: Uh, right, I guess so. And, um, so I texted him from a friend's phone and, um,  
1552 I told him that I had a car now, 'cause like my car just got fixed like  
1553 yesterday. I was like, "Hey, I have a car now, you know what I'm saying? So,  
1554 like, why didn't you show up the other day? You know, we're supposed to  
1555 meet." And, um, he told me to call him, so I called him from our phone. And  
1556 then, um, he said he was, like, close by, like fixing his car. But his car shut on  
1557 him. So, um, yeah. Um, eventually ...  
1558  
1559 Q: What did you say? His car shut on him?  
1560  
1561 A: Yeah. And, um, so eventually, like, I just waited, um, with my friend. Um,  
1562 and this is not the friend- this is not Shae, like totally different friend, a mutual  
1563 friend.  
1564  
1565 Q: And who's the friend?  
1566  
1567 A: Um, her name is, um,  
1568  
1569 Q:  
1570  
1571 A: Yeah.  
1572  
1573 Q: Is that short for or ...  
1574  
1575 A: No, like

1576  
1577 Q: How do you spell that?  
1578  
1579 A: Um,  
1580  
1581 Q: Okay. Do you know her last name?  
1582  
1583 A: No.  
1584  
1585 Q: Okay. And how do you know her?  
1586  
1587 A: Um, through mutual friends. Just ...  
1588  
1589 Q: Okay. Where does she stay?  
1590  
1591 A: Um, she stays on east side.  
1592  
1593 Q: On east side?  
1594  
1595 A: Yeah. Um, she says on, um,  
1596  
1597 Q:  
1598  
1599 A: I think it's or - I'm trying to visually remember the signs.  
1600  
1601  
1602 Q: You've been in her place up before then?  
1603  
1604 A: Yeah, a heck of times. I carry ...  
1605  
1606 Q: So she's a good friend?  
1607  
1608 A: Yeah.  
1609  
1610 Q: And is that a house or apartment over there?  
1611  
1612 A: It's an - it's an apartment.  
1613  
1614 Q: It's an apartment. Okay. Which complex?  
1615  
1616 A: Um, you mean like the name of the apartment?  
1617  
1618 Q: Yeah.  
1619  
1620 A: I'm not sure with the name of apartment complex.

1621  
1622 Q: Okay. Where is it?  
1623  
1624 A: Well, I don't know if it's like townhomes or whatever. Like, we like - you  
1625 have to have like the multiple homes that look alike.  
1626  
1627 Q: Yeah.  
1628  
1629 A: Like they don't - some of them have names like on the front and like a big  
1630 complex with a small - small condo.  
1631  
1632 Q: Yeah. Okay. Fine. So you've used phone to give him a call?  
1633  
1634 A: Mm-hm.  
1635  
1636 Q: Okay. You know his number then?  
1637  
1638 A: Like, I can't remember it and my phones are in the car. I brought them at the  
1639 scene. I guess, I don't know what's gonna happen with that. But, um, um, I  
1640 can't remember the number by heart. He always has different numbers. He  
1641 always jumps around. It's like any number of the last number he called me  
1642 off, so I would call him on that number.  
1643  
1644 Q: Okay. But his numbers in your - one of your phones are the same?  
1645  
1646 A: Um, yeah, but those phones are broken. Like, one of the phones, you can't  
1647 even touch the screen. Like you can't, you know, do anything 'cause the  
1648 screen is cracked. And the other phone, the new one that I just closed in the  
1649 trunk today, like, screen is shattered.  
1650  
1651 Q: Yeah? That's a bummer.  
1652  
1653 A: And I just turned it off.  
1654  
1655 Q: So what about another - and you just have two or ...  
1656  
1657 A: Yeah.  
1658  
1659 Q: Well, what do they look like? I know you said one of them has a cracked  
1660 screen from today. What kind of phone is that?  
1661  
1662 A: Um, it's a Windows phone.  
1663  
1664 Q: Windows?  
1665

1666 A: Yeah. Oh, the one - the Windows, um, Microsoft. You know, the - the  
1667 Windows phone with like, you know, the - what's it called? Microsoft 8 or  
1668 something like that.  
1669  
1670 Q: Mm-hm. Yeah.  
1671  
1672 A: Um, they use that program. So it looks like, you know, the Windows 8 ...  
1673  
1674 Q: Yeah.  
1675  
1676 A: ... with all the apps and the boxes. And then, um, the other phone is LG.  
1677  
1678 Q: LG?  
1679  
1680 A: Yeah.  
1681  
1682 Q: Okay. But the Windows one is the one that you just cracked today?  
1683  
1684 A: No, the Windows is one - is the one I cracked first.  
1685  
1686 Q: Oh, okay.  
1687  
1688 A: The LG is the one I cracked today.  
1689  
1690 Q: Does it have one of those cool cases or something on it or ...  
1691  
1692 A: No.  
1693  
1694 Q: What does it look like?  
1695  
1696 A: Um, the Windows or the LG?  
1697  
1698 Q: The LG.  
1699  
1700 A: Um, the LG, it's black and with a messed-up screen.  
1701  
1702 Q: Messed up screen?  
1703  
1704 A: It's kind of like bent backwards.  
1705  
1706 Q: You must have a good screensaver or something on it. Good picture?  
1707  
1708 A: No. You can't see it because it's cracked.  
1709  
1710 Q: But before it was cracked. Like, we all have cool photos for our screensavers.

1711  
1712 A: What picture do I have on my screensaver? I think it was my cat.  
1713  
1714 Q: Your cat?  
1715  
1716 A: Yeah.  
1717  
1718 Q: What color of cat do you have?  
1719  
1720 A: Black and - black and white.  
1721  
1722 Q: Black and white? What's its name?  
1723  
1724 A:  
1725  
1726 Q: What?  
1727  
1728 A: Well, it's actually from ( Never heard of  
1729  
1730 Q: Ah, I have,  
1731  
1732 A: Yeah.  
1733  
1734 Q: That makes sense, doesn't it? Okay. So, um - so you used phone to  
1735 call (Hennessy).  
1736  
1737 A: Mm-hm.  
1738  
1739 Q: Um, and then again - tell me again how you guys ended up hooking up today?  
1740  
1741 A: Um, he drove over, um, and met me and then we're gonna drop his car off.  
1742  
1743 Q: And where did you guys meet at?  
1744  
1745 A: Out at  
1746  
1747 Q: At house.  
1748  
1749 A: Mm-hm.  
1750  
1751 Q: Oh, it's - it's (  
1752  
1753 A: Yeah, it's - like it's ( I just call her  
1754  
1755 Q: Okay.

1756  
1757 A: Mm-hm.  
1758  
1759 Q: So you met at house?  
1760  
1761 A: Mm-hm.  
1762  
1763 Q: Um, was home when you guys met?  
1764  
1765 A: Mm-hm.  
1766  
1767 Q: Okay. Um, do you know number?  
1768  
1769 A: Um, no, it's in my phone.  
1770  
1771 Q: Okay. All right. Um, who - who else - who does stay with?  
1772  
1773 A: Um, she's just by herself.  
1774  
1775 Q: By herself? Okay.  
1776  
1777 A: That's why I was over there to take me, though. She's like being by herself.  
1778  
1779 Q: Oh, it's nice you got a friend, huh? Okay. So you guys met at  
1780 house, and then what happened?  
1781  
1782 A: Um, we watched a movie, um, got ready for the day, planned it out, talked  
1783 about it and, um ...  
1784  
1785 Q: What did you guys plan?  
1786  
1787 A: Um, just the application for housing and stuff.  
1788  
1789 Q: Okay.  
1790  
1791 A: And, um, you know, to, like, actually be active and productive and positive for  
1792 once, you know. That's all we were trying to do.  
1793  
1794 Q: What do you mean for once?  
1795  
1796 A: Like, you know, like - as in like building our future, you know what I'm  
1797 saying?  
1798  
1799 Q: Mm-hm.  
1800



1801 A: Like, something that has to do with future type stuff, or like building our  
1802 foundation, you know what I'm saying ...  
1803

1804 Q: Mm-hm.  
1805

1806 A: ... in order to get to a place or something. But like usually like - it's like just  
1807 hanging out, like, "Hey," you know what I'm saying? Like watching a movie  
1808 and like just doing nothing. So we're just trying to make a difference, like  
1809 change it up a little bit.  
1810

1811 Q: It sounds like you and (Hennessy) are pretty tight, huh?  
1812

1813 A: Yeah.  
1814

1815 Q: Okay.  
1816

1817 A: He's someone that will always - always be cool with.  
1818

1819 Q: And how often do you see him?  
1820

1821 A: Not - no - I know it sounds crazy, but it's just, uh, when I run into him, you  
1822 know what I'm saying?  
1823

1824 Q: Mm-hm.  
1825

1826 A: Like, that's like I try not to let him out of my sight 'cause I know I'm not  
1827 gonna see him again for like a long time, you know.  
1828

1829 Q: Mm-hm. (Unintelligible), huh?  
1830

1831 A: Yeah.  
1832

1833 Q: Where do you usually run into him at?  
1834

1835 A: Um, various places.  
1836

1837 Q: Like what?  
1838

1839 A: Um, well, sometimes he comes over, you know, like meets me at my house or  
1840 - that's pretty much it. Um, my house and where we were ...  
1841

1842 Q: Huh?  
1843

1844 A: At my house and where we were like, um, wherever, like my brother is or  
1845 something, like I'll just meet up with him there, you know. But like it's just

1846 like not places I remember exactly because sometimes it's like just random  
1847 places.  
1848  
1849 Q: Yeah, yeah.  
1850  
1851 A: And he'll be with a mutual friend or something.  
1852  
1853 Q: Oh, okay. You got - was it just the three of you earlier today up there looking  
1854 at the view or ...  
1855  
1856 A: Mm-hm. It was the three of us, yeah.  
1857  
1858 Q: Okay. So I was trying to follow along with this diagram. I'm not sure if I  
1859 followed it correctly.  
1860  
1861 A: Mm-hm.  
1862  
1863 Q: So here is - I brought you water just in case.  
1864  
1865 A: Thank you.  
1866  
1867 Q: But we - I'm not, gonna, um - sorry to interrupt.  
1868  
1869 A: No problem.  
1870  
1871 Q: They'll bring that I think it'll help me out.  
1872  
1873 A: Okay.  
1874  
1875 Q: I'll wait until she closes the door. Privacy.  
1876  
1877 A: Am I doing something wrong here or like ...  
1878  
1879 Q: Pardon me.  
1880  
1881 A: Am I doing something wrong or like ...  
1882  
1883 Q: No. Not at all. Just in here ...  
1884  
1885 A: You just want me to tell you the story here enough or ...  
1886  
1887 Q: No. And remember - so I ...  
1888  
1889 A: I just wanted to make sure  
1890

1891 Q: Remember I told you I'm a visual person. I wasn't kidding when I said I was  
1892 visual.  
1893

1894 A: Yeah, I am too.  
1895

1896 Q: Um, so we have this like little room where we have a bunch of toys, um, so  
1897 it's not that ...  
1898

1899 A: Mm-hm.  
1900

1901 Q: Um, because, um, it helps me to kind of see where - where things are at. So  
1902 let's do this.  
1903

1904 Q1: Okay. It's over here.  
1905

1906 Q: So if I say, okay, based on what you kind of described here, so let's say this is  
1907 (Hennessy)'s car, right? Somewhere like that? Because this is the view, it goes  
1908 like, uh, like around. This is gonna be your car? You're right behind it? Right?  
1909

1910 A: Mm-hm.  
1911

1912 Q: And you can move them because I don't ...  
1913

1914 A: Okay.  
1915

1916 Q: I'm just kind of going on what you have here. So if your car is there, that's  
1917 (Hennessy)'s car, and then the patrol cars - this - this is the front of the patrol  
1918 cars, right? So they come up. Okay. So please - yeah, please fix them up. And  
1919 this is - so these are the two patrol cars?  
1920

1921 A: Mm-hm.  
1922

1923 Q: Okay. So ...  
1924

1925 A: So like they're like this.  
1926

1927 Q: Okay. So like back to back?  
1928

1929 A: Yeah. And then like, right here.  
1930

1931 Q: And there's some ...  
1932

1933 A: That's where the curb started. So I'm like right here, like, for instance.  
1934

1935 Q: Okay. So this is, um - there's some space in between your car and - and his.

1936 Okay. So then let's say, um, this one can be the - the deputy that you were  
1937 talking to.  
1938  
1939 A: Mm-hm.  
1940  
1941 Q: So where was he?  
1942  
1943 A: Uh, he is right here.  
1944  
1945 Q: I know like what it stands, but it's ...  
1946  
1947 A: I know this 'cause, uh ...  
1948  
1949 Q: And he kind of too - okay, so he was there?  
1950  
1951 A: Mm-hm.  
1952  
1953 Q: Okay. And then we're gonna use Batman for the second deputy. Where was  
1954 he at? No, I think it stands for that.  
1955  
1956 A: Um, I believe he was like right here.  
1957  
1958 Q: Okay.  
1959  
1960 A: Still walking up kind of like - I think he walked probably to this side of  
1961 (Hennessy)'s car.  
1962  
1963 Q: Okay. So, hmm, he does ...  
1964  
1965 A: That looks pretty tight.  
1966  
1967 Q: Doesn't it? Okay. So I'm a visual ...  
1968  
1969 A: Mm-hm.  
1970  
1971 Q: ... visual learner. Um, so if, uh - if - tell me when - so when the deputies show  
1972 up, this is - this is how it's - it's, uh - it's lined up, right?  
1973  
1974 A: Mm-hm.  
1975  
1976 Q: This deputy, you said goes out here ...  
1977  
1978 A: Mm-hm.  
1979  
1980 Q: ... tells (Hennessy).

1981  
1982 A: Yeah, he just ...  
1983  
1984 Q: Just walk me through how - how he ...  
1985  
1986 A: Do you want me to start from the beginning?  
1987  
1988 Q: Yes.  
1989  
1990 A: Okay.  
1991  
1992 Q: Yes, please.  
1993  
1994 A: Here we go. Definitely. Okay. So we're just sticking it?  
1995  
1996 Q: Okay.  
1997  
1998 A: One and then me by myself.  
1999  
2000 Q: Okay. With your memory box.  
2001  
2002 A: Yup.  
2003  
2004 Q: Got it.  
2005  
2006 A: So, um, we're, um - Shae - I don't - I don't know he's doing. I don't know  
2007 when he got in the driver's seat. Like, I didn't witness that part. And he - she's  
2008 like walking to the car. She's right here. And then, um, as soon as - like, by  
2009 the time I look up, um, the two - the two looked like they're right here.  
2010  
2011 Q: Mm-hm.  
2012  
2013 A: So, um, now, this is gonna to be number one. Um, so, um, obviously, 'cause I  
2014 - we were just speaking to the officer like, "Hello," you know. I mean, he's -  
2015 he is walking up, then he points to him and saying - like just points to him and  
2016 like, says, "Can we see your ID? And, um, and then he points to us and like  
2017 kind of walks a little bit more towards us.  
2018  
2019 Q: Mm-hm.  
2020  
2021 A: And he's like, "Can we see your ID - ID as well?" and - and he collects mine.  
2022  
2023 Q: Okay.  
2024  
2025 A: So I'm in the middle. I'm in the middle like right here.

2026  
2027 Q: Okay.  
2028  
2029 A: And then he, um - I gave him my ID. And I mean, in meanwhile, the other  
2030 sheriff was like somewhere in this area.  
2031  
2032 Q: So - okay, so that one is the other sheriff. Where was that other sheriff?  
2033  
2034 A: Um, he was somewhere over here. Yeah, somewhere over here.  
2035  
2036 Q: Okay. So let's put him somewhere over here.  
2037  
2038 A: Okay. And then after, um, hmm, (Hennessy) starts to run off the car.  
2039  
2040 Q: Okay.  
2041  
2042 A: And this officer is still talking to us. So ...  
2043  
2044 Q: Okay.  
2045  
2046 A: Um, I think this officer is like still barely walking up to (Hennessy) probably.  
2047  
2048 Q: Okay.  
2049  
2050 A: And so when he, um, moves forward first, like he was at the left ...  
2051  
2052 Q: Uh-huh.  
2053  
2054 A: ... and hits the car. And then like when that all that went on - while that's  
2055 happening, while he's moving up and bumped at the car, then he starts saying,  
2056 "What's going on?" And, um, that officer - I don't know how he, um, decided  
2057 - don't ask me. But that one ...  
2058  
2059 Q: Okay. So somehow he ends up over here?  
2060  
2061 A: Yeah.  
2062  
2063 Q: And when did that - what's your next memory?  
2064  
2065 A: Um, after, um - so he goes over here. Um, and during that time like, um,  
2066 (Hennessy) moved back and then he went this way so ...  
2067  
2068 Q: Mm-hm.  
2069  
2070 A: Um, this officer moved over here. Then ...

2071  
2072 Q: So when did - when - when - uh, did you hear those, uh, um, you know, tho-  
2073 those ...  
2074  
2075 A: They're pretty much like running.  
2076  
2077 Q: What - when he was saying stop, you said - you mentioned something - I  
2078 forgot what they said.  
2079  
2080 A: Yeah, he was like - he was saying, um, "Stop. Don't move," you know what  
2081 I'm saying? Like, or, um, "Or we will shoot," you know. And yeah, that's  
2082 pretty much it. You know, like "Get out of the vehicle," kind of stuff. Like the  
2083 typical, you know, protocol type police kind of thing.  
2084  
2085 Q: Okay.  
2086  
2087 A: To one who doesn't listen.  
2088  
2089 Q: Okay. But this is - this is what you heard. It's not - it's not the ty- it's not ...  
2090  
2091 A: No, no, no.  
2092  
2093 Q: ... typical, like what you hear on TV. But what you - what you heard ...  
2094  
2095 A: But I heard like the typical.  
2096  
2097 Q: Yeah.  
2098  
2099 A: Yeah.  
2100  
2101 Q: But - but you - what you heard ...  
2102  
2103 A: Yeah.  
2104  
2105 Q: ... was, "Stop."  
2106  
2107 A: Mm-hm.  
2108  
2109 Q: What else did you hear?  
2110  
2111 A: Yeah. And, um, "Get out of the vehicle," you know.  
2112  
2113 Q: Mm-hm.  
2114  
2115 A: "Or we will shoot," they gave him like, at least, like two warnings.

2116  
2117 Q: Okay.  
2118  
2119 A: And then, um, he proceeded. So, um, they're kind of going after him. And  
2120 when they're going to him, and then he took off. And while he took off, I  
2121 think this officer is still over here.  
2122  
2123 Q: Mm-hm.  
2124  
2125 A: Like, um, 'cause he was the one who shot. So like while that was happening,  
2126 he just wanted to make sure we didn't do anything, correct?  
2127  
2128 Q: Mm-hm.  
2129  
2130 A: So he walked to us. But I think after actually - like, let me fill something into,  
2131 um, like after I gave the officer my ID ...  
2132  
2133 Q: Mm-hm.  
2134  
2135 A: ... I believe like I walked - I didn't go back in the car.  
2136  
2137 Q: Okay.  
2138  
2139 A: Because I do remember at one point, he did say, um - he came over after that,  
2140 and then said - you know, he had the gun pointed at me and I was in the car  
2141 and he said to put my hands up, and I put my hands up. And then we got in the  
2142 car and then we were like (unintelligible).  
2143  
2144 Q: Okay. But when, um - so when he's driving this way, um, was - was this  
2145 officer, uh, already over here?  
2146  
2147 A: Yeah. I think like ...  
2148  
2149 Q: Or ...  
2150  
2151 A: It probably happened fast that he was chasing - he was chasing like the car,  
2152 you know, pretty much. Like, he ended up over here. I don't - like - like I said,  
2153 a little blurred in that part ...  
2154  
2155 Q: Okay.  
2156  
2157 A: Because I was talking to this officer.  
2158  
2159 Q: Okay.  
2160



2161 A: So like all I saw was like - just like the car start and ...  
2162  
2163 Q: Okay. So somehow - somehow he ends up from here, over here, and he drives.  
2164  
2165 A: Yeah.  
2166  
2167 Q: Um, okay.  
2168  
2169 A: And then, um, yeah, he shot. And then, um, he was pretty much like just going  
2170 after him.  
2171  
2172 Q: Mm-hm.  
2173  
2174 A: And then, um, this one was over here with a gun pointed at us and made us go  
2175 on the ground.  
2176  
2177 Q: Okay.  
2178  
2179 A: And then after that, it seems fine.  
2180  
2181 Q: Okay. Okay. That makes a little bit more sense to a visual person. Um,  
2182 anything else you think that you - that we didn't talk about at?  
2183  
2184 A: No, that's pretty much all.  
2185  
2186 Q: Okay. Um, and how long have you had your car for?  
2187  
2188 A: Uh, I had my car for, well, like a few months, I believe. Well, I was sharing it  
2189 with my dad and I bought it from my dad.  
2190  
2191 Q: Okay.  
2192  
2193 A: I really had bought it.  
2194  
2195 Q: Okay. But you said you were having issues with it?  
2196  
2197 A: Yeah.  
2198  
2199 Q: Okay.  
2200  
2201 A: And, um, like, we - or tires fell off like - like, you know, um, my dad buys and  
2202 sells cars. So like ...  
2203  
2204 Q: Okay.  
2205

2206 A: I've already had this car for a while.  
2207  
2208 Q: Okay.  
2209  
2210 A: Like, you know, he lets me use it, but - then I bought it off him, so I wouldn't  
2211 have to follow his rules.  
2212  
2213 Q: Oh, okay.  
2214  
2215 A: So, um, I bought it off of him and I barely got the car back, um, yesterday,  
2216 literally. Um, actually, I barely fixed it yesterday. I got it off the shop then we  
2217 go.  
2218  
2219 Q: Mm-hm.  
2220  
2221 A: And it broke down literally after. So it got issue, we got to fix it.  
2222  
2223 Q: So it hasn't been like a reliable car?  
2224  
2225 A: Well, it has. It just like has its little - you know, finally, at its peak, you know,  
2226 kinda like get everything.  
2227  
2228 Q: Okay. And you said - you said (Hennessy)'s car was also acting up?  
2229  
2230 A: Yeah, his car was pretty much acting up. Yeah.  
2231  
2232 Q: And how long has he had his car for?  
2233  
2234 A: I don't know. Um, I've only like seen him with - him with it like twice. So ...  
2235  
2236 Q: Oh, okay.  
2237  
2238 A: And I don't know if it's his, um, like his girlfriend's car or anything.  
2239  
2240 Q: Oh, okay.  
2241  
2242 A: So ...  
2243  
2244 Q: So when was the first time you saw him with that car?  
2245  
2246 A: Um, when he came to my house, um, the day before yesterday, I believe.  
2247  
2248 Q: Oh, this week?  
2249  
2250 A: Mm-hm.

2251  
2252 Q: Okay. Um, so he knows where you live. Okay. Do you know where he lives?  
2253  
2254 A: I don't think he, like, lives anywhere. I'm not sure. Um, that's why we've  
2255 been doing the housing thing to get on his feet. But he doesn't a place that he  
2256 stays on.  
2257  
2258 Q: Okay. So - okay. So you know a little bit more about his situation as far as  
2259 you trying to get him on - on his feet, trying to better himself and stuff like  
2260 that. Um, is there - is there another reason why he would try to, um, just take  
2261 off the way he did?  
2262  
2263 A: Well, I don't believe he, like, had a warrant or anything. I'm not sure. Like ...  
2264  
2265 Q: Mm-hm.  
2266  
2267 A: I don't really know, like, all that deeply in people's like - that side of their  
2268 lives, which probably I should - probably I should, um.  
2269  
2270 Q: Yeah.  
2271  
2272 A: I'm not sure. I just know that he's ...  
2273  
2274 Q: Has he mentioned anything?  
2275  
2276 A: He actually just recently got out of jail, I think, so I'm not sure.  
2277  
2278 Q: Oh, he did?  
2279  
2280 A: Yeah, but ...  
2281  
2282 Q: But what is he in jail for?  
2283  
2284 A: I'm not sure. Um, that's why I haven't seen him in a long time, too. But I'm  
2285 not sure what he's jail for. I just knew that he was in there. But I don't know  
2286 anything about that.  
2287  
2288 Q: You kind of should know, huh?  
2289  
2290 A: Hmm, yeah. 'Cause like - yeah.  
2291  
2292 Q: Because then something like this happens and you're ...  
2293  
2294 A: Yup.  
2295

2296 Q: I'm like tied up for the day so ...  
2297  
2298 A: Yeah. I'm just - I'm always like glad that I know I'm legit, you know what  
2299 I'm saying? That's all.  
2300  
2301 Q: Yeah.  
2302  
2303 A: Yeah. I don't worry about them.  
2304  
2305 Q: Yeah. But you said that your other two friends didn't have - Shae and - and  
2306 him didn't have a - an ID ...  
2307  
2308 A: Yeah.  
2309  
2310 Q: ... or something?  
2311  
2312 A: Yeah. So, like, that does fall on me because I'm a driver too.  
2313  
2314 Q: Mm-hm. It creates kind of a little bit of a problem, huh?  
2315  
2316 A: Yeah, I guess.  
2317  
2318 Q: Yeah. So are all your friends kind of like same way?  
2319  
2320 A: Mm-hm. And then they're just all mutual friends of my dad and my brother.  
2321 So like, um, this is probably why my dad tells me not to hang out with his  
2322 friends.  
2323  
2324 Q: Because he knows them.  
2325  
2326 A: Yeah. And he knows like, you know, their live and my life totally.  
2327  
2328 Q: Mm-hm. Mm-hm.  
2329  
2330 A: So, yeah.  
2331  
2332 Q: So he doesn't approve them?  
2333  
2334 A: I know he does. Like, he just - he just wants me to like do other things. He  
2335 wants me to hang out with other people like that go to school and like ...  
2336  
2337 Q: Yeah.  
2338  
2339 A: You know, other stuff like that. But I just hang out with friends I have  
2340 connection with ...

2341  
2342 Q: Okay.  
2343  
2344 A: ... certainly. That I know they want to be better.  
2345  
2346 Q: Okay. Mm-hm. All right. Well, um, let me go outside real quick, um, and find  
2347 out if, uh, it's completely done here. Do you want some more water or - I  
2348 brought you some water. I don't know if you want it or not. Bathroom break  
2349 or anything?  
2350  
2351 A: Um.  
2352  
2353 Q: No?  
2354  
2355 A: Um, if, um - as far as like how - like what happens after this, like session?  
2356  
2357 Q: Oh, I'll find out right now.  
2358  
2359 A: Okay.  
2360  
2361 Q: Yeah. I'll go and find out.  
2362  
2363 A: Okay. Thank you.  
2364  
2365 Q: Okay.  
2366  
2367 Woman: I had a question for you.  
2368  
2369 A: Mm-hm.  
2370  
2371 Q: You, um ...  
2372  
2373 A: Yeah, I - yeah, it was like - so like, um, it shouldn't have happened like - all  
2374 this happened.  
2375  
2376 Q: Yeah, I think any of us would be - and just like she came back. This was great  
2377 because of - we were just trying - we got to make sure we - we were on the  
2378 same page as you. When you explained it to us, I want to make sure that I  
2379 understand it the way that you're explaining it, so that worked out perfectly  
2380  
2381 A: Yeah. And you guys want to make sure that I say to you like same thing. Like,  
2382 I don't change it up and all that stuff, too.  
2383  
2384 Q: Yeah. We just want to know what you saw because that really helps us out. So  
2385 thank you for that.

2386  
2387 A: Yeah.  
2388  
2389 Q: Um, but my - my question is - so I know you said, you know, you kind of  
2390 covered your ears and, um, closed your eyes, and it all went down. And then  
2391 when you reopened your eyes, what's the first thing that you saw?  
2392  
2393 A: Fuck, well, I don't like - um, the first thing I saw when I opened my eyes like  
2394 was - like - that like (Hennessy), like, still - like taking off and like them  
2395 pointing their guns at - pointing their guns at him, and then like - but they're  
2396 like so close - close within range like, you know, to shoot him, you know what  
2397 I'm saying? Like, it was like almost just too close for me, you know what I'm  
2398 saying, like for them to be shooting at him because I was, like, sure they were  
2399 gonna like get him or something. You know what I mean? Like, they're  
2400 gonna, you know - or you know, something. So that's like one thing I saw.  
2401 And, um - and I think that's when I plugged my ears when I saw that. I  
2402 plugged my ears after I saw, um, him driving off and like - just like their gun,  
2403 like right there, it was just - it was too close. And then - then I closed my eyes.  
2404 And then when I opened them, I saw the other officer that was like pointing -  
2405 he was walking to us with his gun out and pointing at us. And I - it didn't  
2406 really click with me yet that he was pointing it out at - at us. You know what  
2407 I'm saying? Because I was like, "We're not doing anything," you know. But,  
2408 um ...  
2409  
2410 Q: Yeah.  
2411  
2412 A: Yeah. And then I - I had to get out of the car and, um, go on the ground. So,  
2413 yeah.  
2414  
2415 Q: What did you and say to each other?  
2416  
2417 A: We don't say anything to each other at all while that was happening. And we  
2418 were just like - we just - we didn't speak to each other. Like, we spoke to the  
2419 officers, because then we saw them walking up, so like we just said, "Hello,"  
2420 you know. That was it.  
2421  
2422 Q: At any point in time, did you and Shae have a chance to talk to each other?  
2423  
2424 A: I haven't talked to her at all since like the whole thing started happening.  
2425  
2426 Q: Did you get a chance to - to look at her?  
2427  
2428 A: Um, yeah, I did look at her when, um, I saw the sheriff's, um, in front of -  
2429 when I saw them like right there and I barely noticed that they were there.  
2430 Um, I did look at her. Like, we - we looked at each other. Like, I wasn't

2431 trippin. I was like, "Oh," you know what I'm saying? Like, "It's cool," you  
2432 know. And she's like, "Well, I don't have an ID," and I think she was trippin'  
2433 on that, you know.
